1 subject to the approval of the governing board of 2 district, or in a building owned by a Local Mass Transit District organized under the Local Mass Transit District Act, 3 4 subject to the approval of the governing Board of 5 District, or in Bicentennial Park, or on the premises of the 6 City of Mendota Lake Park located adjacent to Route 51 7 Illinois, or on the premises of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, or in the community center owned by the City 8 9 of Loves Park that is located at 1000 River Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the operation of 10 11 an established food serving facility during times when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at the 12 following aquarium and museums located in public parks: Art 13 Institute of Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago 14 Historical Society, Field Museum of Natural History, Museum 15 16 of Science and Industry, DuSable Museum of African American History, John G. Shedd Aquarium and Adler Planetarium, or at 17 Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences in Peoria, 18 19 connection with the operation of the facilities of the Chicago Zoological Society or the Chicago Horticultural 20 2.1 Society on land owned by the Forest Preserve District of Cook 22 County, or on any land used for a golf course or 23 recreational purposes owned by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, subject to the control of the Forest Preserve 24 25 District Board of Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided at 26 maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District harmless 27 from all financial loss, damage, and harm, or in any building 28 29 located on land owned by the Chicago Park District if 30 approved by the Park District Commissioners, or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational purposes and owned 31 32 by the Illinois International Port District if approved by the District's governing board, or at any airport, golf 33 34 course, faculty center, or facility in which conference and

1 convention type activities take place belonging to or under 2 control of any State university or public community college district, provided that with respect to a facility for 3 4 conference and convention type activities alcoholic liquors 5 shall be limited to the use of the convention or conference participants or participants in cultural, political or 6 7 educational activities held in such facilities, and provided further that the faculty or staff of the State university or 8 a public community college district, or members of 9 organization of students, alumni, faculty or staff of 10 11 State university or a public community college district are active participants in the conference or convention, or in 12 Memorial Stadium on the campus of the University of Illinois 13 at Urbana-Champaign during games in which the Chicago Bears 14 15 professional football team is playing in that stadium during 16 the renovation of Soldier Field, not more than one and a half hours before the start of the game and not after the end of 17 the third quarter of the game, or by a catering establishment 18 19 which has rented facilities from a board of trustees of a public community college district, or, if approved by the 20 2.1 District board, on land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary 22 District of Greater Chicago and leased to others for a 23 of at least 20 years. Nothing in this Section precludes the sale or delivery of alcoholic liquor in the form of 24 original 25 packaged goods in premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago belonging to the University of Illinois and used 26 27 primarily as a grocery store by a commercial tenant during the term of a predates 28 lease that the University's 29 acquisition of the premises; but the University shall have no 30 power or authority to renew, transfer, or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of alcoholic liquor; and the 31 32 alcoholic liquor shall be subject to all local laws sale of 33 and regulations. After the acquisition by Winnebago County the property located at 404 Elm Street in Rockford, a 34 of

1 commercial tenant who sold alcoholic liquor at retail on 2 portion of the property under a valid license at the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long as the 3 4 tenant and the County may agree under existing or future leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding 5 6 the sale of alcoholic liquor. Each facility shall provide 7 dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits 8 save harmless the State, municipality, State 9 university, airport, golf course, faculty center, facility in which conference and convention type activities take place, 10 11 park district, Forest Preserve District, public community 12 college district, aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, damage or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be 13 sold at retail in buildings of golf courses owned by 14 15 municipalities in connection with the operation of 16 established food serving facility during times when food is 17 dispensed for consumption upon the premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in 18 19 building owned by a fire protection district organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided that such delivery 20 2.1 and sale is approved by the board of trustees of the district, and provided further that such delivery and sale is 22 23 limited to fundraising events and to a maximum of 6 events 24 per year. 25

Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village 26 Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 27 in connection with organized functions for which the planned 28 attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or 29 30 facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so 31 32 as to hold harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from all financial loss, damage and harm. 33

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail

- 20 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only
 21 in connection with organized functions held on special
 22 occasions;
- 23 (iii) the organized function is one for which the 24 planned attendance is 25 or more persons;
- 25 (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the 26 alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability 27 insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the 28 Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all 29 financial loss, damage or harm; and
- 30 (v) all applicable local ordinances are complied with.
- Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold in any 33 building belonging to or under the control of any city, 34 village or incorporated town where more than 75% of the

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1 physical properties of the building is used for commercial or 2 recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a pier extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or 3 4 stream or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. 5 Alcoholic liquor may be sold in buildings under the control 6 of the Department of Natural Resources when written consent 7 to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such 8 buildings is filed with the Commission by the Department of 9 Natural Resources. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by a United States Army Corps 10 11 οf Engineers or Department of Natural Resources 12 concessionaire who was operating on June 1, 1991 for on-premises consumption only is not subject to the provisions 13 of Articles IV and IX. Beer and wine may be sold on the 14 premises of the Joliet Park District Stadium owned by 15 16 Joliet Park District when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such premises is filed 17 the local liquor commissioner by the Joliet Park 18 District. Beer and wine may be sold in buildings on the 19 grounds of State veterans' homes when written consent to the 20 21 issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such buildings 22 is filed with the Commission by the Department of Veterans' 23 Affairs, and the facility shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save the 24 25 facility harmless from all financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered to and sold at any property 26 owned or held under lease by a Metropolitan Pier 27 and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan 28 Exposition and 29 Auditorium Authority. 30 Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional sporting events and at professional concerts and other 31 32 entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to 33 34 control of the District Commissioners and applicable local

- 4 Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or

- 8 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in
- 9 State parks under the control of the Department of Natural

- lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
- complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,
- b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell
- 16 alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with
- 17 the commission by the Department of Natural Resources,
- 18 and
- 19 c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park
- lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours
- 21 from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.
- Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act,
- 23 alcoholic liquor sold by the State park or restaurant
- 24 concessionaire is not subject to the provisions of
- 25 Articles IV and IX.
- 26 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on
- 27 properties under the control of the Historic Sites and
- 28 Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or
- 29 the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum provided:
- 30 a. the property has overnight lodging facilities
- 31 with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
- lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
- 33 complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,
- 34 b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell

- c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.
- The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section does not authorize the establishment and operation of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail lounges, and the like except as a part of lodge and restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less than 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.
- Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the Springfield Administration Building of the Department of Transportation and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield; provided, that the controlling government authority may consent to such sales only if
- 20 a. the request is from a not-for-profit
 21 organization;
- 22 b. such sales would not impede normal operations of 23 the departments involved;
 - c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;
- d. no such sale shall be made during normal working hours of the State of Illinois; and
- e. the consent is in writing.
- Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as

- 1 provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may
- 2 prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic
- 3 liquors on Sundays or Holidays.
- 4 Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care
- 5 facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21
- 6 or 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility
- 7 operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the
- 8 Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the

- 16 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail

- 20 Presidential Library and Museum where the delivery, sale or

The controlling government authority for the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency shall be the Director of the Historic Sites and Preservation, and the controlling government authority for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum shall be the Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the James R. Thompson Center in Chicago and 222 South College Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant or subtenant who sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;

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- c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
- d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
 shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and
 in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
 indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
 damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing
 of alcoholic liquors.
- Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of Central Management Services.
- Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts as the Authority reasonably determines is necessary.
- Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at
 the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the
 State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided
 that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or
 dispense alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central
 Management Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization,
 provided that such organization:
- 29 a. Obtains written consent from the Department of 30 Central Management Services;
- 31 b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a 32 manner that does not impair normal operations of State 33 offices located in the building;
- 34 c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in

1 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and the municipality in which the building is located may not prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county, and used by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and is a denial and limitation under Article VII, Section 6, subsection (h) of the Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality to regulate that sale and delivery.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone

- 1 County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or
- 2 dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop
- 3 liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the
- 4 Committee reasonably determines are necessary.
- 5 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the
- 6 building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville,
- 7 Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special
- 8 Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services
- 9 Cooperative.
