SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/18-8.10 new

Amends the Common School Fund Article of the School Code. Provides for a grant to be paid to a school district if there has been an increase in a school district's student population over any 2 consecutive school years of (i) over 1.5% in a district with over 10,000 pupils in average daily attendance or (ii) over 10% in any other district. Effective July 1, 2004.

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AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
18-8.10 as follows:

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(105 ILCS 5/18-8.10 new)

Sec. 18-8.10. Fast growth grants.

8 <u>(a) If there has been an increase in a school district's</u> 9 <u>student population over any 2 consecutive school years of (i)</u> 10 <u>over 1.5% in a district with over 10,000 pupils in average</u> 11 <u>daily attendance (as defined in Section 18-8.05 of this Code)</u> 12 <u>or (ii) over 10% in any other district, then the district is</u> 13 <u>eligible for a grant under this Section, subject to</u> 14 <u>appropriation.</u>

15 (b) The State Board of Education shall determine a per pupil grant amount for each school district based on the needs 16 17 of the district. The total grant amount for a district for any given school year shall equal the per pupil grant amount 18 19 multiplied by the difference between the number of pupils in average daily attendance for the first 3 months of the school 20 year and the number of pupils in average daily attendance for 21 22 the immediately preceding school year.

(c) Funds for grants under this Section must be 23 appropriated to the State Board of Education in a separate line 24 item for this purpose. If the amount appropriated in any fiscal 25 26 year is insufficient to pay all grants for a school year, then the amount appropriated shall be prorated among eligible 27 districts. As soon as possible after funds have been 28 appropriated to the State Board of Education, the State Board 29 30 of Education shall distribute the grants to eligible districts. (d) If a school district intentionally reports incorrect 31 average daily attendance numbers to receive a grant under this 32

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1	Section, then the district shall be denied State aid in the
2	same manner as State aid is denied for intentional incorrect
3	reporting of average daily attendance numbers under Section
4	<u>18-8.05 of this Code.</u>
5	(e) The State Board of Education may adopt any rules
6	necessary to implement this Section.
7	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
