AN ACT in relation to fireworks.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Pyrotechnic Operator Licensing Act is 5 amended by changing Section 35 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 227/35)

Sec. 35. Licensure requirements and fees.

8 (a) Each application for a license to practice under this 9 Act <u>must shall</u> be in writing and signed by the applicant on 10 forms provided by the Office. The Office <u>must shall</u> have the 11 testing procedures for licensing as a lead pyrotechnic operator 12 developed by October 1, 2004.

(b) After April 1, 2005, all pyrotechnic displays, both indoor and outdoor, must comply with the requirements set forth in this Act.

(c) After April 1, 2005, no individual may act as a lead operator in a pyrotechnic display without first applying for and obtaining a lead pyrotechnic operator's license from the Office. The Office shall establish separate licenses for lead pyrotechnic operators for indoor and outdoor pyrotechnic displays. Applicants for a license must:

(1) Pay the fees set by the Office.

(2) Have the requisite training or continuing
 education as established in the Office's rules.

(3) Pass the examination presented by the Office.

26 (d) A person is qualified to receive a license under this
27 Act if the person meets all of the following minimum

(1) Is at least 21 years of age.
