## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems
Act is amended by changing Section 3.55 as follows:

7 Sec. 3.55. Scope of practice.

8 (a) Any person currently licensed as an EMR, EMT, EMT-I, 9 A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic may perform emergency and non-emergency medical services as defined in this Act, in 10 accordance with his or her level of education, training and 11 licensure, the standards of performance and conduct prescribed 12 13 by the Department in rules adopted pursuant to this Act, and 14 the requirements of the EMS System in which he or she practices, as contained in the approved Program Plan for that 15 16 System. The Director may, by written order, temporarily modify 17 individual scopes of practice in response to public health emergencies for periods not exceeding 180 days. 18

19 (a-5) EMS personnel who have successfully completed a 20 Department approved course in automated defibrillator 21 operation and who are functioning within a Department approved 22 EMS System may utilize such automated defibrillator according 23 to the standards of performance and conduct prescribed by the SB0121 Engrossed - 2 - LRB102 10139 CPF 15461 b

1 Department in rules adopted pursuant to this Act and the 2 requirements of the EMS System in which they practice, as 3 contained in the approved Program Plan for that System.

(a-7) An EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, 4 or 5 Paramedic who has successfully completed a Department approved course in the administration of epinephrine shall be required 6 7 to carry epinephrine with him or her as part of the EMS 8 personnel medical supplies whenever he or she is performing System. 9 official duties as determined by the EMS The 10 epinephrine may be administered from а qlass vial, 11 auto-injector, ampule, or pre-filled syringe.

12 (b) An EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or 13 Paramedic may practice as an EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, or Paramedic or utilize his or her EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, 14 15 PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic license in pre-hospital or 16 inter-hospital emergency care settings or non-emergency 17 medical transport situations, under the written or verbal direction of the EMS Medical Director. For purposes of this 18 19 Section, a "pre-hospital emergency care setting" may include a 20 location, that is not a health care facility, which utilizes EMS personnel to render pre-hospital emergency care prior to 21 22 the arrival of a transport vehicle. The location shall include 23 communication equipment and all of the portable equipment and 24 appropriate for the EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, drugs or 25 Paramedic's level of care, as required by this Act, rules 26 adopted by the Department pursuant to this Act, and the

protocols of the EMS Systems, and shall operate only with the
 approval and under the direction of the EMS Medical Director.

3 This Section shall not prohibit an EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic from practicing within an 4 5 emergency department or other health care setting for the purpose of receiving continuing education or training approved 6 by the EMS Medical Director. This Section shall also not 7 prohibit an EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, 8 or 9 Paramedic from seeking credentials other than his or her EMT, 10 EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic license and 11 utilizing such credentials to work in emergency departments or 12 other health care settings under the jurisdiction of that 13 employer.

14 (c) An EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic
15 may honor Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) orders and powers of
16 attorney for health care only in accordance with rules adopted
17 by the Department pursuant to this Act and protocols of the EMS
18 System in which he or she practices.

19 (d) A student enrolled in a Department approved EMS 20 personnel program, while fulfilling the clinical training and in-field supervised experience requirements mandated for 21 22 licensure or approval by the System and the Department, may 23 perform prescribed procedures under the direct supervision of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all of its 24 25 branches, a qualified registered professional nurse, or qualified EMS personnel, only when authorized by the EMS 26

1 Medical Director.

2 (e) An EMR, EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, PHRN, PHAPRN, PHPA, or Paramedic may transport a police dog injured in the line of 3 4 duty to a veterinary clinic or similar facility if there are no 5 persons requiring medical attention or transport at that time. 6 For the purposes of this subsection, "police dog" means a dog 7 owned or used by a law enforcement department or agency in the course of the department or agency's work, including a search 8 9 and rescue dog, service dog, accelerant detection canine, or 10 other dog that is in use by a county, municipal, or State law 11 enforcement agency.

12 (f) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit an 13 EMT, EMT-I, A-EMT, Paramedic, or PHRN from completing an 14 initial Occupational Safety and Health Administration 15 Respirator Medical Evaluation Questionnaire on behalf of fire 16 service personnel, as permitted by his or her EMS System 17 Medical Director. 18 (Source: P.A. 99-862, eff. 1-1-17; 100-108, eff. 1-1-18;
