- 1 AN ACT in relation to children.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Child Care Act of 1969 is amended by
- 5 adding Section 7.3 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 10/7.3 new)
- 7 Sec. 7.3. Children placed by private child welfare
- 8 <u>agency</u>.
- 9 (a) If a child who is a ward of the Department is placed
- 10 by a private child welfare agency, the Department must verify
- 11 that the placement has taken place and that the child resides
- 12 at the site of that placement. If a child who is a ward of
- 13 <u>the Department is transferred by a private child welfare</u>
- 14 agency from one placement to another, the Department must
- 15 verify that the transfer has taken place and that the child
- 16 <u>resides at the site of the new placement. The Department's</u>
- 17 <u>verification of an initial or transfer placement must include</u>
- 18 <u>a visit to the placement site by a Department employee. The</u>
- 19 <u>Department must document each such verification in its</u>
- 20 <u>records</u>.
- 21 (b) Before placing a child who is a ward of the
- 22 <u>Department in a foster family home, a private child welfare</u>
- 23 <u>agency must ascertain (i) whether any other children who are</u>
- 24 wards of the Department have been placed in that home and
- 25 (ii) whether every such child who has been placed in that
- 26 <u>home continues to reside in that home, unless the child has</u>
- 27 <u>been transferred to another placement or is no longer a ward</u>
- of the Department. The agency must keep a record of every
- 29 <u>other child welfare agency that has placed such a child in</u>
- 30 that foster family home; the record must include the name and
- 31 <u>telephone number of a contact person at each such agency.</u>

- 1 (c) At least once every 30 days, a private child welfare
- 2 agency that places wards of the Department in foster family
- 3 <u>homes must make a site visit to every such home where it has</u>
- 4 placed a ward. The purpose of the site visit is to verify
- 5 that the child continues to reside in that home. The agency
- 6 <u>must document the verification in its records. If a private</u>
- 7 <u>child welfare agency fails to comply with the requirements of</u>
- 8 this subsection, the Department must suspend all payments to
- 9 <u>the agency until the agency complies.</u>
- 10 (d) The Department must periodically (but no less often
- 11 than once every 6 months) review the child placement records
- of each private child welfare agency that places wards of the
- 13 <u>Department</u>.
- 14 (e) If a child placed in a foster family home is
- 15 missing, the foster parent must promptly report that fact to
- the Department or to the child welfare agency that placed the
- 17 <u>child in the home. If the foster parent fails to make such a</u>
- 18 report, the Department shall revoke the foster parent's
- 19 <u>license to operate the foster family home.</u>
- 20 <u>(f) If a private child welfare agency determines that a</u>
- 21 ward of the Department whom it has placed in a foster family
- 22 <u>home no longer resides in that home, the agency must promptly</u>
- 23 report that fact to the Department. If the agency fails to
- 24 <u>make such a report, the Department shall revoke the agency's</u>
- 25 license.
- 26 (g) The Department must strive to account for the status
- 27 <u>and whereabouts of every one of its wards who it determines</u>
- 28 <u>is not residing in the foster family home in which he or she</u>
- 29 was placed.
- 30 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 31 becoming law.
