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AN ACT concerning the regulation of electricians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Electrician Licensing Act.

б Section 5. Purpose and policy. Improper electrical wiring can adversely affect the well being of the public by 7 8 causing fires due to short circuits and overloading of protection devices. Faulty wiring is potentially lethal and 9 widespread fires with disastrous consequences 10 can cause to persons and property. To protect the health of the public, 11 it is essential that electrical wiring 12 be installed bv 13 contractors who are registered with the state and passed all applicable state standards. 14

15 Consistent with its duty to safeguard the health of the 16 people of this State, the General Assembly declares that the 17 planning, inspecting, installing, altering, extending, 18 repairing, and maintaining of electrical wiring systems shall 19 be performed by entities demonstrating levels of proven 20 skill. Further, the General Assembly declares that a guide for minimum control of electrical materials and equipment, 21 22 the design of electrical systems, and the construction and installation methods of electrical systems is essential for 23 the protection of public health. In order to insure proper 24 electrical wiring practice, this Act provides for the 25 26 licensing of electrical contractors and supervising 27 electricians and for the adoption of the National Electrical Code (NFPA70) as standards by the Department. This Act is 28 therefore declared to be essential to the public interest. 29

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Section 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Board" means the Illinois State Electrical Licensing
 Advisory Board.

3 "Department" means the Illinois Department of4 Professional Regulation.

5 "Director" means the Director of the Illinois Department6 of Professional Regulation.

"Electrical contractor" means a 7 person, firm, or 8 corporation operating a business that undertakes or offers to 9 undertake to plan for, lay out, supervise, or install or to make additions, alterations, maintenance, or repairs in the 10 11 installation of wiring, apparatus, or equipment for electric light, heat, or power with or without compensation and who is 12 licensed as an electrical contractor by the Department of 13 Professional Regulation. An electrical contractor's license 14 does not of itself qualify its holder to perform the 15 16 electrical work. The term electrical contractor does not include employees employed by such contractor to do or 17 18 supervise such work.

19 "Governmental unit" means a city, village, incorporated 20 town, or county.

21 "Owner" means a natural person who physically performs 22 electrical work on premises the person owns and actually 23 occupies as a single family residence or owns as a single 24 family residence upon completion of construction.

25 "Supervising Electrician" means an individual not less than twenty-one years of age with at least three years of 26 experience in the installation, alteration, repair, and 27 maintenance of electrical wires, equipment, and apparatus, or 28 29 an experience equivalent thereto and having passed an exam 30 provided by the Department that sufficiently indicates the individual has knowledge and technical training to perform 31 32 the work or to supervise the installation, alteration, repair and maintenance of electrical wires, equipment, and 33 34 apparatus.

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Section 15. Electrical Licensing Advisory Board.

2 (a) There is created the Electrical Licensing Advisory 3 Board that shall exercise its duties provided in this Act 4 under the supervision of the Department. The Board shall 5 consist of an executive director, who serves as an ex 6 officio member, and 11 members appointed by the governor 7 subject to the advice and consent of the Senate. The Board 8 shall be composed of the following members:

9 (1) one member must be the chief electrical 10 inspector of a municipality with a population of not less 11 than 150,000, according to the most recent federal 12 census, selected from a list of names submitted by a 13 statewide association of municipal governments;

14 (2) one member must be a building code official of a 15 municipality with a population of less than 150,000, 16 according to the most recent federal census, selected 17 from a list of names submitted by a statewide association 18 of municipal governments;

19 (3) one member must be a supervising electrician 20 selected from a list of names submitted by the 21 Homebuilders Association of Illinois;

(4) one member must be an electrical contractor
selected from a list of names submitted by the Associated
Builders & Contractors, Northern Illinois Chapter;

(5) one member must be a supervising electrician
selected from a list of names submitted by the Illinois
State Association of Electrical Workers of the
International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers;

29 (6) one member must be an electrical contractor
30 selected from a list of names submitted by the National
31 Electrical Contractors Association, Northeastern Illinois
32 Chapter;

33 (7) one member must be a training director selected34 from a list of names submitted by the Illinois State

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1 Association of Electrical Workers of the International 2 Brotherhood of Electrical Workers;

(8) one member must be a training director selected 3 4 from an Illinois building and contractors association; 5 (9) one member must be a licensed electrical

engineer; 6

(10) the State Fire Marshal; and

(11) the Director of the Department of Professional 8 9 Regulation.

Members of the Board shall serve 4 year terms and until 10 11 their successors are appointed and qualified. The initial appointments, however, shall be as follows: 3 members for 12 terms of 2 years, 3 members for 3 years, and 2 members for 4 13 years. The State Fire Marshal's service on the Board shall be 14 15 continuous. Board members shall receive no compensation but 16 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in connection with their duties as Board members. 17

18 (b) The Director shall serve as the presiding officer of 19 the Board.

(c) A majority constitutes a quorum for the transaction 20 21 of business and Roberts Rules of Order shall be the rules by 22 which the Board's actions shall be conducted.

23 (d) The Board shall aid the Director and the Department 24 by:

25 (1) suggesting rules to govern examinations and 26 hearing for suspension, revocation, or reinstatement of 27 licenses;

(2) submitting recommendations to the Director from 28 time to time for the efficient administration of this 29 30 Act; and

(3) performing other duties from time to time 31 as prescribed by the Director. 32

33 Section 20. Powers and duties of the Director. The

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1 Director shall:

2 (a) prepare forms for application for electrical
3 contractor and supervising electrician licenses and for
4 examination for supervising electrician licenses;

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(b) prepare and issue licenses as provided in this Act;

6 (c) with the aid of the Board, prescribe rules for the 7 examination of applicants for supervising electrician 8 licenses;

9 (d) with the aid of the Board, prepare and give uniform and comprehensive examinations to applicants for supervisory 10 electrician licenses that shall test their knowledge and 11 qualifications in the planning and design of electrical 12 systems, their knowledge, qualifications, and manual skills 13 in electrical installations, and their knowledge of the 14 National Electrical Code relating to materials, design, and 15 16 installation of methods of electrical systems;

17 (e) issue electrical contractor and supervising 18 electrician licenses and license renewals to every applicant 19 who has passed the examination and who has paid the required 20 license and renewal fee;

(f) prescribe rules for hearings to deny, suspend,
revoke, or reinstate licenses as provided in this Act;

23 (g) establish and collect fees for the examination,
24 issuance, and renewal of licenses; and

(h) formulate and publish rules necessary or appropriateto carrying out the provisions of this Act.

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Section 25. Licenses.

(a) Electrical Contractor. Except as otherwise provided
by law, no person shall plan, install, repair, maintain, lay
out, or supervise the installation of wiring, apparatus, or
equipment for electrical light, heat, power, or other
purposes unless the person:

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(1) is licensed by the Department as an electrical

contractor;

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2 (2) provides the Department a bond to the State in the penal sum of \$5,000 conditioned upon the faithful and 3 4 lawful performance of all work entered into by the electrical contractor within the State of Illinois. The 5 bond shall be for the benefit of persons injured or 6 loss by reason of failure of 7 suffering financial performance. The bond shall be filed with the Department 8 9 and shall be in lieu of all other license bonds to any political subdivision. The bond shall be written by a 10 11 corporate surety licensed to do business in the State of Illinois; 12

13 (3) files with the Department а certificate evidencing in effect general liability insurance, that 14 15 includes premises and operations insurance and products 16 and completed operations insurance, with limits of at least \$100,000 per occurrence, \$300,000 aggregate limit 17 bodily injury, and property damage insurance with 18 for 19 limits of at least \$25,000 or a policy with a single limit for bodily injury and property damage of \$300,000 20 21 per occurrence and \$300,000 aggregate limits. The insurance shall be written by an insurer licensed to do 22 23 business in the State of Illinois and shall provide that the insurance shall not be cancelled without the insurer 24 25 first giving 15 days written notice to the Department of the cancellation; and 26

27 (4) has appointed or employed licensed а supervising electrician responsible for the performance 28 29 of all electrical work in accordance with the 30 requirements of this Act. The application for an electrical contractor's license must include a verified 31 statement that the designated responsible supervising 32 electrician is an individual who is not employed in any 33 34 capacity as a licensed supervising electrician by any 1

other electrical contractor.

2 (b) Supervising Electrician. Except as otherwise provided by law, no person shall wire for, plan, install, 3 4 maintain, lay out, or supervise the installation of wiring, apparatus, or equipment for electric light, heat, or power, 5 6 unless the person is licensed by the Department as a 7 supervising electrician employed or appointed by a licensed 8 electrical contractor.

9 An applicant for a supervising electrician's license shall have had at least 2 years of experience, acceptable to 10 11 the Department, in wiring for, installing, and repairing electrical wiring, apparatus, or equipment. The Department, 12 however, may by rule provide for the allowance of one year of 13 experience credit for successful completion of a 2 year post 14 15 high school electrical course approved by the Department.

16 Section 30. Examination. addition In to other 17 requirements imposed by this Act and except as otherwise 18 provided in this Act, as a precondition to issuance of a supervising electrician's license, each applicant must pass a 19 20 written examination given by the Department. The exam shall test their knowledge and qualifications in the planning and 21 22 design of electrical systems, their knowledge, manual skills 23 qualifications, and in electrical 24 installations, and their knowledge of the National Electrical 25 Code relating to materials, design, and installation of methods of electrical systems. Any licensee failing to renew 26 27 his or her license for 2 years or more after its expiration 28 shall be required to retake the examination before he or she 29 is issued a new license.

30 Section 35. Experience requirements.

31 Except as otherwise provided for a supervising (a) 32 electrician's license under Section 25, an applicant for a 1 supervising electrician's license shall meet the experience 2 requirements of this Section before examination for 3 licensure.

4 (b) The maximum allowable credit for electrical 5 experience:

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before age 18 is 6 months;

7 8 (2) in the military service is 12 months;

(3) in foreign countries is 12 months; and

9 (4) acquired during the school term of an approved 10 post high school electrical course is 12 months.

11 (C) Experience in the categories of planning for the installation of wiring, apparatus, and equipment for 12 light, heat, and power; laying out for the installation of wiring, 13 apparatus, and equipment for light, heat, 14 and power; installation of wiring, apparatus, 15 supervising the and 16 equipment for light, heat, and power; and wiring and installation of electrical wiring, apparatus, and equipment 17 18 for light, heat, and power is acceptable to the Board in the 19 following situations:

20 (1) experience while in the employ of an electrical
21 contractor licensed under this Act;

(2) experience while working in Illinois for an
employer who is not required to be licensed as an
electrical contractor, if the work is inspected and done
under the supervision of a properly licensed electrician;

(3) experience while performing electrical work in 26 Illinois for an employer who is exempt from licensing 27 when the work is exempt from inspection or when the work 28 is performed on federal property by a federal employee, 29 30 if the Department has determined in either situation that the experience is substantially equal to that acquired in 31 32 performing work while in the employ of a licensed electrical contractor; 33

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(4) experience while performing electrical work

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outside of Illinois, which the Department has determined is substantially equivalent to the work performed while in the employ of a licensed electrical contractor in Illinois. This determination must be based on a certification by the employer for the type of work performed.

7 Military exemption. The Department shall Section 40. 8 reinstate a supervising electrician license that expires while a licensee is in active Military Service of the United 9 10 States upon application to the Department by the licensee within 2 years after termination of the military service, 11 payment of the annual license fee, and submission of evidence 12 of the military service. The license shall be reinstated 13 14 without examination and without payment of the lapsed renewal 15 fee.

16 Section 45. License and renewal fees.

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17 (a) All licenses issued under this Act shall expire18 annually in a manner as provided by the Department.

19 (b) The Department shall provide for fees by rule;20 however, the fees shall not exceed the following amounts:

21 (1) the application fee for a license or temporary
22 license, \$100;

(2) the fee for renewal of a license, \$25;

(3) the fee for reinstatement of a license that has
been expired for less than 2 years, \$50 plus payment of
all unpaid renewal fees;

27 (4) the fee for restoration of a license that has
28 been expired for more than 2 years, \$100;

(5) the fee for issuance of a duplicate license,
the issuance of a replacement that has been lost or
destroyed, or the issuance of a license with a change of
name and address, other than during the renewal period,

1 \$25;

2 (6) the fee for certification of a licensee's
3 record for any purpose, \$25;

4 (7) the fee for rescoring of an examination, the 5 cost to the Department of rescoring the examination plus 6 any fees charged by the applicable testing service to 7 have the examination rescored;

8 (8) the fee for copies of a license, the actual
9 cost of producing the copies;

10 (9) the fee for a roster of supervising 11 electricians, the actual cost of producing the roster;

12 (10) the fee for application for a license by an 13 electrician registered or licensed under the laws of 14 another state, \$100.

15 Section 50. Unlicensed practice; civil penalty.

(a) Any person who practices, offers to practice, 16 17 attempts to practice, or holds oneself out to practice as an 18 electrical contractor or supervising electrician without being licensed under this Act shall, in addition to any other 19 20 penalty provided by law, pay a civil penalty to the Department in an amount not to exceed \$25,000 for each 21 22 offense as determined by the Department. The civil penalty shall be assessed by Director after a hearing is held in 23 24 accordance with the provisions set forth in this Act regarding the provision of a hearing for the discipline of a 25 license. 26

(b) The Department has the authority and power toinvestigate any and all unlicensed activity.

(c) The civil penalty shall be paid within 60 days after the effective date of the order imposing the civil penalty. The order shall constitute a judgement and may be filed and execution had thereon in the same manner from any court of record.

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1 (d) The commission of a single act prohibited by this Act 2 or prohibited by the rules promulgated under this Act or a 3 violation of a disciplinary order issued under this Act 4 constitutes a violation of this Act.

5 Section 55. Denial, suspension, and revocation of б licenses. The Department may by order refuse to issue or 7 renew a license, may place on probation, suspend, or revoke any license, or may censure, reprimand, or 8 otherwise discipline or impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$25,000 9 10 upon any licensee hereunder for one or any combination of the following: 11

12 (a) when the applicant or licensee has, by false or 13 fraudulent representation, obtained or sought to obtain a 14 license;

(b) when the applicant or licensee has been convicted of any crime, an essential element of which is dishonesty or fraud or larceny, embezzlement, or obtaining money, property, or credit by false pretenses or by means of a confidence game, has been convicted in this or another state of a crime that is a felony under the laws of this State or has been convicted of a felony in a federal court.

The Department may adopt rules further specifying and defining actions and omissions that constitute fraudulent, deceptive, or dishonest practices, and establishing standards of conduct for licensees.

26 Section 60. Grounds for suspension of license. The 27 Department may temporarily suspend a license and call for a 28 hearing when findings show one or more of the following:

(a) That the licensee obtained or conspired with others
to obtain a license by inducing the issuance of the license
in consideration of the payment of money or delivery of any
other thing of value or by and through misrepresentation of

1 facts.

2 (b) That the licensee knowingly and willfully violated 3 any law of this State or any rules, regulation, or code 4 regulating electrical wiring installations, or licensed 5 electricians.

6 (c) That the licensee has been found guilty in a court 7 of law of negligence or incompetence in the performance of 8 installation of electrical wiring and the Department after a 9 hearing determines that the licensee poses a danger to the 10 public safety.

(d) That the licensee has loaned or in any manner transferred his or her license to another person. If a license is suspended or revoked, the license shall be surrendered to the Department but it shall be returned to the licensee upon the termination of the suspension period.

16 Section 65. Continuation of business by estates. Upon the 17 death of a supervising electrician who is an electrical 18 contractor, the Department may permit the decedent's representative to carry on the business of the decedent for a 19 20 period not in excess of 6 months, for the purpose of 21 completing work under contract or otherwise to comply with 22 this Act. The decedent's representative may petition the Board for an extension of the 6 month period in the event he 23 24 or she can demonstrate undue hardship or other special 25 circumstances. The extension may be granted at the recommendation of the Board, subject to Department approval. 26 27 The representative shall give any bond as the Department may require conditioned upon the faithful and lawful performance 28 29 of the work. The bond shall be for the benefit of persons injured or suffering financial loss by reason of failure of 30 31 performance. The bond shall be written by a corporate surety licensed to do business in the State of Illinois. The 32 33 decedent's representative shall also comply with all public liability and property damage insurance requirements imposed
 by this Act upon a licensed electrical contractor.

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Section 70. Exemptions from licensing.

(a) Employees of, or independent contractors performing 4 5 work for, any electric utility or electric utility affiliate, or communications or railway utility or any electric system 6 7 owned and operated by a governmental unit (notwithstanding any other provision of this Act), electric cooperative as 8 defined in Section 3.4 of the Electric Supplier Act, 9 10 telephone or telecommunications cooperative as defined in Section 13-212 of the Public Utilities Act, or a telephone 11 company shall not be required to hold a license under any of 12 the following conditions: 13

14 (1) While performing work on installations, 15 materials, or equipment that are owned or leased, operated, and maintained by the electric utility or 16 17 electric utility affiliate, communications or railway utility, electric system owned and operated 18 by a municipal corporation or unit of local government, 19 20 electric, telephone, or telecommunications cooperative, 21 or telephone company in the exercise of its utility or telephone function, and that (i) are used exclusively for 22 transformation, 23 generation, distribution, the 24 transmission, or metering of electric current, or the 25 operation of railway signals, or the transmission of intelligence and do not have as a principal function the 26 consumption or use of electric current by or for the 27 28 benefit of any person other than the electric utility or 29 electric utility affiliate, communications or railway utility, electric system owned and operated 30 by а municipal corporation or unit of local government, 31 electric, telephone, or telecommunications cooperative, 32 or telephone company and (ii) are generally accessible 33

1 only to employees of the electric utility or electric 2 utility affiliate, communications or railway utility, electric system owned and operated by a municipal 3 4 corporation or unit of local government, electric, telecommunications cooperative, 5 telephone, or or telephone company or persons acting under its control or 6 7 direction.

8 (2) While performing work on installations, 9 materials, or equipment that are a part of the street 10 lighting operations of the utility.

11 (3) While installing or performing work on outdoor 12 area lights that are directly connected to a utility's 13 distribution system and located upon the utility's 14 distribution poles, and are generally accessible only to 15 employees of the utility or persons acting under its 16 control or direction.

(b) Any city, village, or incorporated town having a 17 population of 500,000 or more may, by an ordinance containing 18 19 provisions substantially the same as those in this Act and specifying educational or experience requirements equivalent 20 21 to those prescribed in the Act, provide for a board of 22 electrical examiners to conduct examinations for, and to 23 suspend, or revoke, electricians' licenses within the issue, city, village, or incorporated town. Upon the enactment of 24 25 such an ordinance, the provisions of this Act shall not apply within that municipality except as otherwise provided in this 26 Act. Any person licensed as an electrical contractor by the 27 Department under this Act, may engage in electrical wiring 28 installation anywhere in this State. 29

30 (c) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent 31 the practice of architecture as defined in the Illinois 32 Architecture Practice Act of 1989 or the practice of 33 professional engineering as defined in the Professional 34 Engineering Practice Act of 1989 or the practice of structural engineering as defined in the Structural
 Engineering Licensing Act of 1989.

(d) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent an 3 4 owner or operator of a farm or his or her employees from installing, making additions to, altering, maintaining, or 5 6 repairing wiring, apparatus, or equipment for electric light, 7 heat, or power on the farm that he or she owns or operates. 8 For purposes of this subsection, "farm" means land or a 9 building appurtenant to land that is used for an agricultural purpose or for a purpose accessory to an agriculture purpose. 10

11 (e) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to restrict 12 the activities of an employee of a manufacturing corporation 13 to engage in activities incidental to operation or maintenance of its existing business and facilities; however, 14 15 provisions of this Act do apply to new construction that 16 results in the expansion of the existing business or facilities of a manufacturing corporation. 17

18 Section 75. Display of license. Persons who advertise electrical wiring services shall, at their place of business, 19 20 display the electrical contractor license and shall identify 21 the licensed supervising electrician(s) currently employed by 22 When advertising electrical wiring services, them. the electrical contractor license number shall be included in all 23 24 forms of written or printed advertising and included on all contractor vehicles. 25

Section 80. Safety standards. All electrical wiring, apparatus, and equipment for electric light, heat, and power shall comply with the rules of the Department, as applicable, and be installed in conformity with accepted standards of construction for safety to life and property.

31 For the purposes of this Act, the regulations and safety 32 standards stated at the time the work is done in the then

1 most recently published edition of the National Electrical 2 Code as adopted by the National Fire Protection Association, Inc. and approved by the American 3 National Standards 4 and the National Electrical Safety Code as Institute, published by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics 5 6 Engineers, Inc. and approved by the American National Standards Institute, shall be prima facie evidence 7 of 8 accepted standards of construction for safety to life and 9 property. Nothing in this Act shall prohibit any political making and enforcing more stringent 10 subdivision from this 11 requirements than set forth in Act and those requirements shall be complied with by all licensed 12 electricians working within the jurisdiction 13 of that political subdivision; except that nothing in this Act shall 14 be construed to give a political subdivision the authority to 15 16 apply those standards or requirements to electrical work 17 performed on a farm.

18 Section 85. Local Inspections. Any political subdivision may make provision for inspection of electrical installations 19 20 within its jurisdiction, in which case it shall keep on file 21 with the Department copies of its current inspection 22 ordinances and codes. Any political subdivision may require 23 any individual, partnership, corporation, or other business 24 association holding a license from the Department to pay any license, registration fee, or permit fees provided however, 25 that any political subdivision may provide by ordinance a 26 requirement that each individual, partnership, corporation, 27 28 or other business association doing electrical work within 29 jurisdiction of the political subdivision have on file the with the political subdivision a copy of the current license 30 issued by the Department or other evidence of the license as 31 32 may be provided by the Department.

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Section 90. Order of suspension. An order of suspension,
 revocation, or reinstatement of a license, or of dismissal of
 a complaint or petition, or a certified copy of an order,
 over the seal of the Department and purporting to be signed
 by the Director, shall be prima facie proof that:

6 (1) the signature is the genuine signature of the 7 Director; and

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(2) the Director is duly appointed and qualified.

9 95. Manufacturing of electrical apparatus; Section 10 exemption. Electrical components, apparatus, or appliances being manufactured within the limits of property that is 11 leased by a manufacturer and the manufacturer's 12 owned or production employees shall not be covered by this Act. 13 14 Installation or repair of electrical appliance units, except 15 (i) electrical wiring to the unit, or (ii) original wiring in or on the unit installed outside the limits of property that 16 17 is owned or leased by a manufacturer shall not be covered by 18 this Act.

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Section 100. Violations.

Any person violating Section 25 of this Act shall be 20 (a) 21 guilty of a business offense and fined a minimum of \$100 for the first offense. A second or subsequent violation of 22 Section 25 of this Act shall be a Class A misdemeanor with a 23 minimum fine of \$200. The State's Attorney of the County in 24 which the violation occurred or the Attorney General shall 25 prosecute these actions in the name of the People of the 26 State of Illinois. 27

(b) If it is established that the defendant, contrary to this Act, has been engaging, is engaging, or is about to engage in electrical work without having been issued a license, or has been engaging or is about to engage in electrical work after his or her license has been suspended

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1 or revoked or after his or her license has not been renewed, 2 the Court may enter a decree enjoining the defendant from further engaging in electrical work contrary to this Act. 3 In 4 a violation of any injunction issued under this case of 5 Section, the Court may summarily try and punish the offender б for contempt of court. Injunction proceedings shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, all penalties and other 7 remedies in this Act. 8

9 Section 105. Electricians practicing before this Act. 10 Electrical contractors who are in the business on January 1, 11 2004, and who file a license application with the Department 12 within 180 days after the effective date of this Act shall be 13 granted a license that shall be valid for one year from the 14 date of issuance. These licenses shall be subject to annual 15 renewal as provided in this Act.

16 Persons who have two years experience as provided in 17 Section 25 of this Act in performing electrical work as defined in this Act on July 1, 2004 or who have successfully 18 completed an examination for a similar license provided by a 19 20 governmental unit, and who file a license application with the Department within 180 days after July 1, 2004 shall be 21 granted a supervising electrician's license that shall be 22 valid for one year from the date of issuance. These licenses 23 24 shall be subject to annual renewal as provided in this Act.

25 Section 120. Administrative Procedure Act; application. The provisions of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act 26 27 are expressly adopted and shall apply to all administrative 28 rules and procedures of the Department under this Act, except that Section 5 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act 29 30 relating to procedures for rulemaking does not apply to the adoption of any rule required by federal law in connection 31 with which the Department is precluded by law from exercising 32

1 any discretion.

2 Section 125. Review under Administrative Review Law. All 3 final administrative decisions of the Director under this Act 4 shall be subject to judicial review under the Administrative 5 Review Law and its rules.

Home rule. A home rule unit may not б Section 130. 7 regulate the licensing of electricians and electrical contractors in a manner inconsistent with the regulation by 8 9 the State of electricians and electrical contractors. This Section is a limitation under subsection (i) of Section 6 of 10 Article VII of the Illinois Constitution on the concurrent 11 exercise by home rule units of powers and functions exercised 12 13 by the State.

14 Section 135. Electrical Safety Standards Fund. The 15 Electrical Safety Standards Fund is created as a special fund 16 in the State treasury. All fees and fines collected under 17 this Act shall be deposited into the Fund. All money in the 18 Electrical Safety Standards Fund may be used, subject to 19 appropriation, by the Department for the administration of 20 this Act.

Section 140. Time limit on action. No action may be taken by the Department against any person for violation of the terms of this Act or its rules unless the action is commenced within 5 years after the occurrence of the alleged violation.
