### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21-14

from Ch. 122, par. 21-14

Amends the School Code with regard to Standard and Master teaching certificates. Provides that for the holder of an Early Childhood or Elementary type of certificate, 50% of the continuing professional development activities included in a certificate renewal plan must be coursework or activities that expand the holder's knowledge and application of best practices in the teaching of reading.

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AN ACT concerning education.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21-14 as follows:

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(105 ILCS 5/21-14) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-14)

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Sec. 21-14. Registration and renewal of certificates.

(a) A limited four-year certificate or a certificate issued 8 after July 1, 1955, shall be renewable at its expiration or 9 within 60 days thereafter by the county superintendent of 10 schools having supervision and control over the school where 11 the teacher is teaching upon certified evidence of meeting the 12 requirements for renewal as required by this Act and prescribed 13 by the State Board of Education in consultation with the State 14 15 Teacher Certification Board. An elementary supervisory certificate shall not be renewed at the end of the first 16 17 four-year period covered by the certificate unless the holder thereof has filed certified evidence with the State Teacher 18 19 Certification Board that he has a master's degree or that he 20 has earned 8 semester hours of credit in the field of educational administration and supervision in a recognized 21 22 institution of higher learning. The holder shall continue to earn 8 semester hours of credit each four-year period until 23 such time as he has earned a master's degree. 24

25 All certificates not renewed or registered as herein provided shall lapse after a period of 5 years from the 26 expiration of the last year of registration. Such certificates 27 28 may be reinstated for a one year period upon payment of all accumulated registration fees. Such reinstated certificates 29 30 shall only be renewed: (1) by earning 5 semester hours of credit in a recognized institution of higher learning in the 31 32 field of professional education or in courses related to the - 2 - LRB093 19902 NHT 45645 b

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holder's contractual teaching duties; or (2) by presenting evidence of holding a valid regular certificate of some other type. Any certificate may be voluntarily surrendered by the certificate holder. A voluntarily surrendered certificate shall be treated as a revoked certificate.

6 (b) When those teaching certificates issued before February 15, 2000 are renewed for the first time after February 7 15, 2000, all such teaching certificates shall be exchanged for 8 9 Standard Teaching Certificates as provided in subsection (c) of Section 21-2. All Initial and Standard Teaching Certificates, 10 11 including those issued to persons who previously held teaching 12 certificates issued before February 15, 2000, shall be 13 renewable under the conditions set forth in this subsection (b). 14

15 Initial Teaching Certificates are nonrenewable and are 16 valid for 4 years of teaching. Standard Teaching Certificates 17 are renewable every 5 years as provided in subsection (c) of Section 21-2 and subsection (c) of this Section. For purposes 18 of this Section, "teaching" is defined as employment and 19 20 performance of services in an Illinois public or State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or joint 21 agreement with a governing body or board of control, in a 22 23 certificated teaching position, or a charter school operating in compliance with the Charter Schools Law. 24

(c) In compliance with subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code, which provides that a Standard Teaching Certificate may be renewed by the State Teacher Certification Board based upon proof of continuing professional development, the State Board of Education and the State Teacher Certification Board shall jointly:

31 (1) establish a procedure for renewing Standard 32 Teaching Certificates, which shall include but not be 33 limited to annual timelines for the renewal process and the 34 components set forth in subsections (d) through (k) of this 35 Section;

(2) establish the standards for certificate renewal;

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1 2 (3) approve the providers of continuing professional development activities;

(4) determine the maximum credit for each category of 3 continuing professional development activities, based upon 4 5 recommendations submitted by a continuing professional 6 development activity task force, which shall consist of 6 staff members from the State Board of Education, appointed 7 by the State Superintendent of Education, and 6 teacher 8 9 representatives, 3 of whom are selected by the Illinois Education Association and 3 of whom are selected by the 10 Illinois Federation of Teachers; 11

12 (5) designate the type and amount of documentation 13 required to show that continuing professional development 14 activities have been completed; and

15 (6) provide, on a timely basis to all Illinois 16 teachers, certificate holders, regional superintendents of 17 schools, school districts, and others with an interest in 18 continuing professional development, information about the 19 standards and requirements established pursuant to this 20 subsection (c).

(d) Any Standard Teaching Certificate held by an individual 21 22 employed and performing services in an Illinois public or 23 State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board 24 of control in a certificated teaching position or a charter 25 26 school in compliance with the Charter Schools Law must be 27 maintained Valid and Active through certificate renewal 28 activities specified in the certificate renewal procedure 29 established pursuant to subsection (c) of this Section, provided that a holder of a Valid and Active certificate who is 30 31 only employed on either a part-time basis or day-to-day basis 32 as а substitute teacher shall pay only the required registration fee to renew his or her certificate and maintain 33 Valid and Active. All other Standard 34 Teaching it as 35 Certificates held may be maintained as Valid and Exempt through the registration process provided for in the certificate 36

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1 renewal procedure established pursuant to subsection (c) of 2 Section. A Valid and Exempt certificate this must be 3 immediately activated, through procedures developed jointly by 4 State Board of Education and the State the Teacher 5 Certification Board, upon the certificate holder becoming 6 employed and performing services in an Illinois public or 7 State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or 8 cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board of control in a certificated teaching position or a charter 9 10 school operating in compliance with the Charter Schools Law. A 11 holder of a Valid and Exempt certificate may activate his or 12 her certificate through procedures provided for in the 13 certificate renewal procedure established pursuant to subsection (c) of this Section. 14

15 (e) (1) A Standard Teaching Certificate that has been 16 maintained as Valid and Active for the 5 years of the 17 certificate's validity shall be renewed as Valid and Active upon the certificate holder: (i) completing an advanced degree 18 19 from an approved institution in an education-related field; 20 (ii) completing at least 8 semester hours of coursework as 21 described in subdivision (B) of paragraph (3) of this 22 subsection (e); (iii) earning at least 24 continuing education 23 units as described in subdivision (C) of paragraph (3) of this 24 subsection (e); (iv) completing the National Board for 25 Professional Teaching Standards process as described in 26 subdivision (D) of paragraph (3) of this subsection (e); or (v) 27 earning 120 continuing professional development units ("CPDU") 28 as described in subdivision (E) of paragraph (3) of this 29 subsection (e). The maximum continuing professional 30 development units for each continuing professional development 31 activity identified in subdivisions (F) through (J) of of this 32 paragraph (3) subsection (e) shall be jointly determined by the State Board of Education and the State 33 Teacher Certification Board. If, however, the certificate 34 35 holder has maintained the certificate as Valid and Exempt for a portion of the 5-year period of validity, the number of 36

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1 continuing professional development units needed to renew the 2 certificate as Valid and Active shall be proportionately 3 reduced by the amount of time the certificate was Valid and 4 Exempt. Furthermore, if a certificate holder is employed and 5 performs teaching services on a part-time basis for all or a portion of the certificate's 5-year period of validity, the 6 number of continuing professional development units needed to 7 8 renew the certificate as Valid and Active shall be reduced by 50% for the amount of time the certificate holder has been 9 employed and performed teaching services on a part-time basis. 10 11 Part-time shall be defined as less than 50% of the school day 12 or school term.

Notwithstanding any other requirements to the contrary, if a Standard Teaching Certificate has been maintained as Valid and Active for the 5 years of the certificate's validity and the certificate holder has completed his or her certificate renewal plan before July 1, 2002, the certificate shall be renewed as Valid and Active.

19 (2) Each Valid and Active Standard Teaching Certificate 20 holder shall develop a certificate renewal plan for satisfying the continuing professional development requirement provided 21 22 for in subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code. Certificate 23 holders with multiple certificates shall develop a certificate renewal plan that addresses only that certificate or those 24 certificates that are required of his or her certificated 25 26 teaching position, if the certificate holder is employed and 27 performing services in an Illinois public or State-operated 28 elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or joint 29 agreement with a governing body or board of control, or that 30 certificate or those certificates most closely related to his 31 or her teaching position, if the certificate holder is employed 32 in a charter school. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (e), a certificate renewal plan shall include a 33 minimum of 3 individual improvement goals developed by the 34 certificate holder and shall reflect purposes (A), (B), and (C) 35 and may reflect purpose (D) of the following continuing 36

1 professional development purposes:

2 (A) Advance both the certificate holder's knowledge 3 and skills as a teacher consistent with the Illinois 4 Professional Teaching Standards and the Illinois Content 5 Area Standards in the certificate holder's areas of 6 certification, endorsement, or teaching assignment in 7 order to keep the certificate holder current in those 8 areas.

9 (B) Develop the certificate holder's knowledge and 10 skills in areas determined to be critical for all Illinois 11 teachers, as defined by the State Board of Education, known 12 as "State priorities".

13 (C) Address the knowledge, skills, and goals of the 14 certificate holder's local school improvement plan, if the 15 teacher is employed in an Illinois public or State-operated 16 elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or 17 joint agreement with a governing body or board of control.

18 (D) Expand the certificate holder's knowledge and 19 skills in an additional teaching field or toward the 20 acquisition of another teaching certificate, endorsement, 21 or relevant education degree.

22 A certificate renewal plan must include a description of how 23 these goals are to be achieved and an explanation of selected 24 continuing professional development activities tο he completed, each of which must meet one or more of 25 the 26 continuing professional development purposes specified in this 27 paragraph (2). The plan shall identify potential activities and 28 include projected timelines for those activities that will 29 assure completion of the plan before the expiration of the 30 5-year validity of the Standard Teaching Certificate. Except as 31 otherwise provided in this subsection (e), at least 50% of 32 continuing professional development units must relate to purposes (A) and (B) set forth in this paragraph (2): the 33 advancement of a certificate holder's knowledge and skills as a 34 35 teacher consistent with the Illinois Professional Teaching Standards and the Illinois Content Area Standards in the 36

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certificate holder's areas of certification, endorsement, or 1 2 teaching assignment in order to keep the certificate holder 3 current in those areas and the development of a certificate holder's knowledge and skills in the State priorities that 4 5 exist at the time the certificate renewal plan is developed. 6 For the holder of an Early Childhood or Elementary type of certificate who is developing a certificate renewal plan on or 7 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd 8 9 General Assembly, 50% of the continuing professional development activities included in the certificate renewal 10 11 plan must be coursework or activities that expand the holder's 12 knowledge and application of best practices in the teaching of 13 reading.

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speech-language pathologist or audiologist who 14 А is 15 licensed under the Illinois Speech-Language Pathology and 16 Audiology Practice Act and who has met the continuing education 17 requirements of that Act and the rules promulgated under that deemed to have satisfied the continuing 18 Act shall be 19 professional development requirements established by the State 20 Board of Education and the Teacher Certification Board to renew a Standard Certificate. 21

(3) Continuing professional development activities
included in a certificate renewal plan may include, but are not
limited to, the following activities:

(A) completion of an advanced degree from an approved
 institution in an education-related field;

27 (B) at least 8 semester hours of coursework in an 28 approved education-related program, of which at least 2 29 semester hours relate to the continuing professional 30 development purpose set forth in purpose (A) of paragraph 31 (2) of this subsection (e), provided that such a plan need 32 not include any other continuing professional development activities nor reflect or contain activities related to the 33 other continuing professional development purposes set 34 forth in paragraph (2) of this subsection (e); 35

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(C) continuing education units that satisfy the

continuing professional development purposes set forth in paragraph (2) of this subsection (e), with each continuing education unit equal to 5 clock hours, provided that a plan that includes at least 24 continuing education units (or l20 clock/contact hours) need not include any other continuing professional development activities;

7 (D) completion of the National Board of Professional 8 Teaching Standards ("NBPTS") process, provided that a plan 9 that includes completion of the NBPTS process need not 10 include any other continuing professional development 11 activities nor reflect or contain activities related to the 12 continuing professional development purposes set forth in 13 paragraph (2) of subsection (e) of this Section;

14 (E) completion of 120 continuing professional 15 development units that satisfy the continuing professional 16 development purposes set forth in paragraph (2) of this 17 subsection (e) and may include without limitation the 18 activities identified in subdivisions (F) through (J) of 19 this paragraph (3);

(F) collaboration and partnership activities related
to improving the teacher's knowledge and skills as a
teacher, including the following:

(i) participating on collaborative planning and professional improvement teams and committees;

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(ii) peer review and coaching;

(iii) mentoring in a formal mentoring program,
 including service as a consulting teacher
 participating in a remediation process formulated
 under Section 24A-5 of this Code;

30 (iv) participating in site-based management or 31 decision making teams, relevant committees, boards, or 32 task forces directly related to school improvement 33 plans;

34 (v) coordinating community resources in schools,
35 if the project is a specific goal of the school
36 improvement plan;

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1 (vi) facilitating parent education programs for a 2 school, school district, or regional office of 3 education directly related to student achievement or 4 school improvement plans;

(vii) participating in business, school, or community partnerships directly related to student achievement or school improvement plans; or

8 (viii) supervising a student teacher or teacher 9 education candidate in clinical supervision, provided 10 that the supervision may only be counted once during 11 the course of 5 years;

12 (G) college or university coursework related to 13 improving the teacher's knowledge and skills as a teacher 14 as follows:

(i) completing undergraduate or graduate credit 15 16 earned from a regionally accredited institution in coursework relevant to the certificate area being 17 including coursework that incorporates 18 renewed, induction activities and development of a portfolio of 19 20 both student and teacher work that provides experience in reflective practices, provided the coursework meets 21 Illinois Professional Teaching Standards or Illinois 22 Content Area Standards and supports the essential 23 characteristics of quality professional development; 24 25 or

(ii) teaching college or university courses in
areas relevant to the certificate area being renewed,
provided that the teaching may only be counted once
during the course of 5 years;

30 (H) conferences, workshops, institutes, seminars, and
 31 symposiums related to improving the teacher's knowledge
 32 and skills as a teacher, including the following:

33 (i) completing non-university credit directly
34 related to student achievement, school improvement
35 plans, or State priorities;

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(ii) participating in or presenting at workshops,

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seminars, conferences, institutes, and symposiums;

(iii) training as external reviewers for Quality 2 3 Assurance; or

(iv) training as reviewers of university teacher 4 5 preparation programs;

(I) other educational experiences related to improving 6 the teacher's knowledge and skills as a teacher, including 7 the following:

9 (i) participating in action research and inquiry 10 projects;

11 (ii) observing programs or teaching in schools, 12 related businesses, or industry that is systematic, purposeful, and relevant to certificate renewal; 13

traveling related to ones teaching (iii) 14 assignment, directly related to student achievement or 15 16 school improvement plans and approved at least 30 days 17 prior to the travel experience, provided that the traveling shall not include time spent commuting to 18 destinations where the learning experience will occur; 19

20 (iv) participating in study groups related to student achievement or school improvement plans; 21

(v) serving on a statewide education-related 22 23 committee, including but not limited to the State Teacher Certification Board, State Board of Education 24 25 strategic agenda teams, or the State Advisory Council on Education of Children with Disabilities; 26

27 (vi) participating in work/learn programs or 28 internships; or

(vii) developing a portfolio of student and teacher work;

(J) professional leadership experiences related to 31 32 improving the teacher's knowledge and skills as a teacher, including the following: 33

(i) participating in curriculum development or 34 assessment activities at the school, school district, 35 regional office of education, State, or national 36

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2 (ii) participating in team or department
3 leadership in a school or school district;

(iii) participating on external or internal school
 or school district review teams;

6 (iv) publishing educational articles, columns, or 7 books relevant to the certificate area being renewed; 8 or

9 (v) participating in non-strike related 10 professional association or labor organization service 11 or activities related to professional development.

12 (4) A certificate renewal plan must initially be approved 13 by the certificate holder's local professional development committee, as provided for in subsection (f) of this Section. 14 15 If the local professional development committee does not 16 approve the certificate renewal plan, the certificate holder 17 may appeal that determination to the regional professional development review committee, as provided for in paragraph (2) 18 19 of subsection (g) of this Section. If the regional professional 20 development review committee disagrees with the local development committee's determination, 21 professional the 22 certificate renewal plan shall be deemed approved and the 23 certificate holder may begin satisfying the continuing professional development activities set forth in the plan. If 24 25 the regional professional development review committee agrees 26 local professional development with the committee's 27 determination, the certificate renewal plan shall be deemed disapproved and shall be returned to the certificate holder to 28 29 develop a revised certificate renewal plan. In all cases, the 30 regional professional development review committee shall immediately notify both the local professional development 31 committee and the certificate holder of its determination. 32

33 (5) A certificate holder who wishes to modify the 34 continuing professional development activities or goals in his 35 or her certificate renewal plan must submit the proposed 36 modifications to his or her local professional development

1 committee for approval prior to engaging in the proposed 2 activities. If the local professional development committee 3 does not approve the proposed modification, the certificate 4 holder may appeal that determination to the regional 5 professional development review committee, as set forth in 6 paragraph (4) of this subsection (e).

(6) When a certificate holder changes assignments or school 7 8 districts during the course of completing a certificate renewal plan, the professional development and continuing education 9 10 credit earned pursuant to the plan shall transfer to the new 11 assignment or school district and count toward the total 12 requirements. This certificate renewal plan must be reviewed by 13 the appropriate local professional development committee and may be modified to reflect the certificate holder's new work 14 15 assignment or the school improvement plan of the new school 16 district or school building.

17 (f) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Code, each school district, charter school, and cooperative or joint 18 19 agreement with a governing body or board of control that 20 employs certificated staff, shall establish and implement, in 21 conjunction with its exclusive representative, if any, one or more local professional development committees, as set forth in 22 23 this subsection (f), which shall perform the following functions: 24

(1) review and approve certificate renewal plans and
any modifications made to these plans, including
transferred plans;

28 (2) maintain a file of approved certificate renewal29 plans;

30 (3) monitor certificate holders' progress in 31 completing approved certificate renewal plans, provided 32 that a local professional development committee shall not be required to maintain materials submitted by certificate 33 34 holders to demonstrate their progress in completing their certificate renewal plans after the committee has reviewed 35 the materials and the credits have been awarded; 36

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1 (4) assist in the development of professional 2 development plans based upon needs identified in 3 certificate renewal plans;

(5) determine whether certificate holders have met the requirements of their certificate renewal plans and notify certificate holders of its determination;

7 (6) provide a certificate holder with the opportunity
8 to address the committee when it has determined that the
9 certificate holder has not met the requirements of his or
10 her certificate renewal plan;

11 (7) issue and forward recommendations for renewal or 12 nonrenewal of certificate holders' Standard Teaching Certificates to the appropriate regional superintendent of 13 schools, based upon whether certificate holders have met 14 the requirements of their approved certificate renewal 15 16 plans, with 30-day written notice of its recommendation 17 provided to the certificate holder prior to forwarding the recommendation to the regional superintendent of schools, 18 provided that if the local professional development 19 20 committee's recommendation is for certificate nonrenewal, the written notice provided to the certificate holder shall 21 include a return receipt; and 22

(8) reconsider its recommendation of certificate
nonrenewal, upon request of the certificate holder within
30 days of receipt of written notification that the local
professional development committee will make such a
recommendation, and forward to the regional superintendent
of schools its recommendation within 30 days of receipt of
the certificate holder's request.

Each local professional development committee shall consist of at least 3 classroom teachers; one superintendent or chief administrator of the school district, charter school, or cooperative or joint agreement or his or her designee; and one at-large member who shall be either (i) a parent, (ii) a member of the business community, (iii) a community member, or (iv) an administrator, with preference given to an individual chosen

1 from among those persons listed in items (i), (ii), and (iii) 2 in order to secure representation of an interest not already 3 represented on the committee. Except in a school district in a population exceeding 500,000, 4 citv having a а local 5 professional development committee shall be responsible for no 6 than 200 certificate renewal plans annually unless more otherwise mutually agreed upon by the school district, charter 7 8 school, or governing body or board of control of a cooperative 9 or joint agreement and its exclusive representative, if any. If mutually agreed upon by the school district, charter school, or 10 11 governing body or board of control of a cooperative or joint 12 agreement and its exclusive representative, if any, additional 13 members may be added to a local professional development committee, provided that a majority of members are classroom 14 15 teachers. Except in a school district in a city having a population exceeding 500,000, if additional members are added 16 17 to a local professional development committee, the maximum number of certificate renewal plans for which the committee 18 19 shall annually be responsible may be increased by 50 plans for 20 each additional member, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the school district, charter school, or governing body or 21 22 board of control of a cooperative or joint agreement and its 23 exclusive representative, if any. The school district, charter 24 school, or governing body or board of control of a cooperative 25 or joint agreement and its exclusive representative, if any, 26 shall determine the term of service of the members of a local 27 professional development committee. All individuals selected 28 to serve on local professional development committees must be known to demonstrate the best practices in teaching or their 29 30 respective field of practice.

The exclusive representative, if any, shall select the 31 32 classroom teacher members of the local professional development committee. If no exclusive representative exists, 33 then the classroom teacher members of a local professional 34 35 development committee shall be selected by the classroom teachers that come within the local professional development 36

1 committee's authority. The school district, charter school, or 2 governing body or board of control of a cooperative or joint 3 agreement shall select the 2 non-classroom teacher members (the superintendent or chief administrator of the school district, 4 5 charter school, or cooperative or joint agreement or his or her 6 designee and the at-large member) of a local professional development committee. Vacancies in positions on a local 7 professional development committee shall be filled in the same 8 9 manner as the original selections. The members of a local 10 professional development committee shall select a chairperson. 11 Local professional development committee meetings shall be 12 scheduled so as not to interfere with committee members' 13 regularly scheduled teaching duties, except when otherwise 14 permitted by the policies of or agreed to or approved by the 15 school district, charter school, or governing body or board of 16 control of a cooperative or joint agreement, or its designee.

The board of education or governing board shall convene the first meeting of the local professional development committee. All actions taken by the local professional development committee shall require that a majority of committee members be present, and no committee action may be taken unless 50% or more of those present are teacher members.

The State Board of Education and the State Teacher Certification Board shall jointly provide local professional development committee members with a training manual, and the members shall certify that they have received and read the manual.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this subsection (f), for a teacher employed and performing services in a nonpublic or State-operated elementary or secondary school, all references to a local professional development committee shall mean the regional superintendent of schools of the regional office of education for the geographic area where the teaching is done.

35 (g)(1) Each regional superintendent of schools shall 36 review and concur or nonconcur with each recommendation for

1 renewal or nonrenewal of a Standard Teaching Certificate he or 2 she receives from a local professional development committee 3 or, if a certificate holder appeals the recommendation to the 4 regional professional development review committee, the 5 recommendation for renewal or nonrenewal he or she receives from a regional professional development review committee and, 6 7 within 14 days of receipt of the recommendation, shall provide the State Teacher Certification Board with verification of the 8 9 following, if applicable:

10 (A) a certificate renewal plan was filed and approved
11 by the appropriate local professional development
12 committee;

(B) the professional development and continuing
education activities set forth in the approved certificate
renewal plan have been satisfactorily completed;

16 (C) the local professional development committee has 17 recommended the renewal of the certificate holder's Teaching Certificate 18 Standard and forwarded the recommendation, along with all supporting documentation as 19 20 jointly required by the State Board of Education and the Teacher Certification Board, to the regional 21 State superintendent of schools; 22

23 (D) the certificate holder has appealed his or her 24 local professional development committee's recommendation 25 of nonrenewal to the regional professional development 26 review committee and the result of that appeal;

27 (E) the regional superintendent of schools has 28 concurred or nonconcurred with the local professional 29 development committee's or regional professional 30 development review committee's recommendation to renew or 31 nonrenew the certificate holder's Standard Teaching 32 Certificate and made a recommendation to that effect; and

33 (F) the established registration fee for the Standard34 Teaching Certificate has been paid.

35 At the same time the regional superintendent of schools 36 provides the State Teacher Certification Board with the notice

1 required by this subsection (g), he or she shall also notify 2 the certificate holder in writing that this notice has been 3 provided to the State Teacher Certification Board, provided that if the notice provided by the regional superintendent of 4 5 schools to the State Teacher Certification Board includes a 6 recommendation of certificate nonrenewal, the written notice provided to the certificate holder shall be by certified mail, 7 return receipt requested. 8

9 (2) Each certificate holder shall have the right to appeal 10 his or her local professional development committee's 11 recommendation of nonrenewal to the regional professional 12 development review committee, within 14 days of receipt of 13 notice that the recommendation has been sent to the regional superintendent of schools. Each regional superintendent of 14 15 schools shall establish a regional professional development 16 review committee or committees for the purpose of advising the 17 regional superintendent of schools, upon request, and handling certificate holder appeals. This committee shall consist of at 18 19 4 classroom teachers, one non-administrative least certificated educational employee, 2 administrators, and one 20 21 at-large member who shall be either (i) a parent, (ii) a member of the business community, (iii) a community member, or (iv) an 22 23 administrator, with preference given to an individual chosen from among those persons listed in items (i), (ii), and (iii) 24 in order to secure representation of an interest not already 25 26 committee. The represented on the teacher and 27 non-administrative certificated educational employee members 28 of the review committee shall be selected by their exclusive representative, if any, and the administrators and at-large 29 30 member shall be selected by the regional superintendent of 31 schools. A regional superintendent of schools may add 32 additional members to the committee, provided that the same proportion of teachers to administrators and at-large members 33 on the committee is maintained. Any additional teacher and 34 35 non-administrative certificated educational employee members 36 shall be selected by their exclusive representative, if any.

Vacancies in positions on a regional professional development review committee shall be filled in the same manner as the original selections. Committee members shall serve staggered 3-year terms. All individuals selected to serve on regional professional development review committees must be known to demonstrate the best practices in teaching or their respective field of practice.

8 The exclusive representative responsible for choosing the individuals that serve on a regional professional development 9 review committee shall notify each school district, charter 10 11 school, or governing body or board of control of a cooperative 12 or joint agreement employing the individuals chosen to serve 13 and provide their names to the appropriate regional superintendent of schools. Regional professional development 14 15 review committee meetings shall be scheduled so as not to 16 interfere with the committee members' regularly scheduled 17 teaching duties, except when otherwise permitted by the policies of or agreed to or approved by the school district, 18 19 charter school, or governing body or board of control of a 20 cooperative or joint agreement, or its designee, provided that the school district, charter school, or governing body or board 21 of control shall not unreasonably withhold permission for a 22 23 committee member to attend regional professional development review committee meetings. 24

In a city having a population exceeding 500,000 that does 25 26 not have a regional office of education, one or more separate 27 regional professional development review committees shall be 28 established as mutually agreed upon by the board of education 29 of the school district organized under Article 34 of this Code 30 and the exclusive representative. The composition of each 31 committee shall be the same as for a regional professional 32 development review committee, except that members of the committee shall be jointly appointed by the board of education 33 and the exclusive representative. All other provisions of this 34 35 Section concerning regional professional development review 36 committees shall apply to these committees.

1 The regional professional development review committee may 2 information in addition to that received from a require certificate holder's local professional development committee 3 4 or request that the certificate holder appear before it, shall 5 either concur or nonconcur with а local professional 6 development committee's recommendation of nonrenewal, and shall forward to the regional superintendent of schools its 7 8 recommendation of renewal or nonrenewal. All actions taken by 9 the regional professional development review committee shall 10 require a quorum and be by a simple majority of those present 11 and voting. A record of all votes shall be maintained. The 12 committee shall have 45 days from receipt of a certificate 13 holder's appeal to make its recommendation to the regional superintendent of schools. 14

15 The State Board of Education and the State Teacher 16 Certification Board shall jointly provide regional 17 professional development review committee members with a 18 training manual, and the members shall be required to attend 19 one training seminar sponsored jointly by the State Board of 20 Education and the State Teacher Certification Board.

(h) (1) The State Teacher Certification Board shall review 21 the regional superintendent of schools' recommendations to 22 23 renew or nonrenew Standard Teaching Certificates and notify 24 certificate holders in writing whether their certificates have been renewed or nonrenewed within 90 days of receipt of the 25 26 recommendations, unless a certificate holder has appealed a 27 regional superintendent of schools' recommendation of 28 nonrenewal, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection 29 (h). The State Teacher Certification Board shall verify that 30 the certificate holder has met the renewal criteria set forth 31 in paragraph (1) of subsection (g) of this Section.

32 (2) Each certificate holder shall have the right to appeal 33 a regional superintendent of school's recommendation to 34 nonrenew his or her Standard Teaching Certificate to the State 35 Teacher Certification Board, within 14 days of receipt of 36 notice that the decision has been sent to the State Teacher

Certification Board, which shall hold an appeal hearing within 1 2 60 days of receipt of the appeal. When such an appeal is taken, 3 the certificate holder's Standard Teaching Certificate shall continue to be valid until the appeal is finally determined. 4 5 The State Teacher Certification Board shall review the regional the 6 superintendent of school's recommendation, regional professional development review committee's recommendation, if 7 8 any, and the local professional development committee's recommendation and all relevant documentation to verify 9 whether the certificate holder has met the renewal criteria set 10 11 forth in paragraph (1) of subsection (g) of this Section. The 12 State Teacher Certification Board may request that the 13 certificate holder appear before it. All actions taken by the State Teacher Certification Board shall require a quorum and be 14 15 by a simple majority of those present and voting. A record of 16 all votes shall be maintained. The State Teacher Certification Board shall notify the certificate holder in writing, within 7 17 days of completing the review, whether his or her Standard 18 19 Teaching Certificate has been renewed or nonrenewed, provided 20 that if the State Teacher Certification Board determines to nonrenew a certificate, the written notice provided to the 21 certificate holder shall be by certified mail, return receipt 22 23 requested. All certificate renewal or nonrenewal decisions of the State Teacher Certification Board are final and subject to 24 administrative review, as set forth in Section 21-24 of this 25 26 Code.

(i) Holders of Master Teaching Certificates shall meet the
same requirements and follow the same procedures as holders of
Standard Teaching Certificates, except that their renewal
cycle shall be as set forth in subsection (d) of Section 21-2
of this Code.

holder 32 Α of а teaching certificate endorsed as а speech-language pathologist who 33 has been granted the 34 Certificate of Clinical Competence by the American 35 Speech-Language Hearing Association may renew his or her Standard Teaching Certificate pursuant to the 10-year renewal 36

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1 cycle set forth in subsection (d) of Section 21-2 of this Code.

2 (j) Holders of Valid and Exempt Standard and Master 3 Teaching Certificates who are not employed and performing services in an Illinois public or State-operated elementary 4 5 school, secondary school, or cooperative or joint agreement 6 with a governing body or board of control, in a certificated teaching position, may voluntarily activate their certificates 7 by developing and submitting a certificate renewal plan to the 8 9 regional superintendent of schools of the regional office of 10 education for the geographic area where their teaching is done, 11 who, or whose designee, shall approve the plan and serve as the 12 certificate holder's local professional development committee. 13 These certificate holders shall follow the same renewal criteria and procedures as all other Standard and Master 14 15 Teaching Certificate holders, except that their continuing 16 professional development plans shall not be required to reflect 17 or address the knowledge, skills, and goals of a local school 18 improvement plan.

19 (k) Each school district, charter school, or cooperative or 20 joint agreement shall be paid an annual amount of not less than \$1,000, as determined by a formula based on the number of 21 Standard Teaching and Master Teaching Certificate holders, 22 23 subject to renewal and established by rule, not to exceed \$1,000,000 annually for all school districts, charter schools, 24 and cooperatives or joint agreements, for administrative costs 25 26 associated with conducting the meetings of the local 27 professional development committee, as determined in 28 consultation with the committee. Each regional office of 29 education shall receive \$2,000 annually to pay school 30 districts, charter schools, or cooperatives or joint 31 agreements for costs, as defined by rule, incurred in staff 32 attendance at regional professional development review committee meetings and the training seminar required under 33 paragraph (2) of subsection (g) of this Section. 34

35 (1) The State Board of Education and the State Teacher36 Certification Board shall jointly contract with an independent

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party to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the certificate renewal system pursuant to this Section. The first report of this evaluation shall be presented to the General Assembly on January 1, 2005 and on January 1 of every third year thereafter.
