

## 93RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2003 and 2004

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21-1a

from Ch. 122, par. 21-1a

Amends the Teacher Certification Article of the School Code. Provides that a teacher from another state or territory of the United States who has successfully achieved National Board certification must not be required to take an examination in order to receive a Master Certificate.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 21-1a as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/21-1a) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-1a)
- Sec. 21-1a. Tests required for certification and teacher preparation.
- 1988, in addition to all other After July 1, 9 requirements, early childhood, elementary, special, high 10 school, school service personnel, or, except as provided in 11 Section 34-6, administrative certificates shall be issued to 12 persons who have satisfactorily passed a test of basic skills 13 14 and subject matter knowledge. The tests of basic skills and 15 subject matter knowledge shall be the tests which from time to time are designated by the State Board of Education in 16 17 consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board and may 18 be tests prepared by an educational testing organization or 19 tests designed by the State Board of Education in consultation 20 with the State Teacher Certification Board. The areas to be covered by the test of basic skills shall include the basic 21 22 skills of reading, writing, grammar and mathematics. The test 23 of subject matter knowledge shall assess content knowledge in the specific subject field. The tests shall be designed to be 24 25 racially neutral to assure that no person in taking the tests 26 is thereby discriminated against on the basis of race, color, national origin or other factors unrelated to the person's 27 28 ability to perform as a certificated employee. The score required to pass the tests of basic skills and subject matter 29 30 knowledge shall be fixed by the State Board of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board. The 31 32 tests shall be held not fewer than 3 times a year at such time

and place as may be designated by the State Board of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board.

- (b) Except as provided in Section 34-6, the provisions of subsection (a) of this Section shall apply equally in any school district subject to Article 34, provided that the State Board of Education shall determine which certificates issued under Sections 34-8.1 and 34-83 prior to July 1, 1988 are comparable to any early childhood certificate, elementary school certificate, special certificate, high school certificate, school service personnel certificate or administrative certificate issued under this Article as of July 1, 1988.
- (c) A person who holds an early childhood, elementary, special, high school or school service personnel certificate issued under this Article on or at any time before July 1, 1988, including a person who has been issued any such certificate pursuant to Section 21-11.1 or in exchange for a comparable certificate theretofore issued under Section 34-8.1 or Section 34-83, shall not be required to take or pass the tests in order to thereafter have such certificate renewed.
- (d) The State Board of Education in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board shall conduct a pilot administration of the tests by administering the test to students completing teacher education programs in the 1986-87 school year for the purpose of determining the effect and impact of testing candidates for certification.
- Beginning with the 2002-2003 academic year, a student may not enroll in a teacher preparation program at a recognized teacher training institution until he or she has passed the basic skills test.
  - Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, a preservice education teacher may not student teach until he or she has passed the subject matter test in the discipline in which he or she will student teach.
- 35 (e) The rules and regulations developed to implement the 36 required test of basic skills and subject matter knowledge

- 1 shall include the requirements of subsections (a), (b), and (c) 2 shall include specific regulations to govern test 3 selection; test validation and determination of a passing 4 administration of the tests; frequency 5 administration; applicant fees; frequency of applicants' 6 taking the tests; the years for which a score is valid; and, waiving certain additional tests for additional certificates 7 8 to individuals who have satisfactorily passed the test of basic 9 skills and subject matter knowledge as required in subsection 10 (a). The State Board of Education shall provide, by rule, 11 specific policies that assure uniformity in the difficulty 12 level of each form of the basic skills test and each subject 13 matter knowledge test from test-to-test and year-to-year. The State Board of Education shall also set a passing score for the 14 15 tests.
- 16 (f) The State Teacher Certification Board may issue a
  17 nonrenewable temporary certificate between July 1, 1988 and
  18 August 31, 1988 to individuals who have taken the tests of
  19 basic skills and subject matter knowledge prescribed by this
  20 Section but have not received such test scores by August 31,
  21 1988. Such temporary certificates shall expire on December 31,
  22 1988.
- 23 (g) Beginning February 15, 2000, the State Board of consultation with the State 24 Education, in Teacher 25 Certification Board, shall implement and administer a new 26 system of certification for teachers in the State of Illinois. 27 The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher Certification Board, shall design and implement a 28 system of examinations and various other criteria which shall 29 30 be required prior to the issuance of Initial Teaching 31 Certificates and Standard Teaching Certificates. examinations and indicators shall be based on national and 32 State professional teaching standards, as determined by the 33 State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 34 35 Teacher Certification Board.
