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AN ACT concerning public utilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Public Utilities Act is amended by
changing Section 5-109 as follows:

6 (220 ILCS 5/5-109) (from Ch. 111 2/3, par. 5-109)

Sec. 5-109. Each public utility in the State, other than 7 8 a commercial mobile radio service provider, shall each year furnish to the Commission, in such form as the Commission 9 shall require, annual reports as to all the items mentioned 10 in the preceding Sections of this Article, and in addition 11 such other items, whether of a nature similar to those 12 13 therein enumerated or otherwise, as the Commission may Such annual reports shall contain all 14 prescribe. the required information for the period of 12 to--twelve months 15 ending on the thirtieth day of June in each year, or ending 16 on the thirty-first day of December in each year, as the 17 18 Commission may by order prescribe for each class of public 19 utilities, except commercial mobile radio service providers, and shall be filed with the Commission at its office in 20 Springfield within 3 three months after the close of the year 21 22 for which the report is made. The Commission shall have authority to require any public utility to file monthly 23 reports of earnings and expenses of such utility, and to file 24 other periodical or special, or both periodical and special 25 26 reports concerning any matter about which the Commission is 27 authorized by law to keep itself informed. All reports shall be under oath. 28

When any report is erroneous or defective or appears to the Commission to be erroneous or defective, the Commission may notify the public utility to amend such report within <u>30</u> thirty days, and before or after the termination of such period the Commission may examine the officers, agents, or employees, and books, records, accounts, vouchers, plant, equipment and property of such public utility, and correct such items in the report as upon such examination the Commission may find defective or erroneous.

All reports made to the Commission by any public utility
and the contents thereof shall be open to public inspection,
unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. Such reports
shall be preserved in the office of the Commission.

11 Any public utility which fails to make and file any report called for by the Commission within the time 12 specified; or to make specific answer to any question 13 propounded by the Commission within 30 thirty days from the 14 time it is lawfully required to do so, or within such further 15 16 time, not to exceed 90 ninety days, as may in its discretion be allowed by the Commission, shall forfeit up to \$100 for 17 each and every day it may so be in default if the utility 18 19 collects less than \$100,000 annually in gross revenue; and if the utility collects \$100,000 or more annually in gross 20 revenue, it shall forfeit \$100 per day for each and every day 21 22 it is in default.

Any person who wilfully makes any false return or report to the Commission, or to any member, officer or employee thereof, and any person who aids or abets such person shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
