SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 5/232 new

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. Creates a child and dependent care credit equal to a percentage of the child and dependent care credit allowed to the taxpayer for federal income tax purposes under Section 21 of the Internal Revenue Code. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by adding Section 232 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 5/232 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 232. Child and dependent care credit.</u>
- (a) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 8 9 2023, each taxpayer with a federal adjusted gross income of less than \$45,000 is entitled to a credit against the tax 10 imposed under subsections (a) and (b) of Section 201 equal to a 11 12 percentage of the child and dependent care credit allowed to the taxpayer for federal income tax purposes under Section 21 13 14 of the Internal Revenue Code. For the following federal adjusted gross income ranges, the taxpayer's credit shall be 15 16 the percentage of the federal credit allowed to the taxpayer 17 for federal income tax purposes under Section 21 of the
- 19 Less than \$10,000, 75%.

Internal Revenue Code indicated:

- 20 \$10,000 or more, but less than \$20,000, 65%.
- \$20,000 or more, but less than \$25,000, 55%.
- 22 \$25,000 or more, but less than \$35,000, 50%.
- 23 \$35,000 or more, but less than \$40,000, 40%.

- 1 \$40,000 or more, but less than \$45,000, 30%.
- 2 (b) The credit under this Section may not reduce the
- 3 taxpayer's liability to less than zero. If the amount of the
- 4 <u>credit or credits exceeds the taxpayer's liability, the excess</u>
- 5 may be refunded to the taxpayer.
