1 SENATE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, On March 31, 2023, President Joseph R. Biden 2 3 proclaimed April 2023 as Second Chance Month and called upon 4 all government officials, educators, volunteers, and all the 5 people of the United States to observe the month with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities; and 6 7 WHEREAS, A criminal record can prevent individuals from 8 landing a steady job, a safe place to live, quality health 9 care, or the chance to go to back school; and 10 WHEREAS, A criminal record can keep someone from ever 11 getting a loan to buy a home, start a business, or build a 12 future; and 13 WHEREAS, A criminal record can bar an individual from 14 voting; and 15 WHEREAS, Three-quarters of formerly incarcerated people 16 remain unemployed a year after their release, and joblessness 17 is a top predictor of recidivism; and 18 WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Justice's Office of 19 Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance and Office of 20 Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention are supporting

- 2 agencies across the country recognize the importance of
- 3 reentry and their role in supporting safe and successful
