1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1568

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 1568 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Department of Revenue Law of the Civil
5 Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding Section
6 2505-306 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 2505/2505-306 new)

8 Sec. 2505-306. Retiring investigators; purchase of service
9 firearm and badge. The Director shall establish a program to
10 allow a Department investigator who is honorably retiring in
11 good standing to purchase either one or both of the following:
12 (1) any badge previously issued to the investigator by the
13 Department; or (2) if the investigator has a currently valid
14 Firearm Owner's Identification Card, the service firearm
15 issued or previously issued to the investigator by the
16 Department. The cost of the firearm shall be the replacement

1 value of the firearm and not the firearm's fair market value.

2 Section 10. The Law Enforcement Intern Training Act is
3 amended by adding Section 24 as follows:

4 (50 ILCS 708/24 new)

5 Sec. 24. Transfer credits from public institutions of
6 higher education.

7 (a) As used in this Section, "public institutions of
8 higher education" has the meaning ascribed to that term in the
9 Board of Higher Education Act.

10 (b) The Board shall collaborate with the Illinois
11 Community College Board and the Board of Higher Education to
12 create a report with recommendations to the General Assembly
13 for establishing minimum requirements for credits that may
14 transfer from public institutions of higher education to
15 satisfy the requirements of law enforcement and correctional
16 intern courses under this Act.

17 (c) The report shall be submitted to the General Assembly
18 no later than July 1, 2023.

19 Section 15. The Counties Code is amended by adding Section
20 3-6042 as follows:

21 (55 ILCS 5/3-6042 new)

22 Sec. 3-6042. Retiring employee; purchase of service

1 firearm and badge. Each Sheriff shall establish a program to
2 allow an employee of the Sheriff's Department who is honorably
3 retiring in good standing to purchase either one or both of the
4 following: (1) any badge previously issued to the employee by
5 the Sheriff's Department; or (2) if the employee has a
6 currently valid Firearm Owner's Identification Card, the
7 service firearm issued or previously issued to the employee by
8 the Sheriff's Department. The badge must be permanently and
9 conspicuously marked in such a manner that the individual who
10 possesses the badge is not mistaken for an actively serving
11 law enforcement officer. The cost of the firearm shall be the
12 replacement value of the firearm and not the firearm's fair
13 market value.

14 Section 20. The Illinois Gambling Act is amended by adding
15 Section 5.4 as follows:

16 (230 ILCS 10/5.4 new)

17 Sec. 5.4. Retiring investigators; purchase of service
18 firearm and badge. The Board shall establish a program to
19 allow an investigator appointed under paragraph (20.6) of
20 subsection (c) of Section 4 who is honorably retiring in good
21 standing to purchase either one or both of the following: (1)
22 any badge previously issued to the investigator by the Board;
23 or (2) if the investigator has a currently valid Firearm
24 Owner's Identification Card, the service firearm issued or

1 previously issued to the investigator by the Board. The badge
2 must be permanently and conspicuously marked in such a manner
3 that the individual who possesses the badge is not mistaken
4 for an actively serving law enforcement officer. The cost of
5 the firearm shall be the replacement value of the firearm and
6 not the firearm's fair market value.

7 Section 25. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
8 adding Section 3-2-10.5 as follows:

9 (730 ILCS 5/3-2-10.5 new)

10 Sec. 3-2-10.5. Retiring security employees and parole
11 agents; purchase of service firearm and badge. The Director
12 shall establish a program to allow a security employee or
13 parole agent of the Department who is honorably retiring in
14 good standing to purchase either one or both of the following:
15 (1) any badge previously issued to the security employee or
16 parole agent by the Department; or (2) if the security
17 employee or parole agent has a currently valid Firearm Owner's
18 Identification Card, the service firearm issued or previously
19 issued to the security employee or parole agent by the
20 Department. The badge must be permanently and conspicuously
21 marked in such a manner that the individual who possesses the
22 badge is not mistaken for an actively serving law enforcement
23 officer. The cost of the firearm shall be the replacement
24 value of the firearm and not the firearm's fair market value.

1 Section 30. The Probation and Probation Officers Act is
2 amended by adding Section 15.2 as follows:

3 (730 ILCS 110/15.2 new)

4 Sec. 15.2. Retiring probation officer; purchase of service
5 firearm and badge. Each department shall establish a program
6 to allow a probation officer of the department who is
7 honorably retiring in good standing to purchase either one or
8 both of the following: (1) any badge previously issued to the
9 probation officer by the department; or (2) if the probation
10 officer has a currently valid Firearm Owner's Identification
11 Card, the service firearm issued or previously issued to the
12 probation officer by the department. The badge must be
13 permanently and conspicuously marked in such a manner that the
14 individual who possesses the badge is not mistaken for an
15 actively serving law enforcement officer. The cost of the
16 firearm shall be the replacement value of the firearm and not
17 the firearm's fair market value.

18 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
19 becoming law, except that Section 10 takes effect January 1,
20 2023."
