1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Fire Sprinkler Contractor Licensing Act is
amended by changing Sections 10 and 17 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 317/10)

Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act, unless the
context otherwise requires:

9 "Designated certified person" means an individual who has10 met the qualifications set forth under Section 20.

"Fire protection system layout documents" means layout 11 drawings, catalog information on standard products, and other 12 construction data that provide detail on the location of 13 14 risers, cross mains, branch lines, sprinklers, piping per applicable standard, and hanger locations. "Fire protection 15 system layout documents" serve as a guide for fabrication and 16 installation of a fire sprinkler system and shall be based 17 upon applicable standards pursuant to Section 30. 18

19 "Fire sprinkler contractor" means a person who holds 20 himself or herself out to be in the business of providing 21 service for a fire sprinkler system or contracts with a person 22 to provide service for a fire sprinkler system.

"Fire sprinkler contractor license" means a license issued

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1 to a qualified fire sprinkler contractor.

2 "Fire sprinkler inspector" means an individual who is 3 qualified to perform routine inspection or testing of fire 4 sprinkler systems pursuant to Section 17 and who is employed 5 <u>or contracted</u> by a <u>single</u> fire sprinkler contractor <u>at a time</u> 6 <u>to perform fire sprinkler inspections</u>.

7 "Fire sprinkler inspector license" means a license issued8 to a qualified fire sprinkler inspector.

9 "Fire sprinkler system" means any water-based automatic 10 fire extinguishing system employing fire sprinklers, including 11 accessory fire pumps and associated piping, fire standpipes, 12 or underground fire main systems starting at the connection to 13 the water service after the approved backflow device is 14 installed under the requirements of the Illinois Plumbing Code 15 and ending at the most remote fire sprinkler. "Fire sprinkler 16 system" includes but is not limited to a fire sprinkler system 17 in a residential, commercial, institutional, educational, public, or private occupancy. "Fire sprinkler system" does not 18 include single sprinkler heads that are in a loop of the 19 20 potable water system, as referenced in 77 Ill. Adm. Code 890.1130 and 890.1200. 21

22 "Licensee" means a person or business organization 23 licensed in accordance with this Act.

24 "NICET" means the National Institute for Certification in25 Engineering Technologies.

"Office" means the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

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"Person" means an individual, group of individuals, association, trust, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, business, person doing business under an assumed name, the State of Illinois, or department thereof, any other state-owned and operated institution, or any other entity.

7 "Responsible managing employee" means the individual 8 designated by the fire sprinkler contractor that is not 9 required to have a designated certified person under Section 10 120.

11 "Routine inspection or testing" means inspection or 12 testing to verify the condition of an existing fire sprinkler 13 system at predetermined intervals in accordance with the 14 standards of the National Fire Protection Association.

"Rules" means the rules adopted pursuant to this Act.

16 "Service" means work on а fire sprinkler system, 17 including, but limited to, installation, repair, not inspection, testing, and maintenance, within the scope of this 18 19 Act.

20 "Standards" means those standards or codes referenced in 21 this Act or its rules.

"Supervision" means the direction and management by a designated certified person or responsible managing employee of the activities of non-certified personnel in the service of fire sprinkler systems.

Sec. 17. Fire sprinkler inspector license; application;
minimum qualifications for routine inspection or testing.

(a) Any individual who performs routine inspection or
testing of any fire sprinkler system under this Act shall: (i)
be employed by a <u>single</u> licensed fire sprinkler contractor <u>at</u>
<u>a time to perform fire sprinkler inspections</u>; and (ii) meet
the minimum qualifications of this Section except where the
individual is exempted by subsection (c).

Beginning January 1, 2024, any individual who performs routine inspection or testing of any fire sprinkler system under this Act shall be individually licensed and possess on his or her person a fire sprinkler inspector license including a photo identification issued by the Office.

15 A person applying for an initial fire sprinkler inspector 16 license or renewing a fire sprinkler inspector license shall 17 demonstrate to the Office proof of minimum qualifications as 18 required by subsection (b) of this Section, except where the 19 individual is exempted by subsection (c).

20 (b) Any individual who performs routine inspection or 21 testing of any fire sprinkler system under this Act shall 22 possess proof of:

(1) current certification by a nationally recognized
 certification organization, such as NICET certification in
 Inspection and Testing of Water Based Systems, at an

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appropriate level, or the equivalent; on or after the 1 2 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 102nd General assembly through December 31, 2022, an appropriate level 3 in NICET certification in Inspection and Testing of Water 4 5 Based Systems shall be level II; on and after January 1, 2023, an appropriate level in NICET certification in 6 7 Inspection and Testing of Water Based Systems shall be level III; 8

9 (2) current ASSE 15010 certification in inspection, 10 testing, and maintenance for water-based fire protection 11 systems by the American Society of Sanitary Engineering; 12 or

13 (3) satisfactory completion of a certified sprinkler
14 fitter apprenticeship program approved by the U.S.
15 Department of Labor.

16 (c) The following are exemptions to the licensing 17 requirements of this Section:

(1) State employees who perform routine inspection or testing on behalf of State institutions and who meet the requirements of subsection (b) need not be licensed under this Section or employed by a fire sprinkler contractor under this Act in order to perform routine inspection or testing duties while engaged in the performance of their official duties.

(2) The requirements of this Section do not apply to
 individuals performing inspection or testing of fire

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sprinkler systems on behalf of a municipality, a county, a
 fire department, a fire protection district, or the Office
 while engaged in the performance of their official duties.

(3) The requirements of this Section do not apply to a 4 5 stationary engineer, operating engineer, or other individual employed on a full-time basis by the facility 6 7 owner or owner's representative performing weekly and 8 monthly inspections and tests in accordance with 9 applicable standards adopted under the rules.

10 (d) Each fire sprinkler inspector shall be subject to the 11 requirements for license renewal and continuing education 12 under Section 35.

13 (e) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit an 14 individual who is licensed as a fire sprinkler inspector from 15 being employed by another employer or self-employed to perform 16 duties that would not require a fire sprinkler inspector 17 license.
