1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Environmental
11 Protection Trust Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency
12 for awards and grants as directed by the Environmental
13 Protection Trust Fund Commission.

14 Section 30. The sum of \$23,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Environmental
16 Protection Agency from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund for deposit into
17 the Vehicle Inspection Fund.
