### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21B-70

Amends the School Code. Provides that priority in the distribution of funds appropriated for the Illinois Teaching Excellence Program must be given to a qualified educator employed by an Organizational Unit assigned to Tier 1 under the evidence-based funding formula of the Code.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-70 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-70)

7 Sec. 21B-70. Illinois Teaching Excellence Program.

8 (a) As used in this Section:

9 "Poverty or low-performing school" means a school 10 identified as a priority school under Section 2-3.25d-5 of this 11 Code or a school in which 50% or more of its students are 12 eligible for free or reduced-price school lunches.

"Qualified educator" means a teacher or school counselor 13 14 currently employed in a school district who is in the process of obtaining certification through the National Board for 15 16 Professional Teaching Standards or who has completed certification and holds a current Professional Educator 17 License with a National Board for Professional Teaching 18 19 Standards designation or a retired teacher or school counselor who holds a Professional Educator License with a National Board 20 21 for Professional Teaching Standards designation.

(b) Beginning on July 1, 2011, any funds appropriated forthe Illinois Teaching Excellence Program must be used to

provide monetary assistance and incentives for qualified 1 2 educators who are employed by school districts and who have or 3 are in the process of obtaining licensure through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards. Priority in the 4 5 distribution of those funds must be given to a qualified educator employed by an Organizational Unit assigned to Tier 1 6 7 under Section 18-8.15. The goal of the program is to improve 8 instruction and student performance.

9 The State Board of Education shall allocate an amount as 10 annually appropriated by the General Assembly for the Illinois 11 Teaching Excellence Program for (i) application fees for each 12 qualified educator seeking to complete certification through 13 the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, to be paid directly to the National Board for Professional Teaching 14 15 Standards, and (ii) incentives for each gualified educator to 16 be distributed to the respective school district. The school 17 district shall distribute this payment to each eligible teacher or school counselor as a single payment. 18

The State Board of Education's annual budget must set out by separate line item the appropriation for the program. Unless otherwise provided by appropriation, qualified educators are eligible for monetary assistance and incentives outlined in subsection (c) of this Section.

(c) When there are adequate funds available, monetaryassistance and incentives shall include the following:

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(1) A maximum of \$2,000 towards the application fee for

up to 750 teachers or school counselors in a poverty or low-performing school who apply on a first-come, first-serve basis for National Board certification.

(2) A maximum of \$2,000 towards the application fee for 4 up to 250 teachers or school counselors in a school other 5 than a poverty or low-performing school who apply on a 6 basis 7 first-come, first-serve for National Board 8 certification. However, if there were fewer than 750 9 individuals supported in item (1) of this subsection (c), 10 then the number supported in this item (2) may be increased 11 as such that the combination of item (1) of this subsection 12 (c) and this item (2) shall equal 1,000 applicants.

(3) A maximum of \$1,000 towards the National Board for
 Professional Teaching Standards' renewal application fee.

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(4) (Blank).

16 (5) An annual incentive equal to \$1,500, which shall be 17 paid to each qualified educator currently employed in a school district who holds both a National Board for 18 19 Professional Teaching Standards designation and a current 20 corresponding certificate issued by the National Board for 21 Professional Teaching Standards and who agrees, in 22 writing, to provide at least 30 hours of mentoring or 23 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards 24 professional development or both during the school year to 25 classroom teachers or school counselors, as applicable. 26 Funds must be disbursed on a first-come, first-serve basis,

with priority given to poverty or low-performing schools.
 Mentoring shall include, either singly or in combination,
 the following:

4 (A) National Board for Professional Teaching
5 Standards certification candidates.

6 (B) National Board for Professional Teaching 7 Standards re-take candidates.

8 (C) National Board for Professional Teaching
9 Standards renewal candidates.

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(D) (Blank).

Funds may also be used for instructional leadership training for qualified educators interested in supporting implementation of the Illinois Learning Standards or teaching and learning priorities of the State Board of Education or both.
