SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 200/18-15

Amends the Property Tax Code. Provides that taxing districts, other than certain school districts, shall annually certify their levy on or before the third (currently, last) Tuesday in December. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing
5 Section 18-15 as follows:

6 (35 ILCS 200/18-15)

7 Sec. 18-15. Filing of levies of taxing districts.

8 (a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, all
9 taxing districts, other than a school district subject to the
10 authority of a Financial Oversight Panel pursuant to Article
11 1H of the School Code, shall annually certify to the county
12 clerk, on or before the third ~~last~~ Tuesday in December, the
13 several amounts that they have levied.

14 (b) A school district subject to the authority of a
15 Financial Oversight Panel pursuant to Article 1H of the School
16 Code shall file a certificate of tax levy, necessary to effect
17 the implementation of the approved financial plan and the
18 approval of the Panel, as otherwise provided by this Section,
19 except that the certificate must be certified to the county
20 clerk on or before the first Tuesday in November.

21 (c) If a school district as specified in subsection (b) of
22 this Section fails to certify and return the certificate of
23 tax levy, necessary to effect the implementation of the

1 approved financial plan and the approval of the Financial
2 Oversight Panel, to the county clerk on or before the first
3 Tuesday in November, then the Financial Oversight Panel for
4 the school district shall proceed to adopt, certify, and
5 return a certificate of tax levy for the school district to the
6 county clerk on or before the last Tuesday in December.
