Introduced 2/28/2024, by Sen. Elgie R. Sims, Jr.

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates \$30,081,200 from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board of Elections for operational expenses, grants, and reimbursements for the 2025 fiscal year. Appropriates \$4,954,000 from the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund to the State Board of Elections for its ordinary and contingent expenses. Appropriates \$14,095,700 from the Help Illinois Vote Fund to the State Board of Elections for implementation of the Help America Vote Act of 2002. Effective July 1, 2024.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. In addition to other sums appropriated, the sum
5 of \$30,081,200, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
6 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board
7 of Elections for operational expenses, grants, and
8 reimbursements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

9 Section 10. The following amounts, or so much of those
10 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
11 from the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund to the State
12 Board of Elections for its ordinary and contingent expenses as
13 follows:

14 For reimbursement to counties for increased
15 compensation for judges and other election
16 officials, as provided in Public Acts 81-850,
17 81-1149, 90-672, and 103-0008 - Election Day
18 Judges only\$4,200,000

19 For payment of lump sum awards to
20 county clerks, county recorders, and

1 chief election clerks as a compensation
 2 for additional duties required of
 3 such officials by consolidation of
 4 elections laws, as provided in Public Acts
 5 82-691 and 90-713\$754,000
 6 Total \$4,954,000

7 Section 15. The following amounts, or so much thereof as
 8 may be necessary, are appropriated from the Help Illinois Vote
 9 Fund to the State Board of Elections for implementation of the
 10 Help America Vote Act of 2002:

11 For the maintenance of the statewide
 12 voter registration system, as required
 13 by Section 1A-25 of the Election
 14 Code, including administrative and
 15 programmatic costs associated with
 16 voter registration activities\$1,036,100

17 For administrative costs and discretionary
 18 grants to local election authorities
 19 under the HAVA Election Security Grant\$13,059,600
 20 Total \$14,095,700

21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
