1 AN ACT concerning education.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-45 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-45)

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Sec. 21B-45. Professional Educator License renewal.

8 (a) Individuals holding a Professional Educator License 9 are required to complete the licensure renewal requirements as 10 specified in this Section, unless otherwise provided in this 11 Code.

12 Individuals holding a Professional Educator License shall 13 meet the renewal requirements set forth in this Section, 14 unless otherwise provided in this Code. If an individual holds 15 a license endorsed in more than one area that has different 16 renewal requirements, that individual shall follow the renewal 17 requirements for the position for which he or she spends the 18 majority of his or her time working.

(b) All Professional Educator Licenses not renewed as provided in this Section shall lapse on September 1 of that year. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Section, if a license holder's electronic mail address is available, the State Board of Education shall send him or her notification HB4257 Enrolled - 2 - LRB102 20917 CMG 29806 b

electronically that his or her license will lapse if not 1 2 renewed, to be sent no more than 6 months prior to the license 3 lapsing. Lapsed licenses may be immediately reinstated upon (i) payment by the applicant of a \$500 penalty to the State 4 5 Board of Education or (ii) the demonstration of proficiency by completing 9 semester hours of coursework from a regionally 6 accredited institution of higher education in the content area 7 8 with one or more of the educator's that most aligns 9 endorsement areas. Any and all back fees, including without 10 limitation registration fees owed from the time of expiration 11 of the license until the date of reinstatement, shall be paid 12 and kept in accordance with the provisions in Article 3 of this 13 Code concerning an institute fund and the provisions in 14 Article 21B of this Code concerning fees and requirements for 15 registration. Licenses not registered in accordance with 16 Section 21B-40 of this Code shall lapse after a period of 6 17 months from the expiration of the last year of registration or on January 1 of the fiscal year following initial issuance of 18 19 license. An unregistered license is invalid after the 20 September 1 for employment and performance of services in an 21 Illinois public or State-operated school or cooperative and in 22 charter school. Any license or endorsement а mav be 23 voluntarily surrendered by the license holder. A voluntarily surrendered license shall be treated as a revoked license. An 24 25 Educator License with Stipulations with only а 26 paraprofessional endorsement does not lapse.

(c) From July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, in order to 1 2 satisfy the requirements for licensure renewal provided for in this Section, each professional educator licensee with an 3 administrative endorsement who is working in a position 4 5 requiring such endorsement shall complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as described in Article 2 of 6 7 this Code, per fiscal year.

8 (c-5) All licenses issued by the State Board of Education 9 under this Article that expire on June 30, 2020 and have not 10 been renewed by the end of the 2020 renewal period shall be 11 extended for one year and shall expire on June 30, 2021.

12 (d) Beginning July 1, 2014, in order to satisfy the 13 requirements for licensure renewal provided for in this 14 Section, each professional educator licensee may create a 15 professional development plan each year. The plan shall 16 address one or more of the endorsements that are required of 17 his or her educator position if the licensee is employed and performing services in an Illinois public or State-operated 18 19 school or cooperative. If the licensee is employed in a 20 charter school, the plan shall address that endorsement or those endorsements most closely related to his or her educator 21 22 position. Licensees employed and performing services in any 23 other Illinois schools may participate in the renewal requirements by adhering to the same process. 24

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the licensee's professional development activities shall align HB4257 Enrolled - 4 - LRB102 20917 CMG 29806 b

1 with one or more of the following criteria:

(1) activities are of a type that engage participants
over a sustained period of time allowing for analysis,
discovery, and application as they relate to student
learning, social or emotional achievement, or well-being;

6 (2) professional development aligns to the licensee's
7 performance;

8 (3) outcomes for the activities must relate to student
9 growth or district improvement;

10 11 (4) activities align to State-approved standards; and

(5) higher education coursework.

12 (e) For each renewal cycle, each professional educator licensee shall engage in professional development activities. 13 Prior to renewal, the licensee shall enter electronically into 14 15 the Educator Licensure Information System (ELIS) the name, 16 date, and location of the activity, the number of professional 17 development hours, and the provider's name. The following provisions shall apply concerning professional development 18 activities: 19

(1) Each licensee shall complete a total of 120 hours
of professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in
order to renew the license, except as otherwise provided
in this Section.

(2) Beginning with his or her first full 5-year cycle,
 any licensee with an administrative endorsement who is not
 working in a position requiring such endorsement is not

required to complete Illinois Administrators' Academy
 courses, as described in Article 2 of this Code. Such
 licensees must complete one Illinois Administrators'
 Academy course within one year after returning to a
 position that requires the administrative endorsement.

(3) Any licensee with an administrative endorsement 6 7 who is working in a position requiring such endorsement or an individual with a Teacher Leader endorsement serving in 8 9 an administrative capacity at least 50% of the day shall complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as 10 11 described in Article 2 of this Code, each fiscal year in 12 addition to 100 hours of professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in accordance with this Code. 13 14 However, for the 2021-2022 school year only, a licensee 15 under this paragraph (3) is not required to complete an 16 Illinois Administrators' Academy course.

(4) Any licensee holding a current National Board for
Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) master teacher
designation shall complete a total of 60 hours of
professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in order
to renew the license.

(5) Licensees working in a position that does not require educator licensure or working in a position for less than 50% for any particular year are considered to be exempt and shall be required to pay only the registration fee in order to renew and maintain the validity of the

license.

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2 (6) Licensees who are retired and qualify for benefits 3 from a State of Illinois retirement system shall notify the State Board of Education using ELIS, and the license 4 5 shall be maintained in retired status. For any renewal 6 cycle in which a licensee retires during the renewal 7 cycle, the licensee must complete professional development activities on a prorated basis depending on the number of 8 9 years during the renewal cycle the educator held an active 10 license. If a licensee retires during a renewal cycle, the 11 licensee must notify the State Board of Education using 12 ELIS that the licensee wishes to maintain the license in 13 retired status and must show proof of completion of 14 professional development activities on a prorated basis for all years of that renewal cycle for which the license 15 16 was active. An individual with a license in retired status 17 shall not be required to complete professional development activities or pay registration fees until returning to a 18 19 position that requires educator licensure. Upon returning 20 to work in a position that requires the Professional 21 Educator License, the licensee shall immediately pay a 22 registration fee and complete renewal requirements for 23 that year. A license in retired status cannot lapse. 24 Beginning on January 6, 2017 (the effective date of Public 25 Act 99-920) through December 31, 2017, any licensee who 26 has retired and whose license has lapsed for failure to HB4257 Enrolled - 7 - LRB102 20917 CMG 29806 b

1 renew as provided in this Section may reinstate that 2 license and maintain it in retired status upon providing 3 proof to the State Board of Education using ELIS that the 4 licensee is retired and is not working in a position that 5 requires a Professional Educator License.

6 (7)For any renewal cycle in which professional 7 development hours were required, but not fulfilled, the 8 licensee shall complete any missed hours to total the 9 minimum professional development hours required in this 10 Section prior to September 1 of that year. Professional 11 development hours used to fulfill the minimum required 12 hours for a renewal cycle may be used for only one renewal 13 cycle. For any fiscal year or renewal cycle in which an 14 Illinois Administrators' Academy course was required but 15 not completed, the licensee shall complete any missed 16 Illinois Administrators' Academy courses prior to 17 September 1 of that year. The licensee may complete all deficient hours and Illinois Administrators' Academy 18 19 courses while continuing to work in a position that 20 requires that license until September 1 of that year.

21 (8) Any licensee who has not fulfilled the 22 professional development renewal requirements set forth in 23 this Section at the end of any 5-year renewal cycle is ineligible to register his or her license and may submit 24 25 an appeal to the State Superintendent of Education for reinstatement of the license. 26

(9) If professional development opportunities were 1 unavailable to a licensee, proof that opportunities were 2 3 unavailable and request for an extension of time beyond August 31 to complete the renewal requirements may be 4 submitted from April 1 through June 30 of that year to the 5 6 State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. If an 7 extension is approved, the license shall remain valid during the extension period. 8

9 (10) Individuals who hold exempt licenses prior to 10 December 27, 2013 (the effective date of Public Act 11 98-610) shall commence the annual renewal process with the 12 first scheduled registration due after December 27, 2013 13 (the effective date of Public Act 98-610).

14 (11) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 15 subsection (e), if a licensee earns more than the required 16 number of professional development hours during a renewal 17 cycle, then the licensee may carry over any hours earned from April 1 through June 30 of the last year of the 18 19 renewal cycle. Any hours carried over in this manner must 20 be applied to the next renewal cycle. Illinois 21 Administrators' Academy courses or hours earned in those 22 courses may not be carried over.

23 (f) At the time of renewal, each licensee shall respond to 24 the required questions under penalty of perjury.

professional development hours required under this Section. 1 2 Upon completion of a random audit, if it is determined by the State Board of Education that the licensee did not complete 3 the required number of professional development hours or did 4 5 not provide sufficient proof of completion, the licensee shall be notified that his or her license has lapsed. A license that 6 7 has lapsed under this subsection may be reinstated as provided 8 in subsection (b).

9 (g) The following entities shall be designated as approved 10 to provide professional development activities for the renewal 11 of Professional Educator Licenses:

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(1) The State Board of Education.

13 (2) Regional offices of education and intermediate14 service centers.

(3) Illinois professional associations representing
the following groups that are approved by the State
Superintendent of Education:

(A) school administrators;

(C) school business officials;

(D) teachers, including special education
teachers;
(E) school boards;

(E) SCHOOL DOARDS

(F) school districts;

25 (G) parents; and

26 (H) school service personnel.

1 (4) Regionally accredited institutions of higher 2 education that offer Illinois-approved educator 3 preparation programs and public community colleges subject 4 to the Public Community College Act.

5 (5) Illinois public school districts, charter schools 6 authorized under Article 27A of this Code, and joint 7 educational programs authorized under Article 10 of this 8 Code for the purposes of providing career and technical 9 education or special education services.

10 (6) A not-for-profit organization that, as of December 11 31, 2014 (the effective date of Public Act 98-1147), has 12 had or has a grant from or a contract with the State Board 13 of Education to provide professional development services 14 in the area of English Learning to Illinois school 15 districts, teachers, or administrators.

16 (7) State agencies, State boards, and State 17 commissions.

18 (8) Museums as defined in Section 10 of the Museum19 Disposition of Property Act.

(h) Approved providers under subsection (g) of this
Section shall make available professional development
opportunities that satisfy at least one of the following:

(1) increase the knowledge and skills of school and district leaders who guide continuous professional development;

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(2) improve the learning of students;

(3) organize adults into learning communities whose
 goals are aligned with those of the school and district;

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(4) deepen educator's content knowledge;

4 (5) provide educators with research-based
5 instructional strategies to assist students in meeting
6 rigorous academic standards;

7 (6) prepare educators to appropriately use various
8 types of classroom assessments;

9 (7) use learning strategies appropriate to the 10 intended goals;

(8) provide educators with the knowledge and skills tocollaborate;

13 (9) prepare educators to apply research to decision 14 making;

(10) provide educators with training on inclusive practices in the classroom that examines instructional and behavioral strategies that improve academic and social-emotional outcomes for all students, with or without disabilities, in a general education setting; or

(11) beginning on July 1, 2022, provide educators with training on the physical and mental health needs of students, student safety, educator ethics, professional conduct, and other topics that address the well-being of students and improve the academic and social-emotional outcomes of students.

2 (1) align professional development activities to the

9 assessment for determining the expected impact on student
10 learning or school improvement;

11 (4) maintain original documentation for completion of 12 activities;

13 (5) provide license holders with evidence of 14 completion of activities;

(k) Registration fees shall be paid for the next renewal
cycle between April 1 and June 30 in the last year of each

5 (1) Any professional educator licensee endorsed for school 6 support personnel who is employed and performing services in Illinois public schools and who holds an active and current 7 8 professional license issued by the Department of Financial and 9 Professional Regulation or a national certification board, as 10 approved by the State Board of Education, related to the 11 endorsement areas on the Professional Educator License shall 12 be deemed to have satisfied the continuing professional development requirements provided for in this Section. Such 13 14 individuals shall be required to pay only registration fees to renew the Professional Educator License. An individual who 15 16 does not hold a license issued by the Department of Financial 17 and Professional Regulation shall complete professional development requirements for the renewal of a Professional 18 19 Educator License provided for in this Section.

1 (1) Each appeal shall state the reasons why the State 2 Superintendent's decision should be reversed and shall be 3 sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the 4 State Board of Education.

5 (2) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board 6 shall review each appeal regarding renewal of a license 7 within 90 days after receiving the appeal in order to 8 determine whether the licensee has met the requirements of 9 this Section.
