- 1 AN ACT in relation to criminal law.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
- 5 adding Section 5-9-1.12 as follows:
- 6 (730 ILCS 5/5-9-1.12 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 5-9-1.12</u>. <u>Arson fines</u>.
- 8 (a) In addition to any other penalty imposed, a fine of
- 9 \$500 shall be imposed upon a person convicted of the offense
- of arson, residential arson, or aggravated arson.
- 11 (b) The additional fine shall be assessed by the
- 12 <u>court imposing sentence</u> and shall be collected by the
- 13 <u>Circuit Clerk in addition to the fine, if any, and costs in</u>
- 14 the case. Each such additional fine shall be remitted by the
- 15 <u>Circuit Clerk within one month after receipt to the State</u>
- 16 <u>Treasurer for deposit into the Fire Prevention Fund.</u>
- 17 The Circuit Clerk shall retain 10% of such fine to cover
- 18 the costs incurred in administering and enforcing this
- 19 <u>Section. The additional fine may not be considered a part of</u>
- 20 the fine for purposes of any reduction in the fine for
- 21 <u>time served either before or after sentencing.</u>
- (c) The moneys in the Fire Prevention Fund collected as
- 23 <u>additional fines under this Section shall be distributed by</u>
- 24 <u>the Office of the State Fire Marshal to the fire department</u>
- 25 <u>or fire protection district that suppressed or investigated</u>
- 26 the fire that was set by the defendant and for which the
- 27 <u>defendant was convicted of arson, residential arson, or</u>
- 28 <u>aggravated arson. If more than one fire department or fire</u>
- 29 <u>protection district suppressed or investigated the fire, the</u>
- 30 <u>additional fine shall be distributed equally among those</u>
- 31 <u>departments or districts.</u>

- 1 (d) The moneys distributed to the fire departments or
- 2 <u>fire protection districts under this Section may only be used</u>
- 3 <u>to purchase fire suppression or fire investigation equipment.</u>
- 4 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 5 becoming law.
