The amount of \$7,775,375, or so much thereof 7 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2021, from a reappropriation heretofore 8 9 made in Article 59, Section 25 of Public Act 101-0637, as 10 amended, is reappropriated to the Department of Corrections 11 from the General Revenue Fund for expenses related to the 12 necessary replacement of aging and unreliable telecommunication 13 systems.

7 ARTICLE 3

- 8 Section 1. The sum of \$688,500, or so much thereof as may
- 9 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Corrections
- 10 from the General Revenue Fund for a grant to the Illinois
- 11 Sentencing Policy Advisory Council.
