## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

735 ILCS 115/10

Amends the Removal of Private Compromising Images Act. Provides that a person posts a private compromising image when he or she disseminates a private compromising image that was taken with the consent of the person depicted in the image, but the person in the image did not consent to the dissemination of the image.

- Sec. 10. Posting of private compromising images. A person shall not post a private compromising image of another person online. A person posts a private compromising image when he or she:
- 11 (1) intentionally disseminates an image of another
  12 person:
  - (A) who is at least 18 years of age;
- 14 (B) who is identifiable from the image itself or
  15 information displayed in connection with the image;
  16 and
- 17 (C) whose intimate parts are exposed, in whole or 18 in part;
  - (2) obtains the image under circumstances in which a reasonable person would know or understand that the image was taken without the person's knowledge or consent; and
  - (3) knows or should have known that the person in the image has not consented to the dissemination; or

1	(4) owns or operates a website on which the posting of								
2	private compromising images is allowed or not removed upon								
3	discovery of such images being posted; or -								
4	(5) disseminates a private compromising image that was								
5	taken with the consent of the person depicted in the image,								
6	but the person in the image did not consent to the								
7	dissemination of the image.
