

## 103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 SB0050

Introduced 1/20/2023, by Sen. Jil Tracy

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 5/234 new

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. Provides that each individual who serves as a volunteer firefighter, a volunteer EMS provider, or a volunteer emergency worker during the taxable year is entitled to a credit in an amount equal to \$1,000. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by adding Section 234 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 5/234 new)
- Sec. 234. Volunteer firefighters, volunteer EMS providers,
- 8 <u>and volunteer emergency workers.</u>
- 9 (a) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1,
- 10 <u>2024</u>, each individual who serves, for not fewer than 6 months
- 11 <u>during the taxable year, as a volunteer firefighter, a</u>
- 12 <u>volunteer EMS provider, or a volunteer emergency worker is</u>
- entitled to a credit against the taxes imposed by subsections
- 14 (a) and (b) of Section 201 in an amount equal to \$1,000.
- 15 <u>Taxpayers shall reapply for the credit on an annual basis.</u>
- (b) In no event shall a credit under this Section reduce a taxpayer's liability to less than zero.
- 18 <u>(c) As used in this Section:</u>
- "Volunteer emergency worker" has the meaning given to that
  term in the Volunteer Emergency Worker Job Protection Act.
- 21 <u>"Volunteer EMS provider" has the meaning given to that</u> 22 term in Section 1-220 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 23 "Volunteer firefighter" means a firefighter who does not

- 1 receive monetary compensation for his or her service in excess
- of the amount that qualifies the individual as a volunteer
- 3 <u>firefighter under the interpretation by the United States</u>
- 4 Department of Labor of the Fair Labor Standards Act.
- 5 (d) This Section is exempt from the provisions of Section
- 6 <u>250.</u>
- 7 (e) In order to qualify for the credit provided by this
- 8 Section, an individual must provide with the individual's tax
- 9 <u>return a written certification from the chief of the fire</u>
- 10 <u>department or an authorized official of the EMS provider</u>
- organization of which the individual is a member that (i) the
- member has served as a member of the fire department or the EMS
- provider organization for not fewer than 6 months of the
- 14 taxable year for which the tax credit is claimed and (ii) the
- individual has met all participation and training requirements
- of the fire department or the EMS provider organization for
- 17 that calendar year.
- 18 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 19 becoming law.
