2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 2838 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Mental Health and Developmental
5	Disabilities Administrative Act is amended by adding Sections
6	71B and 71C as follows:
7	(20 ILCS 1705/71B new)
8	Sec. 71B. Behavioral Health Education and Supervision
9	<u>Fund.</u>
10	(a) The Behavioral Health Education and Supervision Fund
11	is created in the State treasury as a special fund.
12	(b) The Fund is created for the purpose of funding
13	scholarships and grants in the behavioral health field as
14	provided in Section 71C of this Act and Section 65.120 of the
15	Higher Education Student Assistance Act.

2	Sec. 71C. Intern and Supervision Access Program.
3	(a) As used in this Section:
4	"Federally qualified health center" means a health center
5	funded under Section 330 of the federal Public Health Service
6	Act.
7	"FQHC Look-Alike" means a health center that meets the
8	requirements for receiving a grant under Section 330 of the
9	federal Public Health Service Act but does not receive funding
10	under that Act.
11	"Part-time" means working at least 20 hours a week.
12	"Qualified individual or entity" means:
13	(1) a student pursuing a degree or certificate in
14	behavioral health who interns at a community
15	not-for-profit behavioral health agency, federally
16	qualified health center, or FQHC Look-Alike; or
17	(2) a community not-for-profit behavioral health
18	agency, federally qualified health center, FQHC look-alike
19	and any association representing them that seeks to
20	establish or expand clinical supervision or supervision
21	for supervised work experience of interns and behavioral
22	health providers-in-training pursuing licensure as a
23	licensed clinical social worker, licensed clinical
24	professional counselor, and licensed marriage and family
25	therapist.
26	(b) Subject to appropriation, the Department of Human

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1	Services shall establish the Intern and Supervision Access
2	Program to provide grants to qualified individuals who intern
3	for community not-for-profit behavioral health agencies,
4	federally qualified health centers, or FQHC Look-Alikes and
5	qualified entities who seek to establish or expand clinical
6	supervision or supervision for supervised work experience of
7	interns and behavioral health providers-in-training pursuing
8	licensure as a licensed clinical social worker, licensed
9	clinical professional counselor, and licensed marriage and
10	family therapist.
11	(c) Under the Program, the Department shall provide
12	financial assistance to qualified individuals and entities.
13	(d) A person who is a qualified individual under paragraph
14	(1) of subsection (a) is eligible to receive a grant to
15	compensate the individual for work as a intern. The grant
16	amount shall provide an equivalent amount of compensation to
17	the individual similar to the expected market rate of a person
18	performing similar duties as the individual in either a
19	community profit or not-for-profit behavioral health agency,
20	federally qualified health center, or FQHC Look-Alike.
21	(e) A qualified entity under paragraph (2) of subsection
22	(a) is eligible to receive a grant to establish new or expand
23	existing clinical supervision or supervision for supervised
24	work experience of interns and behavioral health
25	providers-in-training pursuing licensure as a licensed
26	clinical social worker, licensed clinical professional

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1	counselor, and licensed marriage and family therapist.
2	(f) The Department may use moneys from the Behavioral
3	Health Education and Supervision Program Fund to fund the
4	Intern and Supervision Access Program as described under this
5	Section.
6	(g) The Department shall adopt rules to implement this
7	<u>Section.</u>
8	Section 10. The State Finance Act is amended by adding
9	Section 5.990 as follows:
10	(30 ILCS 105/5.990 new)
11	Sec. 5.990. The Behavioral Health Education and
12	Supervision Fund.
13	Section 15. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is
14	amended by adding Section 65.120 as follows:
15	(110 ILCS 947/65.120 new)
16	Sec. 65.120. Behavioral Health Scholarship Program.
17	(a) As used in this Section:
18	"Behavioral health discipline" means:
19	(1) undergraduate behavioral health disciplines that
20	may be offered through institutions of higher education,
21	including, but not limited to, psychology, social work,
22	and counseling;

1	(2) graduate behavioral health disciplines, including,
2	but not limited to, clinical or counseling psychology,
3	counseling, social work, and marriage and family therapy;
4	(3) Medical doctors, doctors of osteopathic medicine,
5	registered nurses, advanced practice registered nurses
6	with specialties in psychiatry or mental health; and
7	(4) certified behavioral health disciplines, including
8	but not limited to certified recovery support specialists
9	and certified peer recovery specialists.
10	"Eligible applicant" means a student who is enrolled in a
11	program of study at a participating college, community college
12	or university and who meets all of the qualifications and
13	requirements under this Section.
14	"Federally qualified health center" means a health center
15	funded under Section 330 of the federal Public Health Service
16	Act.
17	"FQHC Look-Alike" means a health center that meets the
18	requirements for receiving a grant under Section 330 of the
19	federal Public Health Service Act but does not receive funding
20	under that Act.
21	"Part-time employment" means working at least 20 hours a
22	week.
23	"Participating college, community college or university"
24	means a institution of higher education that is a party to an
25	intergovernmental agreement entered into with the Commission
26	in order to participate in the program established under this

1 Section.

"Tuition, university fees, and books" includes the 2 customary charge for instruction and books or course material 3 4 and the additional fixed fees charged for purposes that are 5 required generally of students who are not Program applicants 6 under this Section for each academic year for which a Program applicant under this Section actually enrolls. "Tuition, 7 university fees, and books" does not include room and board, 8 9 transportation fees, fees payable only once, breakage fees, 10 and other contingent deposits that are refundable in whole or in part. The Commission may adopt, by rule not inconsistent 11 with this Section, detailed provisions concerning the 12 13 computation of tuition, university fees, and books.

14 (b) Subject to appropriation, beginning with the 2024-2025 15 academic year, the Commission shall establish and administer 16 the Behavioral Health Scholarship Program for the purpose of incentivizing students to pursue degrees in a behavioral 17 health discipline. The Commission shall enter into agreements 18 with institutions of higher education to participate in the 19 20 Program. Under the Program, the Commission shall provide 21 financial assistance to an eligible applicant.

(c) In this subsection (c), "racial minority" means a person who is a citizen of the United States or a lawful permanent resident alien of the United States and who is:

25 <u>(1) Black (a person having origins in any of the black</u>
26 <u>racial groups in Africa);</u>

1	(2) Hispanic (a person of Spanish or Portuguese
2	culture with origins in Mexico, South or Central America,
3	or the Caribbean Islands, regardless of race);
4	(3) Asian American (a person having origins in any of
5	the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the
6	Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands); or
7	(4) American Indian or Alaskan Native (a person having
8	origins in any of the original peoples of North America).
9	Subject to appropriation, the Commission shall award
10	financial assistance in the form of a scholarship to an
11	applicant to cover the cost of tuition, university fees, and
12	books each year for a maximum of 4 years at a participating
13	college, community college or university if the applicant
14	meets all of the following criteria:
15	(1) The applicant is a resident of this State or a
16	child of a noncitizen of the United States.
17	(2) The applicant has committed to work in a community
18	not-for-profit behavioral health agency, federally
19	qualified health center, or FQHC Look-Alike for at least 4
20	years.
21	(3) The applicant fully graduates or fully completes
22	the degree or certification.
23	The amount of the scholarship awarded to a student
24	attending a private college or university shall be the cost of
25	tuition, university fees, and books each year at the public
26	university with the highest cost of tuition, university fees,

1	and backs each wear in the State Any scholarchin awarded to a
	and books each year in the State. Any scholarship awarded to a
2	qualified applicant attending a private college or university
3	may not preclude the eligible applicant from using other
4	funding sources to pay for tuition and other costs not covered
5	by the Program.
6	In awarding scholarships, the Commission shall give
7	priority to those applicants who are members of a racial
8	minority.
9	(d) Each participating college, community college or
10	university shall post on its website the criteria and
11	eligibility requirements to receive financial assistance under
12	this Section and must identify that the financial assistance
13	is for a maximum of 4 academic years, with the total amount of
14	financial assistance awarded to an eligible applicant not to
15	exceed the cost of tuition, university fees, and books or a
16	higher education student loan. This information must also be
17	reported to the Commission and the Board of Higher Education,
18	and the Commission and the Board shall post the information on
19	the Commission's and Board's respective websites.
20	(e) Prior to receiving financial assistance for any
21	academic year, an eligible applicant under this Section shall
22	be required by the participating college, community college or
23	university to sign an agreement with the Commission under
24	which the eligible applicant pledges that, within 6 months
25	from the date of the eligible applicant's graduation or
26	certificate completion from the participating college,

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community college or university, the eligible applicant must 1 search for, apply for, and accept full-time or part-time 2 employment at a community not-for-profit behavioral health 3 4 agency, federally qualified health center, or FQHC Look-Alike. 5 The recipient of financial assistance must, for at least 4 6 years, maintain this employment. (f) The Commission shall develop rules related to 7 scholarship repayment for recipients who (i) fail to search 8 9 for, apply for, and accept full-time or part-time employment 10 within a defined time frame, (ii) have changes to their school enrollment status, or (iii) have a terminated employment 11 status for any reason, including for cause, prior to the 12 13 program's 4-year employment requirement. 14 (q) The Commission may use moneys from the Behavioral 15 Health Education and Supervision Fund to fund the Program as 16 described under this Section. (h) The Commission shall adopt rules to implement this 17 Section and may adopt <u>rules relating to its collection</u> 18 19 activities for the repayment of any financial assistance

20 provided under this Section.

21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 22 becoming law.".
