AN ACT concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Health and Hazardous Substances
Registry Act is amended by changing Section 2 as follows:

6 (410 ILCS 525/2) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 6702)

Sec. 2. (a) <u>Findings.</u> The General Assembly finds that:
(i) the dangers of hazardous substances pose a
serious threat to the public health and welfare of the
citizens of Illinois;

(ii) there exists no unified effort to collect and analyze information on hazardous substances and their potential health effects;

14 (iii) the lack of comprehensive information has 15 caused concern on the part of Illinois citizens and a 16 lack of effective control by the State government;

17 (iv) it is the obligation of the State government 18 to inform and protect the citizens of Illinois by 19 developing a comprehensive and integrated data system on 20 hazardous substances and public health.

(b) It is the purpose of this Act to establish a unified 21 22 Statewide project to collect, compile and correlate information on public health and hazardous substances. Such 23 information is to be used to assist in the determination of 24 public policy and to provide a source of information for the 25 public, except when public disclosure of the information 26 27 would violate the provisions of subsection (d) of Section 4 concerning confidentiality. 28

29 (c) In particular, the purpose of the collection of30 cancer incidence information is to:

detect potential public health problems, predict 1 risks and assist in investigating cancer clusters; 2 3 (2) more accurately target intervention 4 resources for communities and patients and their 5 families; (3) inform health professionals and citizens б 7 about risks, early detection and treatment of cancers known to be elevated in their communities; 8 9 and (4) promote high quality research to provide 10 better information for cancer control and to address 11 public concerns and questions about cancer. 12
