2016; and

WHEREAS, Jack Poppenhager was preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Roger Poppenhager; and

WHEREAS, Jack Poppenhager is survived by his wife; his nieces and nephews, Lyn Pedigo, Amy (Tom) Ingles, and Jim (Trina) Poppenhager; and several great-nieces and great-nephews; therefore, be it
