#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 330/8d new  
210 ILCS 5/7d new  
210 ILCS 85/6.28 new  
225 ILCS 85/15.10 new

Amends the University of Illinois Hospital Act, the Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act, the Hospital Licensing Act, and the Pharmacy Practice Act. Requires hospitals and facilities to offer a patient any unused portion of a facility-provided medication upon discharge when it is administered to a patient at the hospital or facility and is required for continuing treatment. Defines "facility-provided medication". Provides that an unused portion of a facility-provided medication required for continuing treatment must be provided to a patient upon discharge when the facility-provided medication is ordered at least 24 hours in advance for surgical procedures. Requires facility-medications to be consistent with labeling requirements under specified provisions of the Pharmacy Practice Act. Provides that if a facility-provided medication is used in an operating room or emergency department setting, the prescriber is responsible for counseling the patient on its proper use and administration and the requirement of pharmacist counseling is waived. Effective July 1, 2021.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is  
5 amended by adding Section 8d as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 330/8d new)

7 Sec. 8d. Facility-provided medication upon discharge.

8 (a) The General Assembly finds that this Section is  
9 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,  
10 health, and safety.

11 (b) In this Section, "facility-provided medication" has  
12 the same meaning as provided under Section 15.10 of the  
13 Pharmacy Practice Act.

14 (c) When a facility-provided medication is ordered at  
15 least 24 hours in advance for surgical procedures and is  
16 administered to a patient at the University of Illinois  
17 Hospital, any unused portion of the facility-provided  
18 medication must be offered to the patient upon discharge when  
19 it is required for continuing treatment.

20 (d) A facility-provided medication shall be labeled  
21 consistent with labeling requirements under Section 22 of the  
22 Pharmacy Practice Act.

23 (e) If the facility-provided medication is used in an

1 operating room or emergency department setting, the prescriber  
2 is responsible for counseling the patient on its proper use  
3 and administration and the requirement of pharmacist  
4 counseling is waived.

5 Section 10. The Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act  
6 is amended by adding Section 7d as follows:

7 (210 ILCS 5/7d new)

8 Sec. 7d. Facility-provided medication upon discharge.

9 (a) The General Assembly finds that this Section is  
10 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,  
11 health, and safety.

12 (b) In this Section, "facility-provided medication" has  
13 the same meaning as provided under Section 15.10 of the  
14 Pharmacy Practice Act.

15 (c) When a facility-provided medication is ordered at  
16 least 24 hours in advance for surgical procedures and is  
17 administered to a patient at a facility licensed under this  
18 Act, any unused portion of the facility-provided medication  
19 must be offered to the patient upon discharge when it is  
20 required for continuing treatment.

21 (d) A facility-provided medication shall be labeled  
22 consistent with labeling requirements under Section 22 of the  
23 Pharmacy Practice Act.

24 (e) If the facility-provided medication is used in an

1 operating room setting, the prescriber is responsible for  
2 counseling the patient on its proper use and administration  
3 and the requirement of pharmacist counseling is waived.

4 Section 15. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by  
5 adding Section 6.28 as follows:

6 (210 ILCS 85/6.28 new)

7 Sec. 6.28. Facility-provided medication upon discharge.

8 (a) The General Assembly finds that this Section is  
9 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,  
10 health, and safety.

11 (b) In this Section, "facility-provided medication" has  
12 the same meaning as provided under Section 15.10 of the  
13 Pharmacy Practice Act.

14 (c) When a facility-provided medication is ordered at  
15 least 24 hours in advance for surgical procedures and is  
16 administered to a patient at a hospital licensed under this  
17 Act, any unused portion of the facility-provided medication  
18 must be offered to the patient upon discharge when it is  
19 required for continuing treatment.

20 (d) A facility-provided medication shall be labeled  
21 consistent with labeling requirements under Section 22 of the  
22 Pharmacy Practice Act.

23 (e) If the facility-provided medication is used in an  
24 operating room or emergency department setting, the prescriber

1 is responsible for counseling the patient on its proper use  
2 and administration and the requirement of pharmacist  
3 counseling is waived.

4 Section 20. The Pharmacy Practice Act is amended by adding  
5 Section 15.10 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 85/15.10 new)

7 Sec. 15.10. Facility-provided medication upon discharge.

8 (a) The General Assembly finds that this Section is  
9 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,  
10 health, and safety.

11 (b) In this Section, "facility-provided medication" means  
12 any topical antibiotic, anti-inflammatory, dilation, or  
13 glaucoma drop or ointment.

14 (c) When a facility-provided medication is administered to  
15 a patient at the facility, any unused portion of the  
16 facility-provided medication must be offered to the patient  
17 upon discharge when it is required for continuing treatment.

18 (d) A facility-provided medication shall be labeled  
19 consistent with labeling requirements under Section 22.

20 (e) If the facility-provided medication is used in an  
21 operating room or emergency department setting, the prescriber  
22 is responsible for counseling the patient on its proper use  
23 and administration and the requirement of pharmacist  
24 counseling is waived.

1           Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,  
2           2021.
