Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, as follows:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

12 Whenever it becomes necessary for the State or any governmental unit to furnish in a disaster area emergency 13 services directly related to or required by a disaster and 14 existing funds are insufficient to provide such services, the 15 Governor may, when he considers such action in the best 16 17 interest of the State, release funds from the General Revenue disaster relief appropriation in order to provide such 18 19 services or to reimburse local governmental bodies furnishing such services. Such appropriation may be used for payment of 20 the Illinois National Guard when called to active duty in 21 case of disaster, and for the emergency purchase or renting 22 of equipment and commodities. Such appropriation shall be 23 used for emergency services and relief to the disaster area 24 25 as a whole and shall not be used to provide private relief to 26 persons sustaining property damages or personal injury as a result of a disaster. 27

Section 3. The amount of \$400,000, or so much thereof as 13 14 may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore 15 16 made in Public Act 93-68, Article 1, Section 8, is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois 17 Emergency Management Agency for providing services and for 18 costs associated with homeland security. 19

Section 4. The sum of \$63,300, or so much thereof as may 20 21 be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation Protection the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 2.2 Fund to for 23 licensing facilities where radioactive uranium and thorium mill tailings are generated or located, and related costs for 2.4 regulating the decontamination and decommissioning of such 25 facilities and for identification, decontamination and 26 environmental monitoring of unlicensed 27 properties 28 contaminated with such radioactive mill tailings.

29 Section 5. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 30 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Emergency 1 Management Agency from the September 11th Fund for grants, 2 contracts and administrative expenses pursuant to 625 ILCS 3 5/3-653, including prior year costs.

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4 Section 6. The following named amounts, or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the Illinois 6 Emergency Management Agency for the objects and purposes 7 hereinafter named:

Section 8. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for reimbursing other governmental agencies for their assistance in responding to radiological emergencies.

12 Section 9. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as 13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation 14 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 15 for recovery and remediation of radioactive materials and 16 contaminated facilities or properties when such expenses 17 cannot be paid by a responsible person or an available 18 surety.

Section 10. The amount of \$380,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Indoor Radon Mitigation Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for expenses relating to the federally funded State Indoor Radon Abatement Program.

Section 14. The sum of \$1,865,450, or so much thereof as 26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation 27 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 28 for licensing facilities where radioactive uranium and 29 thorium mill tailings are generated or located, and related 30 costs for regulating the decontamination and decommissioning 31 of such facilities and for identification, decontamination 32 33 and environmental monitoring of unlicensed properties

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1 contaminated with such radioactive mill tailings.

Section 15. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as 2 necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation 3 mav be Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 4 to conduct studies, investigations, training, research and 5 demonstrations relating to the control or measurement of 6 radiation, the effects on health of exposure to radiation, 7 and related problems under funding agreements with the 8 Federal Government, interstate agencies or other sources. 9

Section 16. The sum of \$713,700, or so much thereof as 10 11 be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation may Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 12 for the purpose of funding costs related to environmental 13 cleanup of the Ottawa Radiation Areas Superfund Project under 14 cooperative agreements with the Federal Government. 15

Section 17. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 16 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Nuclear Safety Emergency Preparedness the Illinois Fund to Emergency 18 Management Agency for related training and travel expenses 19 and to reimburse the Illinois State Police and the Illinois 20 Commerce Commission for costs incurred for activities related 21 22 to inspecting and escorting shipments of spent nuclear fuel, and transuranic waste 23 high-level radioactive waste, in 24 Illinois as provided under the rules of the Agency.

25 Section 18. The sum of \$200,000, or so much thereof as 26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sheffield Agreed 27 Order Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for 28 the care, maintenance, monitoring, testing, remediation and 29 insurance of the low-level radioactive waste disposal site 30 near Sheffield, Illinois. -13- OMB093 00246 LLC 40040 b

Section 19. The sum of \$828,550, or so much thereof as 1 2 necessary, is appropriated from the Low-Level may be Radioactive Waste Facility Development and Operation Fund to 3 Illinois Emergency Management Agency for use 4 the in accordance with Section 14(a) of the Illinois Low-Level 5 Radioactive Waste Management Act for costs related to 6 establishing a low-level radioactive waste disposal facility. 7

Section 20. Certain Federal receipts shall be placed in 8 9 the General Revenue Fund, pursuant to law and regulation, as reimbursement for the Federal share of expenditures made from 10 General Revenue appropriations in Sections 1, 6 and 12 of 11 this Article. Other Federal receipts shall be paid into the 12 proper trust fund and shall be available for expenditure only 13 pursuant to the trust fund appropriations in Sections 1, 2, 14 6, 10 and 12 of this Article or suitable appropriation made 15 by the General Assembly. 16

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on July 1,2004.
