SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 705/15-15

Amends the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act. Provides that, notwithstanding any restrictions on relocation otherwise set forth in the Act, an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License holder shall be permitted, upon application to the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation, to relocate within the same medical district as its existing location under specified circumstances. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act is amended
by changing Section 15-15 as follows:

6 (410 ILCS 705/15-15)

Sec. 15-15. Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing
Organization License.

9 (a) Any medical cannabis dispensing organization holding a valid registration under the Compassionate Use of Medical 10 Cannabis Program Act as of the effective date of this Act may, 11 within 60 days of the effective date of this Act, apply to the 12 13 Department for an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 14 Organization License to serve purchasers at any medical cannabis dispensing location in operation on the effective date 15 16 of this Act, pursuant to this Section.

17 (b) A medical cannabis dispensing organization seeking issuance of an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization 18 19 License to serve purchasers at any medical cannabis dispensing location in operation as of the effective date of this Act 20 21 submit an application on forms provided by the shall 22 Department. The application must be submitted by the same person or entity that holds the medical cannabis dispensing 23

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organization registration and include the following:

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 Payment of a nonrefundable fee of \$30,000 to be deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund;

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(2) Proof of registration as a medical cannabisdispensing organization that is in good standing;

6 (3) Certification that the applicant will comply with 7 the requirements contained in the Compassionate Use of 8 Medical Cannabis Program Act except as provided in this 9 Act;

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(4) The legal name of the dispensing organization;

11 (5) The physical address of the dispensing12 organization;

13 (6) The name, address, social security number, and date 14 of birth of each principal officer and board member of the 15 dispensing organization, each of whom must be at least 21 16 years of age;

(7) A nonrefundable Cannabis Business Development Fee
equal to 3% of the dispensing organization's total sales
between June 1, 2018 to June 1, 2019, or \$100,000,
whichever is less, to be deposited into the Cannabis
Business Development Fund; and

(8) Identification of one of the following Social
Equity Inclusion Plans to be completed by March 31, 2021:

(A) Make a contribution of 3% of total sales from
June 1, 2018 to June 1, 2019, or \$100,000, whichever is
less, to the Cannabis Business Development Fund. This

is in addition to the fee required by item (7) of this
subsection (b);

(B) Make a grant of 3% of total sales from June 1,
2018 to June 1, 2019, or \$100,000, whichever is less,
to a cannabis industry training or education program at
an Illinois community college as defined in the Public
Community College Act;

8 (C) Make a donation of \$100,000 or more to a 9 program that provides job training services to persons 10 recently incarcerated or that operates in a 11 Disproportionately Impacted Area;

12 (D) Participate as a host in a cannabis business 13 establishment incubator program approved by the 14 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, and 15 in which an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 16 Organization License holder agrees to provide a loan of 17 at least \$100,000 and mentorship to incubate, for at least a year, a Social Equity Applicant intending to 18 seek a license or a licensee that qualifies as a Social 19 20 Equity Applicant. As used in this Section, "incubate" financial assistance and 21 means providing direct 22 training necessary to engage in licensed cannabis 23 industry activity similar to that of the host licensee. 24 The Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization 25 License holder or the same entity holding any other 26 licenses issued pursuant to this Act shall not take an

ownership stake of greater than 10% in any business 1 2 receiving incubation services to comply with this subsection. If an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 3 Organization License holder fails to find a business to 4 5 incubate to comply with this subsection before its Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization 6 7 License expires, it may opt to meet the requirement of 8 this subsection by completing another item from this 9 subsection; or

10 (E) Participate in a sponsorship program for at 11 least 2 years approved by the Department of Commerce 12 and Economic Opportunity in which an Early Approval 13 Adult Use Dispensing Organization License holder agrees to provide an interest-free loan of at least 14 15 \$200,000 to a Social Equity Applicant. The sponsor 16 shall not take an ownership stake in any cannabis 17 business establishment receiving sponsorship services to comply with this subsection. 18

19 <u>(b-5) Notwithstanding any restrictions on relocation</u> 20 <u>otherwise set forth in this Act, an Early Approval Adult Use</u> 21 <u>Dispensing Organization License holder shall be permitted,</u> 22 <u>upon application to the Department, to relocate within the same</u> 23 <u>medical district as its existing location if:</u>

24 <u>(1) it is located within the boundaries of a unit of</u>
25 <u>local government that prohibited the sale of adult use</u>
26 <u>cannabis; or</u>

(2) it has obtained the approval of the unit of local
 government where it is located to move to another location
 within that unit of local government.

4 (c) The license fee required by paragraph (1) of subsection 5 (b) of this Section shall be in addition to any license fee 6 required for the renewal of a registered medical cannabis 7 dispensing organization license.

8 (d) Applicants must submit all required information, 9 including the requirements in subsection (b) of this Section, 10 to the Department. Failure by an applicant to submit all 11 required information may result in the application being 12 disqualified.

(e) If the Department receives an application that fails to provide the required elements contained in subsection (b), the Department shall issue a deficiency notice to the applicant. The applicant shall have 10 calendar days from the date of the deficiency notice to submit complete information. Applications that are still incomplete after this opportunity to cure may be disqualified.

20 (f) If an applicant meets all the requirements of 21 subsection (b) of this Section, the Department shall issue the 22 Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License 23 within 14 days of receiving a completed application unless:

(1) The licensee or a principal officer is delinquent
in filing any required tax returns or paying any amounts
owed to the State of Illinois;

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1 (2) The Secretary of Financial and Professional 2 Regulation determines there is reason, based on documented 3 compliance violations, the licensee is not entitled to an 4 Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License; 5 or

6 (3) Any principal officer fails to register and remain 7 in compliance with this Act or the Compassionate Use of 8 Medical Cannabis Program Act.

9 (g) A registered medical cannabis dispensing organization 10 that obtains an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 11 Organization License may begin selling cannabis, 12 cannabis-infused products, paraphernalia, and related items to 13 purchasers under the rules of this Act no sooner than January 14 1, 2020.

15 (h) A dispensing organization holding a medical cannabis 16 dispensing organization license issued under the Compassionate 17 Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act must maintain an adequate supply of cannabis and cannabis-infused products for purchase 18 by qualifying patients, caregivers, provisional patients, and 19 20 Opioid Alternative Pilot Program participants. For the purposes of this subsection, "adequate supply" means a monthly 21 22 inventory level that is comparable in type and quantity to 23 those medical cannabis products provided to patients and careqivers on an average monthly basis for the 6 months before 24 25 the effective date of this Act.

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(i) If there is a shortage of cannabis or cannabis-infused

products, a dispensing organization holding both a dispensing organization license under the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act and this Act shall prioritize serving qualifying patients, caregivers, provisional patients, and Opioid Alternative Pilot Program participants before serving purchasers.

(j) Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, a 7 person that holds a medical cannabis dispensing organization 8 9 license issued under the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis 10 Program Act and an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 11 Organization License may permit purchasers into a limited 12 access area as that term is defined in administrative rules 13 made under the authority in the Compassionate Use of Medical 14 Cannabis Program Act.

15 (k) An Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization 16 License is valid until March 31, 2021. A dispensing 17 organization that obtains an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License shall receive written or 18 19 electronic notice 90 days before the expiration of the license 20 that the license will expire, and that informs the license holder that it may apply to renew its Early Approval Adult Use 21 22 Dispensing Organization License on forms provided by the 23 Department. The Department shall renew the Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License within 60 days of the 24 25 renewal application being deemed complete if:

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(1) the dispensing organization submits an application

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and the required nonrefundable renewal fee of \$30,000, to be deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund;

3 (2) the Department has not suspended or permanently the Earlv Approval Adult Use 4 revoked Dispensing 5 Organization License or a medical cannabis dispensing organization license on the same premises for violations of 6 7 this Act, the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program 8 Act, or rules adopted pursuant to those Acts;

9 (3) the dispensing organization has completed a Social 10 Equity Inclusion Plan as provided by parts (A), (B), and 11 (C) of paragraph (8) of subsection (b) of this Section or 12 has made substantial progress toward completing a Social 13 Equity Inclusion Plan as provided by parts (D) and (E) of 14 paragraph (8) of subsection (b) of this Section; and

15 (4) the dispensing organization is in compliance with16 this Act and rules.

17 (1) The Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License renewed pursuant to subsection (k) of this Section 18 19 shall expire March 31, 2022. The Early Approval Adult Use 20 Dispensing Organization Licensee shall receive written or electronic notice 90 days before the expiration of the license 21 22 that the license will expire, and that informs the license 23 holder that it may apply for an Adult Use Dispensing 24 Organization License on forms provided by the Department. The 25 Department shall grant an Adult Use Dispensing Organization 26 License within 60 days of an application being deemed complete

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if the applicant has met all of the criteria in Section 15-36.

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If a dispensing organization fails to submit an (m) application for renewal of an Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing Organization License or for an Adult Use Dispensing 5 Organization License before the expiration dates provided in 6 and (1) of this Section, the dispensing subsections (k) 7 organization shall cease serving purchasers and cease all 8 operations until it receives a renewal or an Adult Use 9 Dispensing Organization License, as the case may be.

10 (n) A dispensing organization agent who holds a valid 11 dispensing organization agent identification card issued under 12 the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act and is an 13 officer, director, manager, or employee of the dispensing organization licensed under this Section may engage in all 14 15 activities authorized by this Article to be performed by a 16 dispensing organization agent.

17 (o) If the Department suspends, permanently revokes, or otherwise disciplines the Early Approval Adult Use Dispensing 18 Organization License of a dispensing organization that also 19 20 holds a medical cannabis dispensing organization license issued under the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program 21 22 Act, the Department may consider the suspension, permanent 23 revocation, or other discipline of the medical cannabis dispensing organization license. 24

25 (p) All fees collected pursuant to this Section shall be 26 deposited into the Cannabis Regulation Fund, unless otherwise SB3492 - 10 - LRB101 20641 CPF 70292 b
