Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections 4 5 10-20.39 and 34-18.30 as follows:

- Sec. 10-20.39. Highly qualified teachers; No Child Left 7 Behind Act funds. If a school district has an overall shortage 8 of highly qualified teachers, as defined by the federal No 9 Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110), or a 10 shortage of highly qualified teachers in the subject area of 11 mathematics, science, reading, or special education, then the 12 school board must spend at least 40% of the money it receives 13 from Title 2 grants under the Act on recruitment and retention 14 15 initiatives to assist in recruiting and retaining highly qualified teachers (in a specific subject area if applicable) 16 as specified in paragraphs (1)(B), (2)(A), (2)(B), (4)(A), 17 (4) (B), and (4) (C) of subsection (a) of Section 2123 of the Act 18 19 until there is no longer a shortage of highly qualified teachers (in a specific subject area if applicable). As the 20 21 number of highly qualified teachers in the district increases, however, the school board may spend any surplus of the minimum 22 40% of funds dedicated to addressing the highly qualified 23 teacher shortage in any manner the school board deems 24 25

of mathematics, science, reading, or special education, then 1 2 the school board must spend at least 40% of the money it 3 receives from Title 2 grants under the Act on recruitment and retention initiatives to assist in recruiting and retaining 4 5 highly qualified teachers (in a specific subject area is applicable) as specified in paragraphs (1)(B), (2)(A), (2)(B), 6 7 (4)(A), (4)(B), and (4)(C) of subsection (a) of Section 2123 of the Act until there is no longer a shortage of highly qualified 8 9 teachers (in a specific subject area if applicable). As the number of highly qualified teachers in the district increases, 10 11 however, the school board may spend any surplus of the minimum 40% of funds dedicated to addressing the highly qualified 12 teacher shortage in any manner the school board deems 13 14 appropriate.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
