

## 103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 HB3771

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2310/2310-475 new

Amends the Department of Public Health Powers and Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Provides that the Department of Public Health shall ensure that any physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches or health care provider who sees or treats children 6 years of age or younger shall assess those children for their access to unsecured firearms when those children reside in a home that has firearms. Provides that children residing in a home that does not contain firearms shall be evaluated for risk by the Childhood Firearm Access Risk Questionnaire developed by the Department and assessed if indicated. Provides that children shall be evaluated in accordance with rules adopted by the Department. Makes other changes. Effective January 1, 2024.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and
  Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
  amended by adding Section 2310-475 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-475 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 2310-475. Safe gun storage; pediatricians;</u> 9 dissemination by the Department.
- (a) The Department shall ensure that any physician 10 licensed to practice medicine in all its branches or health 11 12 care provider who sees or treats children 6 years of age or younger shall assess those children for their access to 13 14 unsecured firearms when those children reside in a home that has firearms. Children residing in a home that does not 15 16 contain firearms shall be evaluated for risk by the Childhood Firearm Access Risk Questionnaire developed by the Department 17 and assessed if indicated. Children shall be evaluated in 18 19 accordance with rules adopted by the Department.
  - (b) The Department shall ensure that each licensed, registered, or approved health care facility serving children 6 years of age or younger, including, but not limited to, health departments, hospitals, clinics, and health maintenance

- 1 <u>organizations</u> approved, registered, or licensed by the
- 2 Department, shall take the appropriate steps to ensure that
- 3 <u>children 6 years of age or younger be evaluated for risk of</u>
- 4 access to unsecured firearms.
- 5 (c) The Department shall adopt rules to assess whether
- 6 <u>children 7 years and older and pregnant persons may also be</u>
- 7 <u>evaluated for risk of access to unsecured firearms by</u>
- 8 physicians or health care providers. The Department shall also
- 9 <u>ensure that physicians and health care providers shall</u>
- 10 evaluate children for access to unsecured firearms with the
- 11 school health examination, as required under the School Code,
- when, in the medical judgment of the physician, advanced
- 13 practice registered nurse, or physician assistant, the child
- is potentially at high risk of access to firearms.
- 15 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
- 16 1, 2024.
