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AN ACT in relation to health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Rural/Downstate Health Act is
amended by changing Section 2 as follows:

6 (410 ILCS 65/2) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 8052)

Sec. 2. Findings; definition. The General Assembly finds 7 8 that citizens in the rural, downstate and designated shortage areas of this State are increasingly faced with problems in 9 accessing necessary health care. The closure of small rural 10 hospitals, the inability of these areas to attract new 11 physicians, the elimination of existing physician services 12 13 because of increasing practice costs, including the cost of providing malpractice insurance, and the lack of systems of 14 15 emergency medical care contribute to the access problems 16 experienced by these residents. While Illinois is not unique in experiencing these problems, the need to maintain or 17 enhance the economies of these areas of the State requires 18 that new and innovative strategies be identified 19 and 20 implemented to respond to the health care needs of residents of these areas. It is therefore the intent of this General 21 22 Assembly to create a program to respond to this problem.

For purposes of this Act, "designated shortage areas" means medically underserved areas or health manpower shortage area as defined by the United States Department of Health and Human Services or as otherwise designated by the Illinois Department of Public Health.
