Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
changing Section 11-907 as follows:

8 Sec. 11-907. Operation of vehicles and streetcars on 9 approach of authorized emergency vehicles.

10 (a) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized 11 emergency vehicle making use of audible and visual signals 12 meeting the requirements of this Code or a police vehicle 13 properly and lawfully making use of an audible or visual 14 signal,

15 (1) the driver of every other vehicle shall yield 16 the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the 17 18 right-hand edge or curb of the highway clear of any intersection and shall, if necessary to permit the safe 19 20 passage of the emergency vehicle, stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency vehicle has 21 22 passed, unless otherwise directed by a police officer and

(2) the operator of every streetcar shall
immediately stop such car clear of any intersection and
keep it in such position until the authorized emergency
vehicle has passed, unless otherwise directed by a police
officer.

(b) This Section shall not operate to relieve the driver
of an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive
with due regard for the safety of all persons using the
highway.

1 (c) Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency 2 vehicle, when the authorized emergency vehicle is giving a 3 signal by displaying alternately flashing red, red and white, 4 blue, or red and blue lights or amber or yellow warning 5 lights, a person who drives an approaching vehicle shall:

6 (1) proceeding with due caution, yield the 7 right-of-way by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to that of the authorized emergency vehicle, if 8 9 possible with due regard to safety and traffic conditions, if on a highway having at least 4 lanes with 10 11 not less than 2 lanes proceeding in the same direction as 12 the approaching vehicle; or

13 (2) proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed 14 of the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road 15 conditions, if changing lanes would be impossible or 16 unsafe.

As used in this subsection (c), "authorized emergency vehicle" includes any vehicle authorized by law to be equipped with oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights under Section 12-215 of this Code, while the owner or operator of the vehicle is engaged in his or her official duties.

(d) A person who violates subsection (c) of this Section
commits a business offense punishable by a fine of not <u>less</u>
than \$100 or more than \$10,000. It is a factor in
aggravation if the person committed the offense while in
violation of Section 11-501 of this Code.

(e) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section results in damage to the property of another person, in addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be suspended for a fixed period of not less than 90 days and not more than one year.

32 (f) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section 33 results in injury to another person, in addition to any other 34 penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be

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1 suspended for a fixed period of not less than 180 days and 2 not more than 2 years.

(g) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section 3 4 results in the death of another person, in addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall 5 б be suspended for 2 years.

7 The Secretary of State shall, upon receiving a (h) 8 record of a judgment entered against a person under 9 subsection (c) of this Section:

(1) suspend the person's driving privileges for the 10 11 mandatory period; or

(2) extend the period of an existing suspension by 12 13 the appropriate mandatory period. (Source: P.A. 92-283, eff. 1-1-02.)

18 (a) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized 19 emergency vehicle making use of audible and visual signals meeting the requirements of this Code or a police vehicle 20 21 properly and lawfully making use of an audible or visual 22 signal,

23 (1) the driver of every other vehicle shall yield right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a 24 the 25 position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand edge or curb of the highway clear of any 26 intersection and shall, if necessary to permit the safe 27 28 passage of the emergency vehicle, stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency vehicle has 29 passed, unless otherwise directed by a police officer and 30 operator of every streetcar 31 (2) the shall 32 immediately stop such car clear of any intersection and 33 keep it in such position until the authorized emergency vehicle has passed, unless otherwise directed by a police 34

officer.

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2 (b) This Section shall not operate to relieve the driver 3 of an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive 4 with due regard for the safety of all persons using the 5 highway.

6 (c) Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency 7 vehicle, when the authorized emergency vehicle is giving a 8 signal by displaying alternately flashing red, red and white, 9 blue, or red and blue lights or amber or yellow warning 10 lights, a person who drives an approaching vehicle shall:

11 (1) proceeding with due caution, yield the right-of-way by making a lane change into a lane not 12 adjacent to that of the authorized emergency vehicle, if 13 possible with due regard to safety and 14 traffic 15 conditions, if on a highway having at least 4 lanes with 16 not less than 2 lanes proceeding in the same direction as the approaching vehicle; or 17

18 (2) proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed
19 of the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road
20 conditions, if changing lanes would be impossible or
21 unsafe.

As used in this subsection (c), "authorized emergency vehicle" includes any vehicle authorized by law to be equipped with oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights under Section 12-215 of this Code, while the owner or operator of the vehicle is engaged in his or her official duties.

(d) A person who violates subsection (c) of this Section
commits a business offense punishable by a fine of not <u>less</u>
than \$100 or more than \$10,000. A person charged with the
offense must appear in court to answer the charges. It is a
factor in aggravation if the person committed the offense
while in violation of Section 11-501 of this Code.

33 (e) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section34 results in damage to the property of another person, in

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1 addition to any other penalty imposed, the person's driving 2 privileges shall be suspended for a fixed period of not less than 90 days and not more than one year. 3

4 (f) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section 5 results in injury to another person, in addition to any other 6 penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be 7 suspended for a fixed period of not less than 180 days and not more than 2 years. 8

9 (g) If a violation of subsection (c) of this Section results in the death of another person, in addition to any 10 11 other penalty imposed, the person's driving privileges shall be suspended for 2 years. 12

(h) The Secretary of State shall, upon receiving a 13 record of a judgment entered against a person under 14 subsection (c) of this Section: 15

16 (1) suspend the person's driving privileges for the 17 mandatory period; or

extend the period of an existing suspension by 18 (2) 19 the appropriate mandatory period.
