2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 2159 by replacing		
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:		
4	"Section 5. The Lyme Disease Prevention and Protection Act		
5	is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:		
6	(410 ILCS 450/15)		
7	Sec. 15. Lyme Disease Task Force; duties; members.		
8	(a) The Department shall establish the Lyme Disease Task		
9	Force to advise the Department on disease prevention and		
10	surveillance and provider and public education relating to the		
11	disease.		
12	(b) The Task Force shall consist of the Director of Public		
13	Health or a designee, who shall serve as chairman, and the		
14	following members:		
15	(1) one representative from the Department of		
16	Financial and Professional Regulation, appointed by the		

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Director of Public Health;

(2) 3 physicians licensed to practice medicine in all
its branches who are members of a statewide organization
representing physicians, one of whom represents a medical
school faculty and one of whom has the experience of
treating Lyme disease, appointed by the Director of Public
Health;

8 (3) one advanced practice registered nurse selected 9 from the recommendations of professional nursing 10 associations, appointed by the Director of Public Health;

11 (4) one local public health administrator, appointed
12 by the Director of Public Health;

13 (5) <u>two veterinarians</u>, one of whom must be a
 14 <u>practicing Doctor of Veterinary Medicine</u> one veterinarian,
 15 appointed by the Director of Public Health;

16 (6) one medical entomologist, appointed by the 17 Director of Public Health;

18 (7) (6) 4 members of the public interested in Lyme
19 disease, appointed by the Director of Public Health;

20 <u>(8)</u> (7) 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the 21 House of Representatives;

(9) (8) 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of
 the House of Representatives;

24 <u>(10)</u> (9) 2 members appointed by the President of the 25 Senate; and

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(11) (10) 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader

1 of the Senate.

(c) The terms of the members of the Task Force shall be 3 2 3 years. Members may continue to serve after the expiration of a term until a new member is appointed. Each member appointed to 4 5 fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed shall be appointed for 6 the remainder of such term. The council shall meet as 7 8 frequently as the chairman deems necessary, but not less than 9 4 2 times each year. Members shall receive no compensation for 10 their services.

11 (d) The Lyme Disease Task Force has the following duties 12 and responsibilities:

13 (1) monitoring the implementation of this Act and 14 providing feedback and input for necessary additions or 15 modifications;

(2) reviewing relevant literature and guidelines that 16 17 define accurate diagnosis of Lyme disease with the purpose of creating cohesive and consistent guidelines for the 18 determination of Lyme diagnosis across all counties in 19 20 Illinois and with the intent of providing accurate and relevant numbers to the Centers for Disease Control and 21 22 Prevention;

23 (3) providing recommendations on professional 24 continuing educational materials and opportunities that 25 specifically focus on Lyme disease prevention, protection, 26 and treatment; and

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(4) assisting the Department in establishing policies, 1 procedures, techniques, and criteria for the collection, 2 maintenance, exchange, and sharing of medical information 3 4 on Lyme disease, and identifying persons or entities with 5 Lyme disease expertise to collaborate with Department in 6 Lyme disease diagnosis, prevention, and treatment.
