Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
11 Multi-Modal Transportation Bond Fund, and the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-
13 exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

14 ARTICLE 2

15 Section 1. "AN ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
16 103-0006, approved June 7, 2023, is amended by changing
17 Sections 2101 of Article 128 as follows:

18 (P.A. 103-0006, Article 128, Section 2101)

19 Sec. 2101. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
2 on June 30, 2023, from an appropriation heretofore made for
3 such purpose in Article 144 ~~137~~, Section 2101 of Public Act
4 102-0698 ~~102-0017~~, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
5 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
6 Opportunity for a grant to the Cup O' Joe Coffee, LLC dba
7 Veteran Roasters for costs associated with the purchase and/or
8 renovations of a facility located at 756 East 111th Street in
9 Chicago.

10 ARTICLE 3

11 Section 1. "An ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
12 103-0006, approved June 7, 2023, is amended by adding Section
13 190 of Article 129 as follows:

14 (P.A. 103-0006, Article 129, Section 190 new)

15 Section 190. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
17 Resources from the Coal Technology Development Assistance Fund
18 for the purchase of a mine rescue station.

19 ARTICLE 4

20 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 5. The sum of \$24,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans for
5 the development and improvement of education, scientific,
6 technical and vocational programs and facilities, including
7 but not limited to, the expansion of health and human
8 services for all citizens of Illinois, and for any purposes
9 authorized by subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
10 Illinois Bond Act.

11 Section 10. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may
12 be necessary, is appropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
13 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans for the
15 development and improvement of education, scientific, technical
16 and vocational programs and facilities, including but not
17 limited to the expansion of health and human services for all
18 citizens of Illinois, and for any purposes authorized in
19 subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and
20 for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including but
21 not limited to the purchase of vehicles for mobile care units,
22 including prior incurred costs.

23 Section 15. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
3 purpose of making grants and loans to foster economic
4 development and increase the employment and the well-being of
5 the citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized
6 by subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act.

7 Section 20. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary, is appropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
9 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to foster
11 economic development and increase the employment and the well-
12 being of the citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes
13 authorized by subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois
14 Bond Act.

15 Section 25. The sum of \$500,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to
18 support the development of a regional quantum information
19 science and technology (QIST) campus, and for any other
20 purposes authorized by subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build
21 Illinois Bond Act.

22 Section 30. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
3 the purpose of making grants and loans to units of local
4 government for planning, engineering, acquisition,
5 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
6 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
7 purposes authorized by subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build
8 Illinois Bond Act.

9

10 Section 35. The sum of \$40,000,000, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
13 purpose of making grants and loans to foster economic
14 development and increase the employment and the well-being of
15 the citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized
16 by subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act.

17 Section 40. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
18 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
19 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
20 been approved in writing by the Governor.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as may
2 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 128, Section 5 of Public Act 103-0006,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a grant
7 to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
8 improvements, including prior incurred costs.

9 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 128, Section 10 of Public Act 103-0006,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
16 including prior incurred costs.

17 Section 15. The sum of \$3,500,001, or so much thereof as may
18 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
19 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
20 such purpose in Article 128, Section 15 of Public Act 103-0006,
21 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
23 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,

1 including prior incurred costs.

2 Section 25. The sum of \$2, or so much thereof as may be
3 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
4 June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
5 purpose in Article 128, Section 25 of Public Act 103-0006, as
6 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
8 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park, including
9 prior incurred costs.

10 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 128, Section 30 of Public Act 103-0006,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
17 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act, including prior
18 incurred costs.

19 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 128, Section 40 of Public Act 103-0006,

1 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
2 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
3 grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
4 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
5 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, and
6 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
7 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
8 agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

9 Section 50. The sum of \$20,561,938, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 128, Section 50 of Public Act 103-0006,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
16 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
17 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
18 such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

19 Section 55. The sum of \$8,210,864, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 128, Section 55 of Public Act 103-0006,
23 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
3 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
4 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
5 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
6 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
7 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
8 prior incurred costs.

9 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
11 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
12 such purpose in Article 128, Section 60 of Public Act 103-0006,
13 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
16 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
17 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
18 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
19 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
20 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
21 prior incurred costs.

22 Section 65. The sum of \$64,064, or so much thereof as may be
23 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on

1 June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
2 purpose in Article 128, Section 65 of Public Act 103-0006, as
3 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
5 grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts,
6 including prior incurred costs.

7 Section 71. The sum of \$351,271,429, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 128, Section 71 of Public Act 103-0006,
11 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
13 purpose of making grants and loans to foster economic
14 development and increase employment and the well-being of the
15 citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
16 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and
17 for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including prior
18 incurred costs.

19 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 128, Section 75 of Public Act 103-0006,
23 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
3 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
4 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
5 distance learning, and public safety, including prior incurred
6 costs.

7 Section 80. The sum of \$10,071,340, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 128, Section 80 of Public Act 103-0006,
11 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
14 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
15 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
16 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
17 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
18 machinery and equipment, including prior incurred costs.

19 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
21 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
22 such purpose in Article 128, Section 90 of Public Act 103-0006,
23 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
2 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
3 hospital renovation and equipment, including prior incurred
4 costs.

5 Section 95. The sum of \$1,859,597, or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
7 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
8 such purpose in Article 128, Section 95 of Public Act 103-0006,
9 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
10 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
11 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
12 including prior incurred costs.

13 Section 100. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as may
14 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
15 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
16 such purpose in Article 128, Section 100 of Public Act 103-
17 0006, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
18 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants for acquisition, construction,
20 renovation and equipping new charter schools, to a silver
21 certification from the United States Green Building Council's
22 Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green Building
23 Rating System as approximated below: For Instituto Del

1 Progresso Latino, including
 2 prior incurred costs9,000,000

3 Section 105. The sum of \$1,160,712, or so much thereof as may
 4 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
 5 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
 6 such purpose in Article 128, Section 105 of Public Act 103-
 7 0006, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
 8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 9 Opportunity to provide grants, loans, and other investments to
 10 emerging technology enterprises to support and encourage: (i)
 11 commercialization of technology based products and services;
 12 (ii) technology transfer projects involving the promotion of
 13 new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research and
 14 development projects to respond to unique, advanced technology
 15 projects and which foster the development of Illinois' economy
 16 through the advancement of the State's economic, scientific,

6 Section 115. The sum of \$473,154, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2024, from a reappropriation heretofore made for

10 0006, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
11 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for a grant to the University of Chicago Medical

15 Section 125. The sum of \$8,029,808, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

7 Section 185. The sum of \$10,041,536, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2024, from appropriations heretofore made for such
10 purpose in Article 128, Section 185 of Public Act 103-0006, as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
14 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
15 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

16 Section 190. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as may
17 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

6 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

22 0006, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
23 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
24 Opportunity to provide grants for land acquisition,

1 infrastructure, equipment and other permissible capital
2 expenditures to businesses that will encourage new investment
3 and the creation or retention of jobs in economically depressed
4 areas of the State, including prior incurred costs.

5 Section 216. The sum of \$15,430,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
