SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 605/605-1055 new

Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Creates the Illinois Incubator and Collaborative Workspace Initiative Program to be implemented and administered by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. Provides that the Program shall support entrepreneurs by providing rent support grants and aiding collaborative workspaces in the acquisition of new tenants. Specifies grant requirements under the Program. Provides eligibility requirements for collaborative workspaces and tenants under the Program. Provides for the adoption of rules.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

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2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic
Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois
is amended by adding Section 605-1055 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 605/605-1055 new)

8 <u>Sec. 605-1055.</u> Illinois Incubator and Collaborative 9 Workspace Initiative Program.

10 <u>(a) There is hereby created the Illinois Incubator and</u> 11 <u>Collaborative Workspace Initiative Program to be implemented</u> 12 <u>and administered by the Department of Commerce and Economic</u> 13 <u>Opportunity. The Program shall support entrepreneurs by</u> 14 <u>providing rent support grants and aiding collaborative</u> 15 <u>workspaces in the acquisition of new tenants.</u>

(b) Subject to appropriation, grants under the Program 16 17 shall support rent of early stage technology and life science companies in Illinois collaborative workspaces. Grants shall 18 cover rent payments for 2, 4, or 6 month increments. A 19 20 collaborative workspace must match the grant to the tenant 21 company on a 1:2 ratio basis. The tenant company must commit to 22 continuing to work from the collaborative workspace, including paying rent, for a period of no less than the Program and the 23

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1	collaborative workspaces combined months of grant support.
2	Funding for grants under the Program may be drawn from federal
3	funds received by the State for purposes related to the
4	COVID-19 public health emergency.
5	(c) To qualify as an approved incubator and collaborative
6	workspace under the Program, a collaborative workspace must
7	meet the following criteria:
8	(1) be a located in Illinois;
9	(2) have a minimum of 5 unique paying tenants over the
10	last 2 years;
11	(3) have an operating cost;
12	(4) offer at least one type of work space, including
13	private office space, hot-desks, or dedicated desks;
14	(5) commit to hosting at least 10 innovation ecosystem
15	building events in a year, including, but not limited to,
16	meet-ups, speaker series, and office hours for lawyers,
17	accountants, consultants, and investors;
18	(6) certify that the workspace charges rent to tenants
19	and that the rent that would be charged to the startup and
20	supported by the Program is market-rate;
21	(7) commit to matching the Program's grant to the
22	tenant company on a 1:2 ratio basis; and
23	(8) meet any applicable certification requirements
24	established under Illinois law or as may be required by
25	the Department.
26	(d) When a collaborative workspace is approved for

1	participation in the Program under subsection (c), it shall
2	then be eligible to apply for a grant under the Program. As
3	prerequisite to receiving a grant under the Program, a
4	collaborative workspace must identify at least one tenant
5	company it would like to offer support to for purposes of the
6	Program.
7	(e) To qualify as an approved incubator and collaborative
8	workspace tenant under the Program, a prospective tenant must
9	meet the following criteria:
10	(1) be registered to do business in Illinois;
11	(2) provide a 2-page executive summary of their
12	business;
13	(3) certify that it: (i) is a technology and life
14	sciences company; (ii) is applying within 3 years after
15	its date of formation; (iii) has fewer than 10 employees;
16	(iv) has less than \$1,000,000 in trailing 12-months gross
17	sales from date of application submission; (v) has at
18	least one full-time Illinois employee that will be working
19	in the facility; and (vi) has not previously utilized
20	another collaborative workspace in Illinois; and
21	(4) commit to working at the facility for the duration
22	of the Program and the collaborative workspace's combined
23	months of grant support.
24	(f) The Department shall adopt all rules necessary for the
25	implementation and administration of the Program established
26	under this Section.

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
