AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Highway Code is amended by 5 changing Section 6-201.7 as follows:

6 (605 ILCS 5/6-201.7) (from Ch. 121, par. 6-201.7)

7 Sec. 6-201.7. Construct, maintain and repair and be responsible for the construction, maintenance and repair of 8 9 roads within the district, let contracts, employ labor and purchase material and machinery therefor, subject to the 10 this Code. Contracts, 11 limitations provided in labor, 12 machinery, disposal, and incidental expenses related to Section 6-201.21 of this Code 13 special services under 14 constitute maintenance, for purposes of this Section.

Except for professional services, when the cost of 15 16 construction, materials, supplies, new machinery or equipment exceeds $$30,000 \frac{$20,000}{$20,000}$, the contract for such construction, 17 materials, supplies, machinery or equipment shall be let to 18 19 the lowest responsible bidder after advertising for bids at least once, and at least 10 days prior to the time set for the 20 21 opening of such bids, in a newspaper published within the 22 township or road district, or, if no newspaper is published within the township or road district then in one published 23

within the county, or, if no newspaper is published within the 1 2 county then in a newspaper having general circulation within 3 the township or road district, but, in case of an emergency, 4 such contract may be let without advertising for bids. For 5 purposes of this Section "new machinery or equipment" shall be 6 defined as that which has been previously untitled or that 7 which shows fewer than 200 hours on its operating clock and 8 is accompanied by a new equipment manufacturer's that 9 warranty.
