SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

55 ILCS 5/5-1186 new 65 ILCS 5/11-42-17 new

Amends the Counties Code and Illinois Municipal Code. Provides that a veteran who is honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States and is a resident of a county or municipality shall not be required to pay any county or municipal license fee for a business selling or providing services if the veteran is the sole proprietor of the business. Limits home rule powers.

(a) A veteran who is honorably discharged from the Armed
Forces of the United States and is a resident of a municipality
shall not be required to pay any municipal license fees for a
business selling or providing services if the veteran is the
sole proprietor of the business.

(b) A home rule municipality may not regulate license fees in a manner inconsistent with this Section. This Section is a limitation under subsection (i) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution on the concurrent exercise by home rule units of powers and functions exercised by the State.
