2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 986 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The Illinois Promotion Act is amended by changing Section 8b as follows:

7	Sec. 8b. Municipal convention center and sports facility
8	attraction grants.
9	(a) Until July 1, 2022, the Department is authorized to
10	make grants, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly,
11	from the Tourism Promotion Fund to a unit of local government,
12	municipal convention center, or convention center authority
13	that provides incentives, as defined in subsection (i) of
14	Section 3 of this Act, for the purpose of attracting
15	conventions, meetings, and trade shows to municipal convention
16	centers and attracting sporting events to municipal amateur

1 sports facilities. If there is no municipal convention center located within a unit of local government, then the Department 2 may make grants, subject to appropriation by the General 3 4 Assembly, from the Tourism Promotion Fund to that unit of local 5 government for the purpose of attracting conventions, 6 meetings, and trade shows to private convention centers located in the unit of local government. Grants awarded under this 7 Section shall be based on the net proceeds received under the 8 Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax Act for the renting, leasing, 9 10 or letting of hotel rooms in the municipality for the month in 11 which the convention, meeting, trade show, or sporting event occurs. Grants shall not exceed 80% of the incentive amount 12 provided by the unit of local government, municipal convention 13 14 center, or convention center authority. Further, in no event 15 may the aggregate amount of grants awarded to a single 16 municipal convention center, convention center authority, or municipal amateur sports facility exceed \$200,000 in any 17 calendar year. The Department may, by rule, require any other 18 provisions it deems necessary in order to protect the State's 19 interest in administering this program. 20

(b) No later than May 15 of each year, through May 15, 2022, the unit of local government, municipal convention center, or convention center authority shall certify to the Department the amounts of funds expended in the previous fiscal year to provide qualified incentives; however, in no event may the certified amount pursuant to this paragraph exceed \$200,000 10100SB0986sam001 -3- LRB101 06649 HLH 57834 a

1 any municipal convention center, convention center for 2 authority, or municipal amateur sports facility in any calendar year. The unit of local government, convention center, or 3 convention center authority shall certify (A) the net proceeds 4 5 received under the Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax Act for the 6 renting, leasing, or letting of hotel rooms in the municipality for the month in which the convention, meeting, or trade show 7 8 occurs and (B) the average of the net proceeds received under 9 the Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax Act for the renting, 10 leasing, or letting of hotel rooms in the municipality for the 11 same month in the 3 immediately preceding years. The unit of local government, municipal convention center, or convention 12 13 center authority shall include the incentive amounts as part of 14 its regular audit.

(b-5) Grants awarded to a unit of local government, municipal convention center, or convention center authority may be made by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity from appropriations for those purposes for any fiscal year, without regard to the fact that the qualification or obligation may have occurred in a prior fiscal year.

(c) The Department shall submit a report, which must be provided electronically, on the effectiveness of the program established under this Section to the General Assembly no later than January 1, 2022.
