1 SENATE RESOLUTION

2	WHEREAS, The Sexual Assault Survivors Emergency Treatment
3	Act is primarily focused on sexual assault survivors
4	generally, and child sexual abuse has distinct circumstances
5	and responses; and
6	WHEREAS, Child sexual abuse has various adverse effects on
7	the psychological, physical, behavioral, and interpersonal
8	well-being of the victim; and
9	WHEREAS, Child victims of sexual and physical abuse are at
10	a higher risk of suffering from depression, low self-esteem,
11	post traumatic stress disorder, psychotic syndromes, suicide
12	or attempted suicide, anti-social personality disorders, drug
13	and alcohol abuse, and increased risk of re-victimization; and
14	WHEREAS, Child victims of sexual abuse deserve to have an
15	acute specialized medical response/exam that is
16	developmentally appropriate, trauma-informed,
17	evidenced-based, and provided by a medical specialist with
18	pediatric expertise; and
19	WHEREAS, The research conducted on child sexual assault
20	indicates that in cases of child sexual abuse when the

investigation is conducted carefully and conscientiously then

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- answers to questions of safety begin to emerge; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The research conducted on child sexual assault
- 3 cases indicates one in 10 children are affected; 73% of child
- 4 victims do not tell anyone about the abuse for at least a year,
- 5 45% of victims do not tell anyone for at least 5 years, and
- 6 some children never disclose; 90% of child sexual abuse
- 7 victims know their abuser; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The State has a responsibility to protect these
- 9 youth from mistreatment, further traumatization, and
- 10 exploitation; therefore, be it
- 11 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL
- 12 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Child Sexual and
- 13 Physical Abuse Task Force is created to investigate, assess,
- 14 and make recommendations on the Sexual Assault Survivors
- 15 Emergency Treatment ACT and its implementation to ensure that
- 16 child development and children's unique medical needs are
- 17 addressed in the medical response to child sexual abuse within
- this Act; in addition to the goals stated above, The Task Force
- 19 shall:
- 20 (1) Evaluate current training, mentoring, and
- 21 certification programming for pediatric sexual abuse
- 22 medical exam providers to ensure all align with national
- 23 accreditation standards;

L	(2) Conduct	a comprehensiv	e review,	evaluation,	and
2	streamlining of	the complaint	process fo	or practition	ners

- (3) Prepare a peer review of all processes relating to the implementation, accreditation, and programmatic structure of the Sexual Assault Survivors Emergency Treatment Act;
- (4) Conduct a comprehensive review of pediatric evidence available to ensure that the implementation of the Sexual Assault Survivors Emergency Treatment Act is appropriate for pediatric populations; and
- (5) Conduct a comprehensive review of the examination process for becoming a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Pediatrics in Illinois to ensure that this accreditation is efficient, effective, and appropriate; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members:
  - (1) The President of the Senate or his or her designee, who shall serve as Chairperson;
  - (2) The Minority Leader of the Senate or his or her designee;
  - (3) The Director of the Department of Children and Family Services or the (DCFS) Director of Legislative Affairs;

(4) The Director of the Department of Public Health or 1 2 the (DPH) Director of Legislative Affairs; (5) The Director of the Illinois State Police or the 3 (ISP) Director of Government Relations; The Attorney General or the (AG) Chief of 6 Legislative Affairs; 7 (7) The Director of the Guardianship and Advocacy 8 Commission or his or her designee; and 9 (8) The following members appointed by the Director of 10 the Department of Children and Family Services: 11 (a) One member representing a coalition of 12 Children's Advocacy Centers in Illinois; 13 (b) Five members representing Children Advocacy 14 Centers; appointees must be geographically diverse: four 15 members representing each CAC region and one representing 16 a county with a population less than 100,000 people; 17 (c) Five members representing Certified Pediatric Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners - SANE-Ps; appointees must 18 19 be geographically diverse: four members, each representing 20 only one CAC region and one representing a county with a 21 population less than 100,000 people; 22 (d) Five Pediatrician Board Certified/Eliqible in 23 Child Abuse and Neglect; appointees must be geographically Diverse: four members representing only one CAC region and 24

one representing a county with a population less than

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- 1 (e) Five general pediatricians with expertise in child sexual abuse;
  - (f) One member representing a statewide
    association of pediatricians;
- 5 (g) One member representing a statewide 6 association of hospitals;
- 7 (h) One member representing a statewide 8 association of physicians;
  - (i) One member representing children's justice prosecutor with experience prosecuting sexual and physical abuse of minors;
  - (j) One member who serves as a law enforcement officer (juvenile division or Child Death Review Team) with experience investigating sexual and physical abuse of minors; and
  - (k) One pediatrician who is board certified in child abuse pediatrics at an independent free-standing children's hospital located in Chicago and serves as an assistant professor of pediatrics (child abuse) at a medical school located in Chicago; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That members of the Task Force shall be 22 appointed within 30 days after the adoption of this resolution 23 and shall serve without compensation; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Illinois State Police shall provide

- 1 administrative support to the Task Force; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall hold at least four
- 3 meetings, and the first meeting must be held within 30 days
- 4 after appointments are finalized or at the call of the
- 5 Chairperson; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Task Force must report its findings and
- 7 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly no
- 8 later than April, 30, 2021, and upon the filing of its report
- 9 is dissolved; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be
- 11 delivered to the President of the Senate, the Minority Leader
- of the Senate, and the state agencies represented on the Task
- 13 Force.
