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AN ACT concerning professional regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Pharmacy Practice Act of 1987 is amended
by changing Section 16 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 85/16) (from Ch. 111, par. 4136)

(Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2008) 7 8 Sec. 16. The Department shall require and provide for the licensure of every pharmacy doing business in this State. 9 Such licensure shall expire 30 10 days after the pharmacist 10 in charge dies or leaves the place where the pharmacy is 11 12 licensed or after such pharmacist's license has been 13 suspended or revoked.

In the event the designated pharmacist in charge dies or otherwise ceases to function in that capacity, or when the license of the pharmacist in charge has been suspended or revoked, the owner of the pharmacy shall be required to notify the Department, on forms provided by the Department, of the identity of the new pharmacist in charge.

20 It is the duty of every pharmacist in charge who ceases function in that capacity to report to the Department 21 to 22 within 30 10 days of the date on which he ceased such functions for such pharmacy. It is the duty of every owner 23 of a pharmacy licensed under this Act to report to the 24 Department within 30 10 days of the date on which the 25 pharmacist in charge died or ceased to function in that 26 27 capacity. Failure to provide such notification to the Department shall be grounds for disciplinary action. 28

No license shall be issued to any pharmacy unless such pharmacy has a pharmacist in charge and each such pharmacy license shall indicate on the face thereof the pharmacist in
