Anthony), March 29 (Viet Nam War 10 11 Veterans Day), September 11 (September 11th Day of 12 Remembrance), the school day immediately preceding Veteran's Day (Korean War Veterans Day), October 1 (Recycling Day), 13 December 7 (Pearl Harbor Veterans Day) and any day so 14 15 appointed by the President or Governor.
