The Department of Commerce and Economic 4 Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois 5 is amended by adding Section 605-1055 as follows: 6 7 (20 ILCS 605/605-1055 new) Sec. 605-1055. Coronavirus relief small business grants. 8 (a) Of the federal funds received by the State for 9 purposes related to the COVID-19 public health emergency, 25% 10 of any such funds shall be allocated as grants to businesses 11 12 with 50 or fewer employees as provided under this Section. 13 (b) Except as may otherwise be provided under subsection (c), to be eligible for grants under this Section, a business 14 15 must employ 50 or fewer employees and must demonstrate at

least a 25% reduction in gross income from 2019 to 2020.

- (1) Grants in the amount of \$10,000 to small businesses and non-profit organizations with 50 or fewer employees, having gross revenue over \$100,000, that can demonstrate a 25% reduction in revenue between 2019 and 2020. Such businesses and non-profit organizations in disadvantaged communities shall receive an additional \$2,500 in funding.
- (2) Grants totaling 10% of the revenue loss sustained between 2019 and 2020 to eligible small businesses and non-profit organizations whose revenue did not exceed \$100,000 in 2019. Such businesses and non-profit organizations in disadvantaged communities shall receive grants totaling 12.5% of that lost revenue.
- (3) Grants in the amount of \$3,500 to small businesses and non-profit organizations that commenced operations in the 3rd and 4th quarter of 2019, and as such, are unable to demonstrate the requisite loss in revenue from 2019 to 2020. Such businesses and non-profit organizations in disadvantaged communities shall receive an additional \$500 in funding. To be eligible for a grant under this paragraph (3), a business or non-profit organization must establish that prior to March 2020 it met at least 3 of the following criteria: (i) an established website or social media presence; (ii) an established office space; (iii) an
