## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding
  Section 5.891 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 5.891. The Law Enforcement Training Assistance Fund.</u>
- 8 Section 10. The Illinois Police Training Act is amended by 9 adding Section 10.23 as follows:
- 10 (50 ILCS 705/10.23 new)

11	Sec. 10.23. Law Enforcement Training Assistance Fund. The		
12	Law Enforcement Training Assistance Fund is created as a		
13	nonappropriated State trust fund within the State treasury. All		
14	gifts, donations, and charitable contributions that are		
15	contributed by any public or private individual or entity to		
16	the Board for the purpose of supporting local law enforcement		
17	training shall be deposited into this Fund. All money in the		
18	Fund shall not be subject to appropriation and shall be used by		
19	the Board for the purpose of supporting local law enforcement		
20	training. Investment income that is attributable to the		
21	investment of moneys in the Law Enforcement Training Assistance		

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Fund shall be retained in the Fund for the uses specified in this Section. The Fund is not subject to sweeps, administrative charge-backs, or any other fiscal or budgetary maneuver that would in any way transfer any amounts from the Fund into any other fund of the State.

6 Section 15. The Law Enforcement Intern Training Act is 7 amended by changing Sections 5, 10, 15, 20, and 25 and by 8 adding Sections 22 and 23 as follows:

9 (50 ILCS 708/5)

10 Sec. 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

11 "Academy" means a school certified by the Illinois Law 12 Enforcement Training Standards Board to provide basic training 13 under Section 6 of the Illinois Police Training Act.

14 "Board" means the Illinois Law Enforcement Training15 Standards Board created by the Illinois Police Training Act.

16 <u>"Correctional Intern" means a civilian who has met the</u> 17 requirements to enter the Correctional Intern Training Program 18 and who is not employed as a correctional officer under the 19 Illinois Police Training Act.

## 20 <u>"Graduate Correctional Intern" means a civilian who has</u> 21 <u>successfully completed the correctional intern training course</u> 22 <u>and is not employed as a correctional officer under the</u> 23 <u>Illinois Police Training Act.</u>

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"Law Enforcement Intern" means a civilian who has met the

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requirements to enter the Law Enforcement Intern Training
 Program and who is not employed as a law enforcement officer
 under the Illinois Police Training Act.

Graduate Law Enforcement Intern" means a civilian who has
successfully completed the law enforcement intern training
course and is not employed as a law enforcement officer under
the Illinois Police Training Act.

8 "Trainee" means a law enforcement intern who is enrolled in9 the Law Enforcement Intern Training Program.

Sec. 10. Initiation, administration, and conduct of program by Board. The Board may initiate, administer, and conduct the Law Enforcement Intern Training Program <u>and the</u> <u>Correctional Officer Intern Program</u>. The training for <del>law</del> <del>enforcement</del> interns shall be provided at any certified academy selected by the Board. The Board shall have the authority to establish enrollment limitations.

21 Sec. 15. Election to participate in the <u>Law Enforcement</u> 22 <u>Intern Training Program</u> <del>program</del>. Any person may elect to apply 23 to participate in the Law Enforcement Intern Training Program. 24 To be eligible to participate, the person must meet the minimum SB2148 Engrossed - 4 - LRB101 11213 SLF 56470 b

criteria established by the Board that includes, but is not 1 2 limited to, physical fitness standards, educational standards, 3 psychological standards, 21 years of age, of good character, and not convicted of a felony offense or other crime involving 4 5 moral turpitude under the laws of this State or any other State that, if convicted in this State, would be punishable as a 6 felony or a crime of moral turpitude. Applicants shall be 7 8 accepted for the program on a person by person basis and shall 9 not take the place of or prevent a law enforcement officer from 10 entering an academy class to meet the basic training 11 requirements set forth in the Illinois Police Training Act. When reviewing applications, special consideration shall be 12 13 given to persons who have been members of the Armed Forces of 14 the United States in accordance with the Veterans Preference 15 Act. The Board's investigators shall enforce the provisions of 16 this Act to ensure compliance with the Act, including, but not 17 limited to, administrating a criminal justice background check that includes State and federal criminal histories, conducting 18 19 interviews, obtaining, by subpoena if necessary, investigative records, police records, personnel records, or other records 20 21 that may be needed.

Nothing in this Act shall override or replace, preempt, or supersede, any hiring or selection standard, process, procedure, requirement, or mechanism established by any local governmental unit, or State statute or regulation that is in effect or amended hereafter. 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3 Sec. 20. Law enforcement certification Certification; 4 transition course. The Board shall require law enforcement 5 interns to undertake, at a minimum, the same training 6 requirements as established for law enforcement officers under 7 the Illinois Police Training Act. The Board certificate reserved for law enforcement officers shall not be awarded 8 9 until the law enforcement intern is employed, has successfully 10 completed the State certification exam, and meets the 11 requirements established by the Board. The Law Enforcement 12 Intern Certificate shall be issued to the trainee following the 13 successful completion of the course. The graduate law 14 enforcement intern, if not employed as a law enforcement 15 officer within 2 years after issuance of the law enforcement 16 intern certificate, must then meet the requirements of the Illinois Police Training Act upon employment. A graduate law 17 18 enforcement intern who is not employed within one year, but is hired within 2 years after completing the course, must 19 successfully complete a transition course approved by the 20 21 Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board and again 22 successfully complete the law enforcement State certification exam in order to obtain the Board's certificate reserved for 23 24 law enforcement officers. The transition course shall consist of a minimum of 80 hours and shall be conducted at a Board 25

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1 certified academy.

4 Sec. 22. Election to participate in the Correctional 5 Officer Intern Program. Any person may elect to apply to 6 participate in the Correctional Officer Intern Training 7 Program. To be eligible to participate, the person must meet 8 the minimum criteria established by the Board that includes, 9 but is not limited to, physical fitness standards, educational 10 standards, psychological standards, being at least 21 years of 11 age, of good character, and not convicted of a felony offense or other crime involving moral turpitude under the laws of this 12 13 State or any other State that, if convicted in this State, would be punishable as a felony or a crime of moral turpitude. 14 15 Applicants shall be accepted for the program on a person by 16 person basis and shall not take the place of or prevent a correctional officer from entering an academy class to meet the 17 18 basic training requirements set forth in the Illinois Police Training Act. When reviewing applications, special 19 consideration shall be given to persons who have been members 20 21 of the Armed Forces of the United States in accordance with the 22 Veterans Preference Act. The Board's investigators shall 23 enforce this Act to ensure compliance with the Act, including, 24 but not limited to, administrating a criminal justice background check that includes State and federal criminal 25

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histories, conducting interviews, obtaining, by subpoena if necessary, investigative records, police records, personnel records, or other records that may be needed. Nothing in this Act shall override or replace, preempt, or supersede any hiring or selection standard, process, procedure, requirement, or mechanism established by any local governmental unit, or State statute or regulation.

8 (50 ILCS 708/23 new)

Sec. 23. Correctional certification. The Board shall 9 10 require correctional interns to undertake, at a minimum, the 11 same training requirements as established for correctional 12 officers under the Illinois Police Training Act. The Board 13 certificate reserved for correctional officers shall not be awarded until the correctional intern is employed, has 14 15 successfully completed the State certification exam, and meets 16 the requirements established by the Board. The correctional intern certificate shall be issued to the trainee following the 17 18 successful completion of the course. The graduate correctional intern, if not employed as a correctional officer within 2 19 20 years after issuance of the correctional intern certificate, 21 must then meet the requirements of the Illinois Police Training 22 Act upon employment.

23 (50 ILCS 708/25)

24 Sec. 25. Police Training Board Services Fund. The Board

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1 shall charge, collect, or receive fees, tuition, or moneys from 2 persons electing to enter the Law Enforcement Intern Training 3 Program <u>or the Correctional Officer Intern Program</u> equivalent 4 to the costs of providing personnel, equipment, services, and 5 training to law enforcement interns that, in the judgement of 6 the Board, are in the best interest of the State.

All fees or moneys received by the Board under this Act shall be deposited in a special fund in the State Treasury to be known as the Police Training Board Services Fund. The moneys deposited in the Police Training Board Services Fund shall be appropriated to the Board for expenses of the Board for the administration and conduct of training.
