# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Uniform Commercial Code is amended by
changing Section 1-102 as follows:

6 (810 ILCS 5/1-102) (from Ch. 26, par. 1-102)

Sec. 1-102. Purposes, rules of construction, variation byagreement.

9 (1) This Act shall be liberally construed. This Act shall
 10 <u>be</u> and applied to promote its underlying purposes and policies.

(2) Underlying purposes and policies of this Act are

12 (a) to simplify, clarify and modernize the law13 governing commercial transactions;

(b) to permit the continued expansion of commercial
practices through custom, usage and agreement of the parties;

16 (c) to make uniform the law among the various 17 jurisdictions.

(3) The effect of provisions of this Act may be varied by agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Act and except that the obligations of good faith, diligence, reasonableness and care prescribed by this Act may not be disclaimed by agreement but the parties may by agreement determine the standards by which the performance of such obligations is to be measured if such standards are not manifestly unreasonable.

(4) The presence in certain provisions of this Act of the words "unless otherwise agreed" or words of similar import does not imply that the effect of other provisions may not be varied by agreement under subsection (3).

(5) In this Act unless the context otherwise requires

30 (a) words in the singular number include the plural,31 and in the plural include the singular;
