

103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 HB3977

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

305 ILCS 5/5-47 new

Amends the Medical Assistance Article of the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that for purposes of preventing a potential mental health diagnosis when mental health symptoms are present and to enable early treatment, Therapy and Counseling - Brief Intervention Services (Code H0004 TF TL) shall be covered under the medical assistance program for children under 21, and for adults ages 21 and older, who are otherwise eligible for medical assistance. Provides that completion of an Integrated Assessment and Treatment Planning service shall not be required (given the short duration of services). Provides that, at a minimum, up to 8 clinical sessions not to exceed 90 minutes per session shall be permitted. Provides that such services shall be permitted to be delivered by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts; or a qualified mental health professional or mental health professional under the direction of a licensed practitioner of the healing arts. Sets forth certain billing codes that must be used when billing for therapy and counseling services. Requires the Department of Healthcare and Family Services to apply for federal approval if necessary. Grants the Department rulemaking authority. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning public aid.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by adding Section 5-47 as follows:

6 (305 ILCS 5/5-47 new)

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Sec. 5-47. Mental health prevention services for children and adults. For purposes of preventing a potential mental health diagnosis when mental health symptoms are present and to enable early treatment, Therapy and Counseling - Brief Intervention Services (Code H0004 TF TL) shall be covered under the medical assistance program for children under 21, and for adults ages 21 and older, who are otherwise eligible for medical assistance. Such services shall be deemed to be medically necessary when performed for the immediate amelioration of an individual's presenting clinical issues, meaning a mental health diagnosis is not required for such services. Completion of an Integrated Assessment and Treatment Planning service shall not be required (given the short duration of services). At a minimum, up to 8 clinical sessions not to exceed 90 minutes per session shall be permitted. Such services shall be permitted to be delivered by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts; or a qualified mental health

24	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
