WHEREAS, John Schultz was born to Fred and Kathryn Schultz on June 19, 1925; he graduated from Waukegan High School and attended Illinois State Normal University; and

WHEREAS, John Schultz was employed by the National Office Supply Company of Waukegan (NOSCO) as a pressman; he was inducted into the U.S. Army Air Corps on September 10, 1943 and became a B-25 pilot; he was discharged on November 24, 1945 and continued his military flying career in the Illinois Air National Guard; he returned to NOSCO and became a foreman; he retired as plant supervisor; and

WHEREAS, John Schultz was a member of the American Legion, Sharvin Post #397 in North Chicago, where he was elected to several officer positions, including post commander; he served as adjutant of the post for many years and as state advisor to the Department of Illinois Sons of the American Legion; he was a past 10th district commander of the American Legion and was the drum major of the nationally known Sharvin Post Red Jackets Drum and Bugle Corps; he was also a member of the Moose; he
