#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

55 ILCS 5/4-7001

from Ch. 34, par. 4-7001

Amends the Counties Code. Provides that fees for a coroner's or medical examiner's permit to cremate a human body is \$100 (rather than \$50). Provides that fees for a certified copy of a transcript of sworn testimony of a coroner's inquest made by written request declaring the request is for research or genealogy purposes is \$15.00 for the entire transcript. Provides that a request shall be deemed a proper request for purpose of research or genealogy if the requested inquest occurred not less than 20 years prior to the date of the written request and that the transcript shall be stamped with the words "FOR GENEALOGY OR RESEARCH PURPOSES ONLY". Provides that a coroner may waive, at his or her discretion, fees under the Section (currently, only the cremation permit fee) if the coroner determines that the person is indigent and unable to pay the permit fee or under other special circumstances as determined by the coroner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Counties Code is amended by changing
Section 4-7001 as follows:

(55 ILCS 5/4-7001) (from Ch. 34, par. 4-7001) 6 7 Sec. 4-7001. Coroner's fees. The fees of the coroner's office shall be as follows: 8 9 1. For a copy of a transcript of sworn testimony: 10 \$5.00 per page. 2. For a copy of an autopsy report (if not included in 11 12 transcript): \$50.00. 3. For a copy of the verdict of a coroner's jury: 13 14 \$5.00. 4. For a copy of a toxicology report: \$25.00. 15 16 5. For a print of or an electronic file containing a picture obtained by the coroner: actual cost or \$3.00, 17 whichever is greater. 18 19 6. For each copy of miscellaneous reports, including 20 artist's drawings but not including police reports: actual 21 cost or \$25.00, whichever is greater. 22 7. For a coroner's or medical examiner's permit to cremate a dead human body: \$100.00 \$50.00. The coroner may 23

waive, at his or her discretion, the permit fee if the 1 2 coroner determines that the person is indigent and unable 3 to pay the permit fee or under other -special 4 circumstances. 5 8. For a certified copy of a transcript of sworn 6 testimony of a coroner's inquest made by written request 7 declaring the request is for research or genealogy purposes: \$15.00 for the entire transcript. A request 8 9 shall be deemed a proper request for purpose of research 10 or genealogy if the requested inquest occurred not less 11 than 20 years prior to the date of the written request. The 12 transcript shall be stamped with the words "FOR GENEALOGY 13 OR RESEARCH PURPOSES ONLY". 14 The coroner may waive, at his or her discretion, fees

15 <u>under this Section if the coroner determines that the person</u> 16 <u>is indigent and unable to pay the permit fee or under other</u> 17 <u>special circumstances as determined by the coroner.</u>

All of which fees shall be certified by the court; in the 18 19 case of inmates of any State charitable or penal institution, the fees shall be paid by the operating department or 20 commission, out of the State Treasury. The coroner shall file 21 22 his or her claim in probate for his or her fees and he or she 23 shall render assistance to the State's attorney in the collection of such fees out of the estate of the deceased. In 24 25 counties of less than 1,000,000 population, the State's 26 attorney shall collect such fees out of the estate of the - 3 - LRB102 11330 AWJ 16663 b

1 deceased.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, whenever the coroner is required by law to perform any of the duties of the office of the sheriff, the coroner is entitled to the like fees and compensation as are allowed by law to the sheriff for the performance of similar services.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, whenever the coroner of any county is required to travel in the performance of his or her duties, he or she shall receive the same mileage fees as are authorized for the sheriff of such county.

11 All fees under this Section collected by or on behalf of 12 the coroner's office shall be paid over to the county 13 treasurer and deposited into a special account in the county 14 treasury. Moneys in the special account shall be used solely 15 for the purchase of electronic and forensic identification 16 equipment or other related supplies and the operating expenses 17 of the coroner's office.
