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- (c) \$10,000,000 for grants to school districts for the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, architectural planning and installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings structures, durable equipment and land for special education
- 7 (d) \$9,000,000 for grants to school districts for the 8 reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, financing and 9 architectural planning of capital facilities, including construction at another location to replace such capital 10 11 facilities, consisting of those public school buildings and temporary school facilities which, prior to January 1, 1984, 12 were condemned by the regional superintendent under Section 13 3-14.22 of The School Code or by any State official having 14 15 jurisdiction over building safety.
- (e) \$3,050,000,000 for grants to school districts for school improvement projects authorized by the School Construction Law.
