

102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB2930

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

215 ILCS 5/356z.25

Amends the Illinois Insurance Code. In provisions concerning coverage for treatment of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders, provides that on and after the effective date of the amendatory Act, an insured shall have a cause of action for liquidated damages in the amount of \$1,000 or actual damages, whichever is greater, against any entity issuing a group or individual policy of accident and health insurance or managed care plan that fails to provide the coverage required for treatment of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by changing Section 356z.25 as follows:
- 6 (215 ILCS 5/356z.25)

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- Sec. 356z.25. Coverage for treatment pediatric of autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute neuropsychiatric syndrome. A group or individual policy of accident and health insurance or managed care plan that is amended, delivered, issued, or renewed after July 18, 2017 (the effective date of Public Act 100-24) shall provide treatment pediatric autoimmune coverage for of neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, including, but not limited to, the use intravenous immunoglobulin therapy.
- 19 For billing and diagnosis purposes, pediatric autoimmune 20 neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal 21 infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome 22 shall be coded as autoimmune encephalitis until the American 23 Medical Association and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid

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Services create and assign a specific code for pediatric neuropsychiatric disorders associated autoimmune with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome. Thereafter, pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome may be coded as autoimmune encephalitis, pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections, or pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.

If, at any time, the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, or its successor agency, promulgates rules or regulations to be published in the Federal Register or publishes a comment in the Federal Register or issues an opinion, guidance, or other action that would require the State, pursuant to any provision of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111-148), including, but not limited to, 42 U.S.C. 18031(d)(3)(B) or any successor provision, to defray the cost of any coverage for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome outlined in this Section, then the requirement that an insurer cover pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome is inoperative other than any such
