WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to learn of the death of Bruce Alexander Campbell II of Tucson, Arizona, formerly of Springfield, who passed away on March 7,

WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell was born to Joseph Bruce and Ruth
Norcom Campbell in Chicago on October 19, 1929; he and his
family moved to Nashville, Illinois in 1933; he graduated from
Western Military Academy in Alton and the University of
Illinois in 1951, where he served as president of Sigma Alpha
Epsilon and belonged to the honorary journalism fraternity,
Sigma Delta Chi; he served in the U.S. Army until June 1953 and

was stationed in Korea for one year; he married Alice Jean

14 Keller in Paris, Illinois on July 25, 1953; and

WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell began his career at General American Life Insurance Company in St. Louis in 1953, transferring to the Chicago office after one year; he joined Illinois Bell Telephone Company in Peoria in 1955, later working in the Chicago, New York, and Springfield offices; he created Illinois Bell's economic development organization in 1978, which was adopted by most of its companies across the country; he retired as director of economic development from Illinois Bell, then known as Ameritech, with offices in

1 Springfield and Chicago; and

WHEREAS, During his career, Bruce Campbell led several business organizations, including the Sangamon County Economic Council, the Illinois Development Council, and the Mid America Economic Council; he also served as a member of the private sector board to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, and he belonged to the Belleville Elks Lodge, the Sangamo Club, and Illini Country Club; and

WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell and his family resided Springfield for 30-plus years, where he was very active in community affairs, including serving as president of the Springfield Boys and Girls Clubs, the Sangamon University Foundation, and the Sangamon County University of Illinois Alumni Association; he founded and was the first president of the Central Illinois Public Relations Society, and he served as the public relations director of the 1973 and 1982 United Way of Sangamon County campaigns; he served on the board of directors of the Springfield Library, the Springfield Symphony Orchestra, Memorial Medical Center, the Dana Thomas House Foundation, and the University of Illinois National Alumni Association; he was a member of the American Business Club, the Capitol Bicentennial Commission, and Westminster Presbyterian Church, where he served as both a deacon and an elder; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell loved history, traveling, and spending time with family and friends; he researched, wrote, 2 3 and published Sangamon Saga, a 365-page hardcover pictorial 4 history of Sangamon County; he also researched and recorded 5 his family genealogy, and he chronicled his many journeys across the globe; he enjoyed entertaining, maintaining 6 lifelong friendships, and making new friends; he especially 7 enjoyed vacationing with his family in San Diego, California, 8 9 Old Mission, Michigan, and Mexico; and
- 10 WHEREAS, After retirement, Bruce Campbell and his wife, 11 Alice, split their time between Springfield and Tucson, later making Tucson their permanent home; while there, he became an 12 active volunteer at both Tucson Memorial Center and Northwest 13 14 Hospital, and he was a member of St. Michael Episcopal Church 15 and Skyline Country Club; and
- WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell was preceded in death by his son, 16 17 Bruce A. Campbell III; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Bruce Campbell is survived by his wife; his 19 children, Cynthia (Morris) McWilliams, Craig Campbell, and Tom Campbell; his daughter-in-law, Jean; and his grandchildren, 20 21 Allison McWilliams, Melissa Campbell, Andrew Campbell, and 22 Michael Campbell; therefore, be it
